Checklist of materials to bring

The goal of these FREE workshops is for the participant to leave with the FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application completed. Please bring as many of the following items that apply to you.

- ♦ **Student's** Social Security card and number if filling out FAFSA
- ♦ **Student's** Permanent Resident Card (if applicable)
- ♦ **Student:** If filling out the California Dream Act Application, bring DACA SSN if you have one.
- ♦ **Parent's** Social Security Card and number (if applicable)
- ♦ List of colleges you are interested in attending

Dependent students:

- ♦ Your parents' Federal Income Tax Return for 2015, or if they have not yet filed their tax return for 2015 and their income did not significantly change, you can use their tax return from 2014.
- ♦ Your parents' marital status and date of marriage, separation, divorced or widowed (if applicable)
- ♦ Your parents' date of birth (if applicable)

Students and parents:

- ♦ If you had a job in 2015, bring your W-2 forms or, if you do not have your W-2 forms, bring other records of the income you earned that year, such as check stubs.
- ♦ A copy of your most recent bank statement.
- ♦ Any records of untaxed income such as welfare benefits, social security benefits, or child support payments

Independent student:

- ♦ Your Federal Income Tax Return for 2015 (and your spouse's Tax Return if you are married). If you have not yet filed your tax return for 2015 and your income did not significantly change, you can use your tax return from 2014.

In partnership with 10,000 Degrees, the district will be holding a Financial Aid Campaign week in each of our high schools. The campaign will focus on increasing financial aid awareness and providing support to students and families with completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the CA Dream Act.
