We continue to review our classroom formative assessments, I-Ready data, CAASPP data, and beginning of the year assessments to determine student concerns, action plans and instruction. We had 16 SST ( Student Success Team) meetings in September and October to check in on students who were SST'd last year as well as to meet on students for SST's this school year. We have 10 more scheduled for November. We currently have 165 student concerns, which is 30% of our school population. Many of the students who are concerns are new to Bonsall West this school year. The concerns range from academic to behavioral concerns. We have several students who are participating in the 'lunch bunch' groups with our psych intern, Kenia Lopez. We have begun after school intervention for twenty -two students utilizing our two ELD paraprofessionals and our special education paraprofessional. The focus will be on using district technology and assisting with homework/specific learning needs. We have begun a reading intervention for students in grades 2-5 for a half hour each day. We are using the Read Naturally program. We currently have thirty- one students with active licenses.

**Professional Development:**

September 28<sup>th</sup>: Individual Professional Development/Technology PD with Craig Leach. Some of the topics teachers selected to study were: Love/Logic video, Literature circle video, model based inquiry in the classroom, Growth mindset, Next Generation Science standards and a focus on science inquiry in the classroom, integrating ELD instruction using text reconstruction strategies, how to infuse a growth mindset into daily routines, conscious classroom management, academic vocabulary, differentiation, number talks implementation, and Scholastic Story works.

October 5<sup>th</sup>: Gung ho awards, Grade level planning: long range planning/curriculum

October 12<sup>th</sup>: Disaster team meeting, Individual planning/conference prep.

Jogathon: Our Jog a thon this year raised \$49,503.18. There were 69.1% of our students who registered on Get Movincrew.com and 354 students who contributed to raising the total. We had 39 students raise \$300 or more. The average raised per student was \$139.84. We are so appreciative of the efforts of our students, families and our PTA. The money raised will help fund field trips, Arts Attack, teacher classroom budgets, the supply closet, technology and much more.

On Friday, October 27th, Bonsall West celebrated 15 different countries at our annual PTA sponsored Multicultural night. This highly anticipated evening has all the elements of a great time: amazing culture, dancing, and delicious and authentic food samples. Our children began the evening with a 'walk of nations'.
