i-Ready

As shown in the i-Ready data below, Vivian Banks Students are making steady progress in Mathematics and Language Arts instruction. We are tracking student usage and are working to reach the Curriculum Associates goal of 45 minutes a week in each subject area. On average, VBCS students are currently receiving 67 minutes a week in ELA and 45 minutes a week in Math. Many students receive additional i-ready instruction at ASES and Before School Computer Lab.

Migrant Education Parent Classes

VBCS is currently hosting a series of 8 workshops for BUSD Migrant Education families. These workshops take place on Tuesday evening from 6:00-8:00pm. Parents are receiving instruction specific to navigating the educational system and how to support their students academically at school and at home. Families are also provided community resource opportunities. During this time, students

are utilizing the computer lab to work on 21st century skills i.e. coding, computer programming.

Indian Education Committee

The committee reviewed and approved the updated Committee Bylaws as well as the Indian Education Policies and Procedures. A review of JOM funding and the current Annual Report was shared and approved. The committee also reviewed the Title VI Grant, current budget, as well as the 506 form collection process. Finally, we discussed Impact Aid, how the district benefits from this and the process in place to distribute and receive needed Impact Aid verification.
