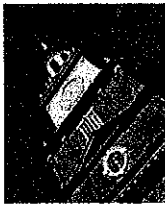

GUIDES AND ESCORTS

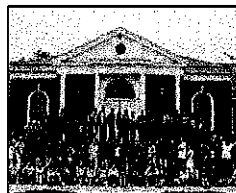

**HOUSING**

Three dormitory-style buildings accommodate up to 120 students and adults. Single rooms are reserved for adults; student rooms house between two and six people.
