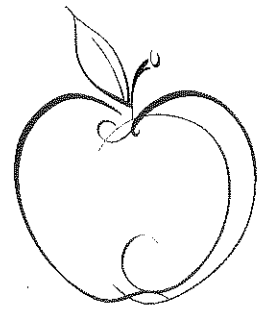

2017-2018 Chapter Status



I. Preamble

In an effort to help schools prepare students for successful careers and professions, Stanislaus Partners in Education (SPIE) believes that:

- A. Businesses, community leaders, elected officials and parents need to join with our schools to encourage rigorous and relevant curricula necessary to prepare our youth for successful and productive lives and to sustain the ideals of our nation through a strong economy.
- B. The needs of schools can best be addressed through local advocacy; therefore, SPIE's Board of Directors offers chapter status to high school districts and their respective feeder school districts.
- C. Chapter status will expedite the adoption of programs necessary to prepare our youth to meet the challenges of the workplace in the 21st Century.

II. Chapter Organization and Obligations

It is recommended that a chapter form an advisory committee that includes business/industry representatives, community leaders, elected officials, parents, and at least one student.

The role of the advisory committee is to help schools in the District perpetuate programs that prepare students for careers and professions.

III. SPIE Services

SPIE will:

- A. Sponsor teacher Career Education Grants in grades K-12.
- B. Sponsor Incentive Grants in grades K-6.
- C. Sponsor summer internships for teachers and instructors in grades Middle School -14.
- D. Provide a list of guest speakers from business and industry.
- E. Help establish partnerships.
- F. Provide personnel for the District's Advisory Committee.
- G. Provide high schools seniors with information and opportunities to secure employment in Careers In Manufacturing.
- H. Hold an annual luncheon to recognize business/education partnerships throughout Stanislaus County.

IV Fee Structure

- A. Chapters that establish their own business/education partnerships will be assessed .35 per unit of Average Daily Attendance (ADA). The assessment will be based on the previous fiscal year's final attendance report. These districts are called Associate Chapters.
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- B. Chapters that use Stanislaus Partners in Education personnel to facilitate business/education partnerships will be assessed .75 per unit of Average Daily Attendance (ADA). The fee will be based on the previous fiscal year's final attendance report. These districts are called Full-Partnership Chapters.

V. Chapter Status

Chapter status will be granted for one fiscal year, July 1 to June 30, and must be renewed annually to remain in effect.
