Increased or Improved Services

Expenditures detailed above will be used to support unduplicated students in Martinez in their completion of A-G course requirements.

Increased Services:

- College Connect Program (to be implemented 2018-19 school year), supporting at-risk youth to earn college credits
- Get Focused, Stay Focused, a comprehensive curriculum designed to ensure high school and college completion, as well as entry into the workforce

Improved Services

- Funding for TSA to support Work Based Learning experiences and internships
- Professional Development for staff in college counseling and supporting at risk youth (including training in Get Focused, Stay Focused)
- Supporting teachers in the completion of their CTE Credentials
