

# HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

- 1990's : Theme-based Schools Opened to:
  - Provide choice
  - Increase enrollment (9,903)
- 2003-2011: Received Federal Magnet Grants
  - Bring in needed funding
  - Increase enrollment at under-enrolled schools
  - Decrease racial isolation while increasing academic achievement

# CURRENT SITUATION

- No longer receive federal, state or local funds to support magnet programs
- Previously under enrolled schools that were designated as “magnet” with neighborhood boundaries have increased enrollment
- Four schools without neighborhood boundaries continue to operate as “true” magnets requiring transfers from across the District

# PROPOSAL

- Rename “magnet” schools with neighborhood boundaries to “theme-based” schools
- Continue to support theme-based schools including approval of transfer requests
- Designate the four schools without neighborhood boundaries requiring transfers from across the District for enrollment as magnets
