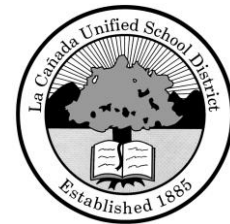

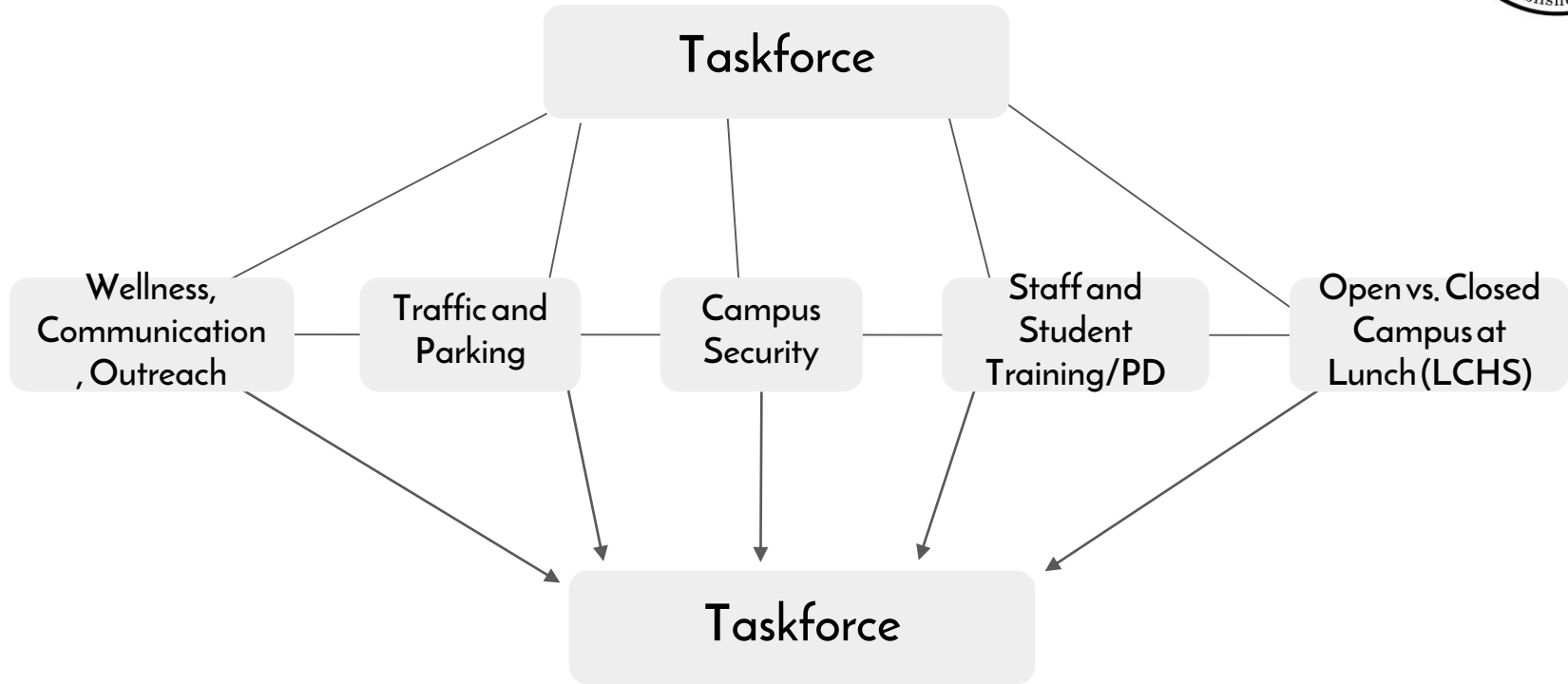

Overall Progress to Date and Next Steps

- ☐ Perimeter inspections and designs in progress for elementary sites
- ☐ Access control system for LCHS (new door locks and control)
- ☐ Emergency procedures reviewed for each site
- ☐ Crisis communication plans updated for each site
- ☐ Staff meetings planned for disaster training
- ☐ Evacuation routes being reviewed and updating
- ☐ Increased training on first aid
- ☐ 9-12 Student safety training component added this year
- ☐ Office reconfigurations at PCR and LCHS to move towards more uniform entry
- ☐ Parsing out threat assessment report to subcommittees coming soon
