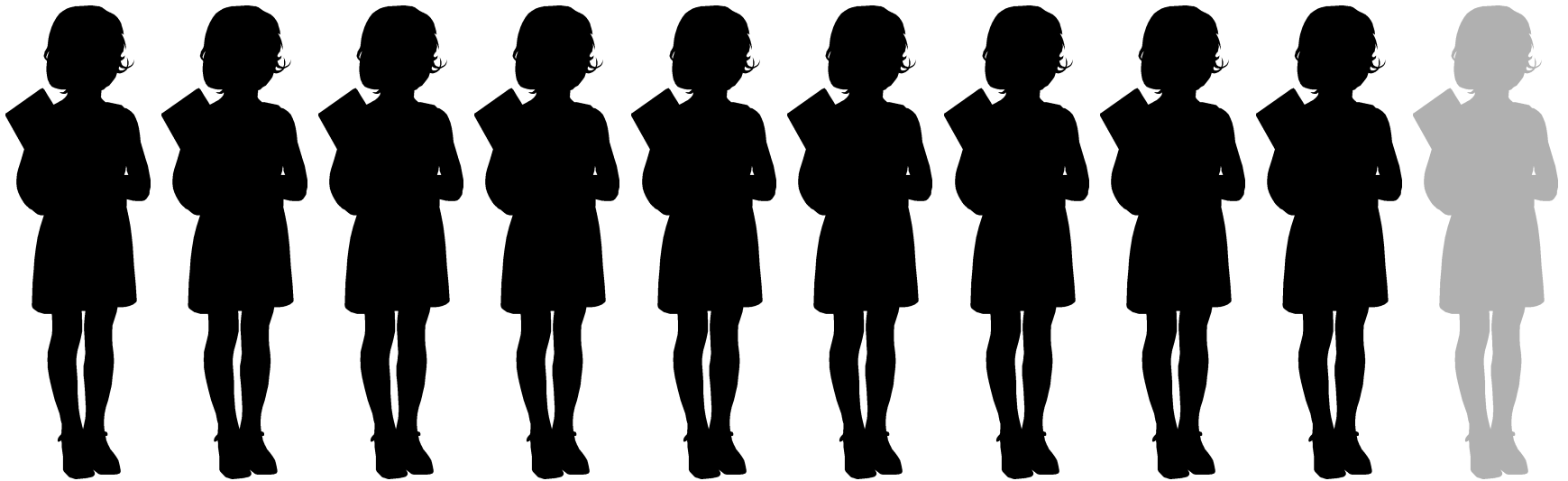

Summary of 2016 Preliminary CAASPP Results

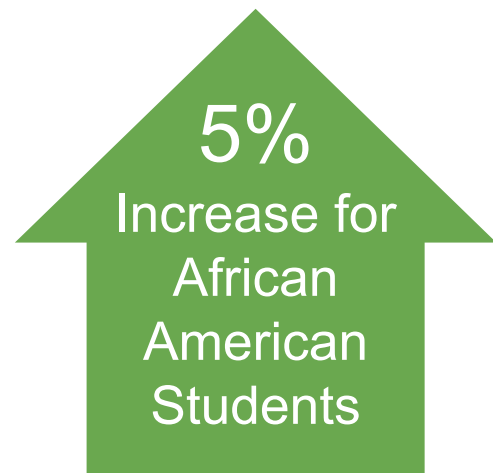
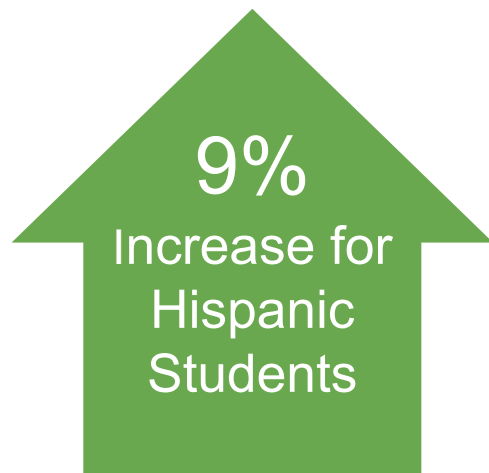
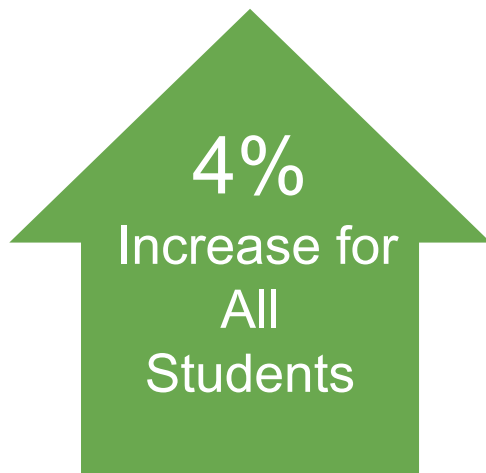
- More growth in math across NUSD schools and grade levels

- Two schools with the biggest improvements are Leroy Greene Academy and Natomas High School

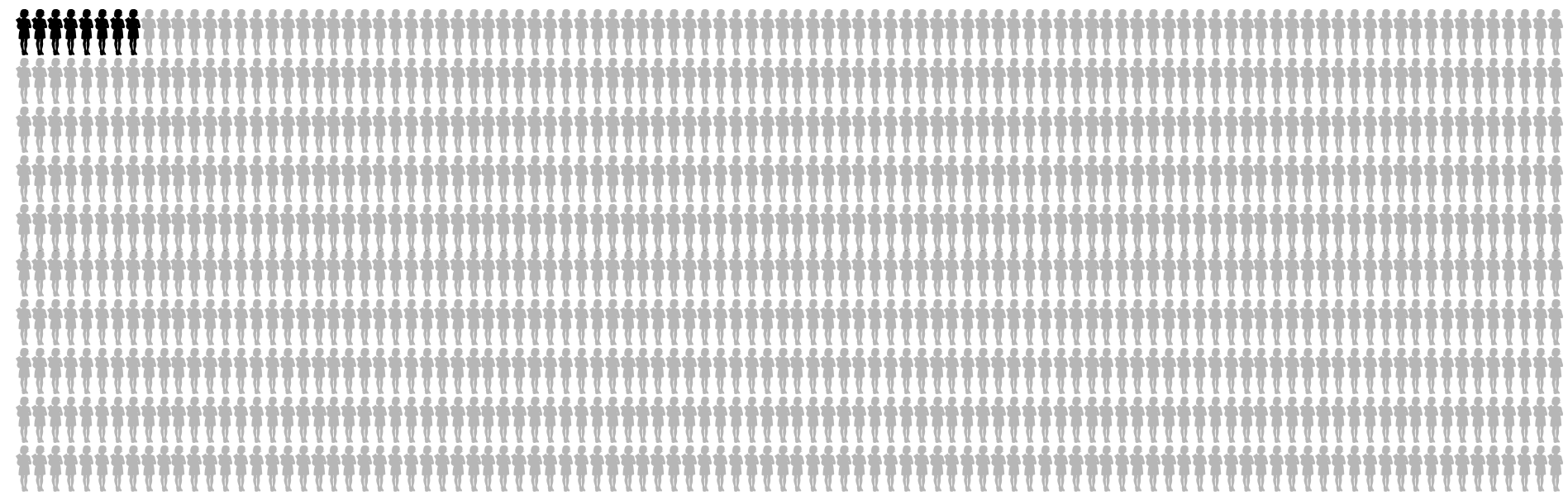

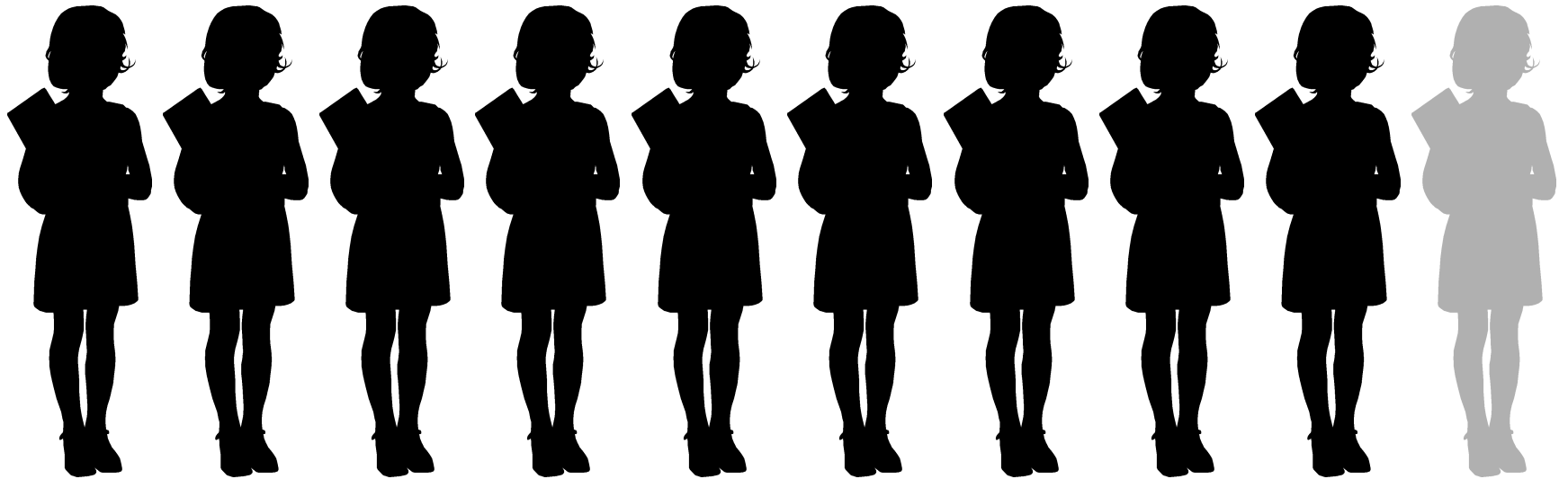

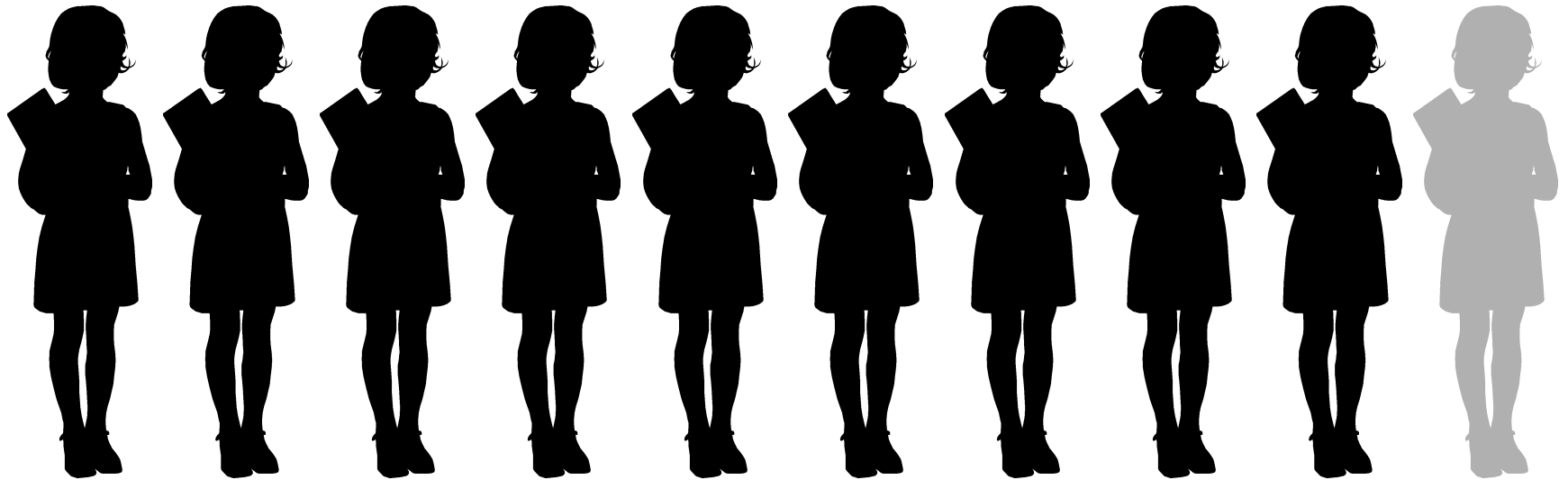

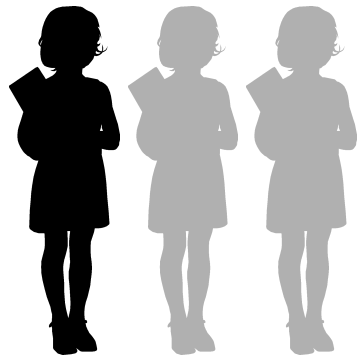

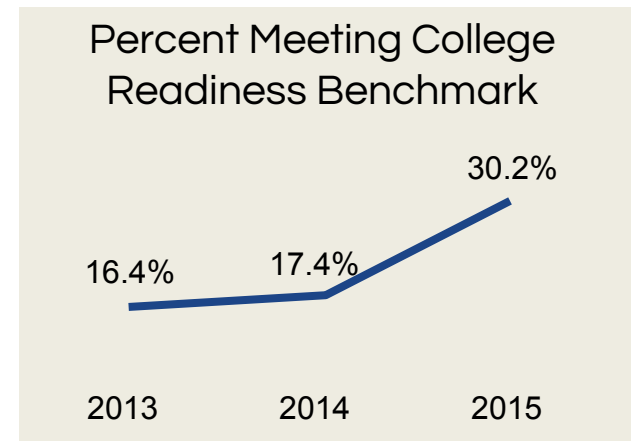
86% of our Juniors took the ACT in
