IX. SPECIAL REPORT

IX.1. UPDATE: (ESD/HSD): Labor Unions: CSEA, SRTA, SRFT

Minutes:

SRTA - Molly O'Donoghue reported after the last board meeting she spoke with SRTA leadership about the move to by-trustee boundaries for elections, and the interactive maps that will be available. Membership was notified and the feedback was that there is huge concern that this is happening over the summer when teachers will be gone and not able to give as much feedback, and concern about not knowing how to navigate the maps before school ends. Membership is interested in knowing how to work with paper versions of the maps.

President Knell noted that unfortunately the timing of this process is dictated by statute and the district has no control over the timeline.

CSEA and SRFT had nothing to report at this time.

IX.2. PRESENTATION: (HSD) Student Voice Program Update

Minutes:

Director of Secondary Education Kevin Kerr, together with administrators from Terra Linda and San Rafael High Schools, and students from Terra Linda, San Rafael, and Madrone high schools, provided an overview of the work of the Student Voice Initiative over the past 3 years.

- The Initiative began 4 years ago from conversations between community member George Pegelow, Trustee Jackson and Mr. Kerr, about how to engage students for their input.

- In the first year, they met with student groups at each of the 3 high schools for informal conversation.

- In Year 2, consultant Adam Fletcher conducted a retreat with students at the beginning of the year to make the discussions more actionable. Students discussed what concerned them the most about school and left the retreat with an action plan, focusing on these activities the rest of the school year.

- TLHS Assistant Principal Lauren Inman, and students Victoria Markanis and Molly Madden reviewed: Student Voice at TL is a solution-oriented group made up of a diverse group of students who are representative of the student body; a survey conducted last year was used to focus on issues important to students - support for 2 student walkouts, gender-neutral bathrooms, and teacher/student relationships. Solutions this year: a binary option form that can now be used when students enroll that does not solely give a male/female option; working with administration regarding dividers in the boys restrooms for privacy; meetings with teachers to discuss concerns about coordinating AP testing so assignments are not due

on the same day - a Google doc was developed for coordination; encouraged having a study week before finals to help students prepare - teachers and students volunteered to tutor. Student Voice was part of the WASC review this year; these students are leaders on campus. In response to Trustee Llorens Gulati's question about members and recruitment, it was noted that some were asked to be part of Student Voice by administration or teachers, some by friend recommendation, and through outreach via word-of-mouth among students. Student Voice is widely promoted at the start of the school year.

- SRHS students Sal Arroyo and Magda Diaz reviewed Student Voice actionable results at SR: bulletins and announcements are now done in Spanish for all site events; Broadcast news in Spanish; overall increase in the awareness of mental health resources at the school; soap dispensers have been put back into restrooms; a decrease in the amount of homework as a result of meetings with teachers to discuss student concerns; more transparency, connections and stronger relationships between teachers and students; ELD and newcomer students are learning how to speak out for themselves; participation in ASB and Broadcast is more diverse than ever, with Latino students feeling more represented.

- MHS student Kimberly Sosa reported on Student Voice outcomes at Madrone: focused on getting greater access to electives - trying to get another staff member at the school; recommending MHS students be able to take elective classes at SR to get credits to graduate on time- let them explore other classes; dress code changes so students are able to wear previously prohibited clothing that is either blue or red; off-campus lunch privileges for great attendance and good grades; opportunity for Student Voice during Advisory; teachers taking feedback and making adjustments to lessons and projects; next year a survey about likes and don't likes will be developed.

Mr. Kerr noted the importance of student voice to bring together diverse groups of students who speak for themselves as part of a decision-making process. Mr. Pegelow commented it has been a privilege to work with these young people; this will make the district more effective as a sense of community is growing. He noted that SRCS is far ahead of where the other high school districts in the county are with regard to student voice.

Trustee Kertz commented on the difference between constructive student voice that works to identify issues and find a solution, as opposed to just complaining; commending the students for their work.

Trustee Jackson praised all for their work, and site administrators for making the change. She noted this is an example of powerful change that can happen without costing any money. She expressed thanks to Mr. Pegelow for this guidance with this initiative.

Trustee Llorens Gulati thanked the students for their presentations, and noted that she attended a previously held Student Voice conversation with SRCS students and San Rafael City Councilmember Kate Collin; student voice is important to the community.

President Knell noted outcome is process. He is excited to see this initiative continue.

XI.4. INITIAL CONSIDERATION: (ESD/HSD) First Reading of Revisions to Board Policy and Adoption of New Administrative Regulation 5131.2 Bullying

Minutes:

Executive Director Mike Gardner introduced the revisions to the policy and introduction of a new administrative regulation regarding bullying, which are the result of legislation passed in November. The revisions address an online training module that the district has to make available to all employees, and training for staff.

Trustee Tuatagaloa commented training is critical. In response to President Knell's question about what the district's duty is to publicize the training, Mr. Garder noted he needs to get more specifics about the training mandates.

Trustee Jackson commented the policy looks gutted, asking staff to make sure the new regulation covers the deleted material. She noted it should be in our Safety Plan and the LCAP which is the driver in the district. She noted she would like to see it in the Safety Plan as it relates to mental health issues. She noted that 'visual bullying' is not mentioned in the new regulation.

The following individual addressed the Board on this item:

- Molly O'Donoghue: asked for clarification on the staff development requirement for teachers, and commented on the student instruction that teachers will have to give.

- Katina Pantazes: does this include classified staff?

Mr. Garder noted he will get additional clarification regarding training and professional development requirements and if the mandate affects classified staff as well, before the second reading of the policy and regulation.
