Middle School Task Force (MSTF) Goals


- 1. All students are able to enroll in an elective.
- 2. All students are able to enroll in two electives.
- 3. The MSTF will keep equity in mind as we work together.

2016-2017 Overview

Through their work throughout the 2016-2017 year, the MSTF:

- 1. Identified working goals
- 2. Developed norms
- 3. Brainstormed ideas for increasing elective offerings
- 4. Discussed pros and cons of changes to schedule
- 5. Implemented a new A/B schedule at DMS in 2017-2018

Data Review



A/B Schedule Check In

- Creative solution that spurred more thinking
- Some successful courses created (Chess, Intro to Violin, Garden)
- A/B schedule allowed for Sixth Grade "Skills Wheel"
- General consensus is more engagement in school
- A/B gives students 50% of support class not enough
- Courses not true "electives" students need choice
- Toll on teachers who teach A/B
- Created "pinch points" in master schedule

Middle School Task Force: 2018-2019

- Update on previous work: data review
- 2. Review of MSTF goals: progress
 - a. All students are able to enroll in two electives.
- 3. Challenges and obstacles
- Create a clear and comprehensive analysis of what could work for DMS in terms of providing two electives for each student
- 5. Design a roadmap to achieve both short-term and long-term goals
- Provide a financial analysis for supporting and sustaining two electives for students

Considerations: We've learned that the current schedule doesn't have additional flexibility and there could be negative impacts to reduction in instructional minutes.

2019-20 Where are we now?

There are roughly 150/1200 students that are not scheduled into an elective

- No students have two electives
- SOme students have additional enrichment
- ELD 1 and 2 (newest newcomer students)
- 6th Grade ELD 5 (Students not yet reclassified)
- Represents 12.5% of students w/no traditional elective (87.5% w/elective)

How?: A/B solution was replaced with Eng 8 SDAIE & Core 7

Marin County Context

White Hill MS

- Option for two electives (zero period)
- Sections funded by YES Foundation

Mill Valley MS

- Option for two electives (rolling block), but 2nd is A/B with PE
- Sections funded by Kiddo

Sinaloa/San Jose (Novato)

Similar offerings to DMS

Important to note:

Families express the desire to be able to take Spanish and another elective

DXL (Davidson Extended Learning)

- A "new," stronger partnership between BACR, Heads Up, and DMS
- Homework time + enrichment
- Heads Up after school classes offered:
 - o Drama
 - Maker Tech
 - Steel Pan
 - Chess
 - Art
- Effort was made to prioritize students with no elective during school day and those that participate fully in DXL

Other After School Enrichment Offerings...

- Soccer (America Scores/DXL)
- Robotics (DMS computer teacher/DXL)
- Rocketry (DMS Science Teacher)
- DMS Athletics (Heads Up, PTO, site funded)
- Marching Band (Heads Up)
- Colorguard (Heads Up)
- DMS Live (YLI)
