1	Advancing Career Counseling in Orange County	Fund a Career Counseling Coordinator to be hired by each LEA. Intent of position is to identify a point person at every district and embed "career education" systemically and organize school counseling efforts to align with Community Colleges. Enhancing Career Education efforts will include early college credit attainment, industry certifications, work-based learning, etc.	\$4,630,549	\$300,000 (Districts Only-- ROP Not Applicable)
2	Building CTE Dual Enrollment in Orange County	Build and grow CTE dual enrollment, concurrent enrollment and articulation course offerings/pathway sequences between high schools and community colleges in OC (Inside or Outside of AB288). One strategy might be to implement co-teaching between high schools and community college educators. Monetizing through this initiative could offer section reimbursement to school sites for first two years of CTE dual/concurrent enrollment offerings.	\$2,109,168	\$100,000
3	Creating Industry Certification Opportunities for OC students	Fund industry certifications at a regional level in order to purchase student licenses at the lowest price point. Vertically align (between K12 & CC) the industry certification list (organized by 15 sectors) for OC. Embed industry certifications in courses/ career pathway sequences/programs of study, etc.	\$529,017	\$19,480
4	Designing Career based Student Leadership in Orange County	Build Student Leadership in Orange County beyond just CTSO's (Career Technical Student Organizations). Sample efforts could include: a) Certifications, b) Competitions, c) Robotics, d) Maker Faire, e) Cyber Patriot, f) ocMaker Challenge, g) STEM Proj. Incubator, h) Local Student Leadership Conference, i) Coordinated Alternatives to CTSO's.	\$1,999,828	\$100,000
5	Enhancing Career Education Pedagogies	Provide learning opportunities for teachers in career pathway programs at the high schools level and teachers in career awareness programs at the K-8 level to grow in their proficiency in and use of key strategies to equip students with defensible competencies: 1) Human Centered Design Thinking, 2) Universal Design for Learning, and 3) Project Based Learning. Students could complete project-based modules to develop skills in teamwork, communication, problem solving, creativity, presentations, and individual career interests that will lead to additional training in middle and elementary school labs.	\$1,453,128	\$40,000 (K6-8 Districts included in this Initiative)
6	Forming Orange County Integrated Pathway Teams	Build incentives for schools and districts to develop and refine career pathway sequences with multi-disciplinary pathway teams. Create designated times and trainings to incorporate integrated courses/curriculum (core academic and CTE courses with common integrated projects). Sample areas and projects could include: (Biotechnology Authentication, E-Sports Authentication, etc.)	\$400,000	\$13,744
7	Heightening Work-Based Learning in Orange County	Build upon work-based learning in OC from the established practices set by 4 ROP's. Work with industry/business partners to create and connect secondary students to specific technical and employability skills identified by industry/company. Establish and work from a consistent work-based learning continuum for OC.	\$219,773	\$4,000
