

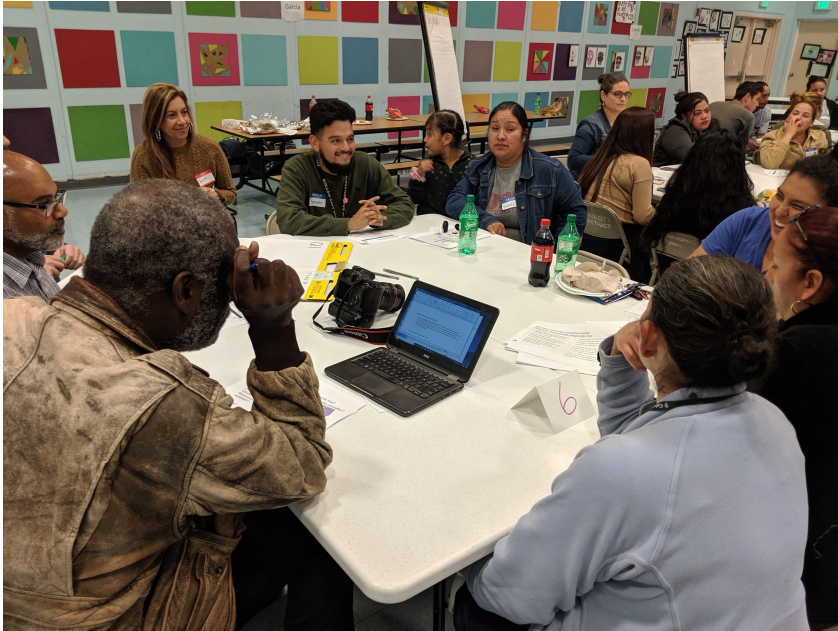

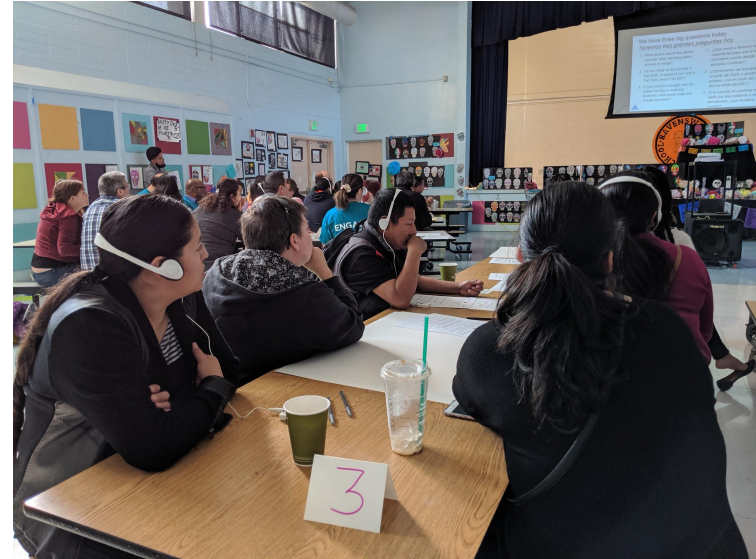

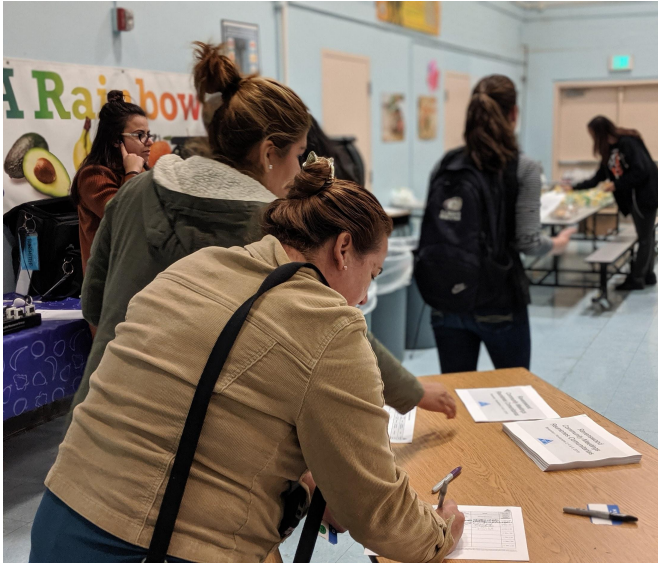
How have we engaged
our community so far?

We worked hard to make it easier for community members to join the conversation

- Multiple ways to engage, for any schedule
 - Morning, evening & weekend community meetings
 - Office hours (if community meetings didn't work)
 - Online survey
 - Bilingual website with information
- Childcare and food at each meeting
- Everything bilingual
 - Interpreters & translation equipment at each meeting and at every table
 - All presentations and surveys bilingual



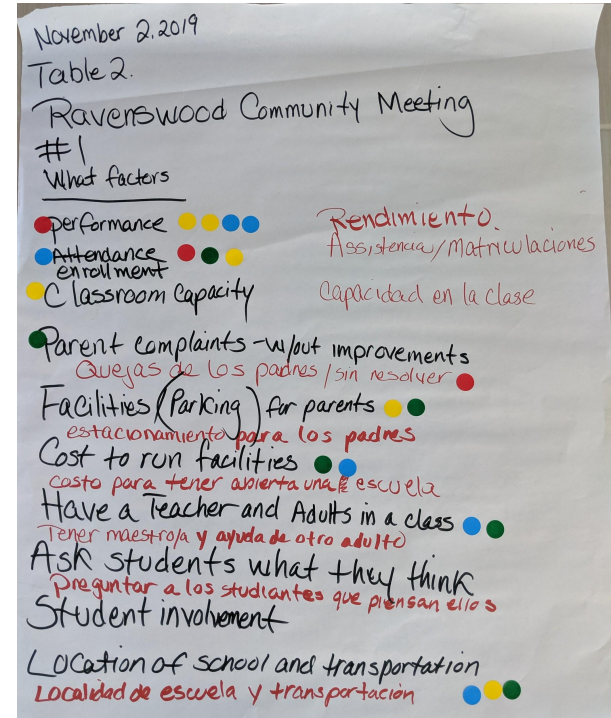
We did extensive outreach in Spanish and English



- RCSD reached out multiple times
 - Emails, text, auto-dialer messages
 - Video & social media
 - Paper flyers sent home in every backpack
 - Principals & afterschool coordinators reminded parents in-person
- Media helped spread the word
- Our partners also helped
 - Innovate staff canvassed at school sites, presented at parent meetings
 - Innovate sent emails or texts to >900 people, and follow-up texts to everyone who attended a meeting
 - Boys and Girls Club and 49ers Academy shared staff to facilitate small groups at community meetings

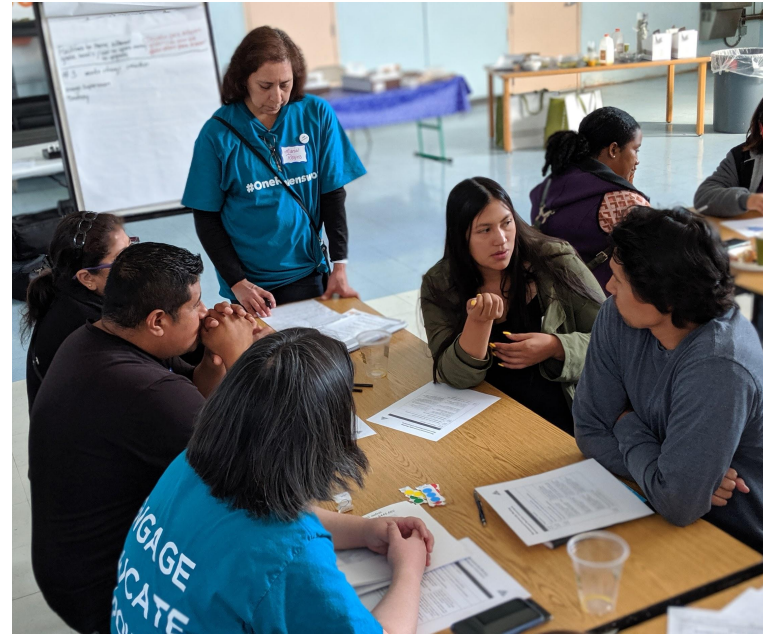
Community meetings asked the community to help us decide how to approach our challenge

- Context: Why merge schools?
- Question 1: What factors should the district consider when deciding which schools to merge? What should the district prioritize?
- Question 2: Do we merge all the schools in Fall 2020, or spread it out: one in Fall 2020, one in Fall 2021?
- Question 3: If your school is merged next fall (either moving or receiving students), what would make the change smoother?



The small group format was designed to encourage each person to participate

- Majority of meeting was spent in small group discussion (4-8 people)
- Small groups allow deeper discussion by more people
- We trained facilitators to listen and record
 - District and partner staff served as facilitators
 - Each table had a facilitator, co-facilitator / note taker, interpreter
 - We trained all facilitators in advance
 - Facilitators focused on listening and encouraging voices, not sharing their own opinions



Meeting turnout was good



- >125 community members attended one of the meetings*
- >90% were parents or community members (vs. staff)
- About half took advantage of Spanish interpretation

* Attendance excludes >20 district & partner staff who served as small group facilitators

Participants felt very positive about the community meetings

- 99% of respondents agreed:
 - I had the opportunity to share my opinions
 - I felt heard / listened to
 - I would come to another community meeting like this in the future
 - I would tell a friend to attend a community meeting like this
- 85% of respondents understood why Ravenswood needs to merge schools
- How did we respond to feedback?

We are also engaging DAC / DELAC

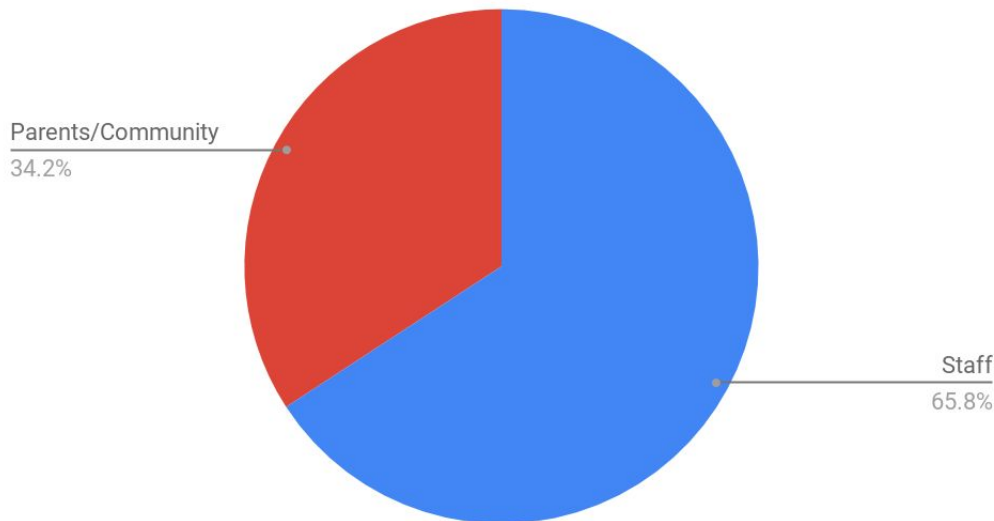


- We met with DAC/DELAC on Nov. 7
 - Shared presentation from community meetings
 - Each DAC/DELAC member took the online survey
 - Asked members for opinions on the process
 - Representatives will be presenting later tonight
- We will meet again in November and on Dec 5

Nearly 200 people shared their opinions through the online survey

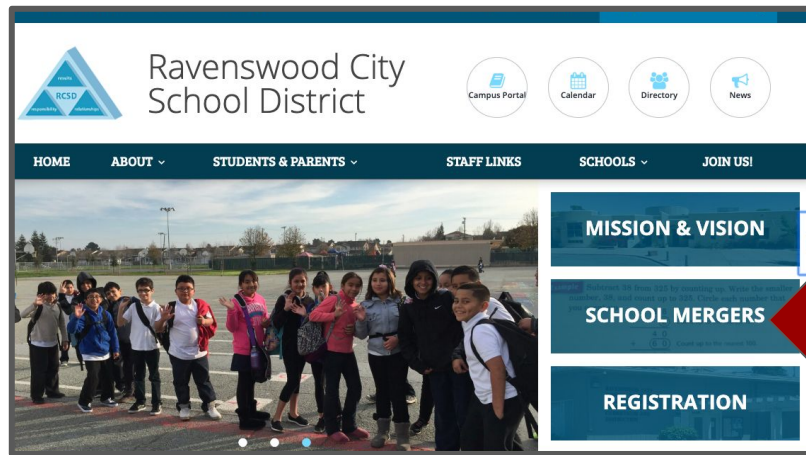
- Same questions were asked at community meetings

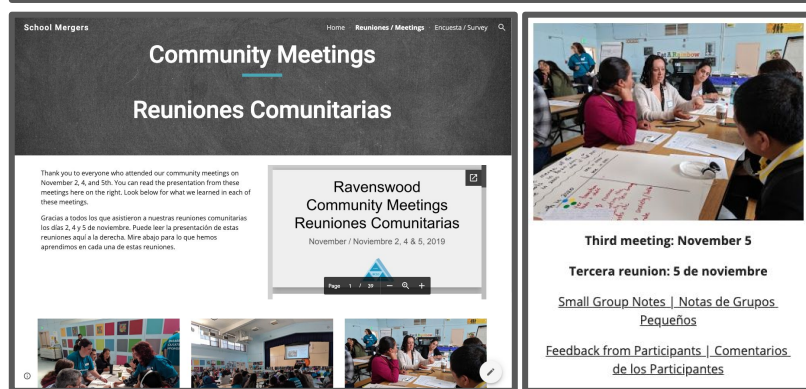

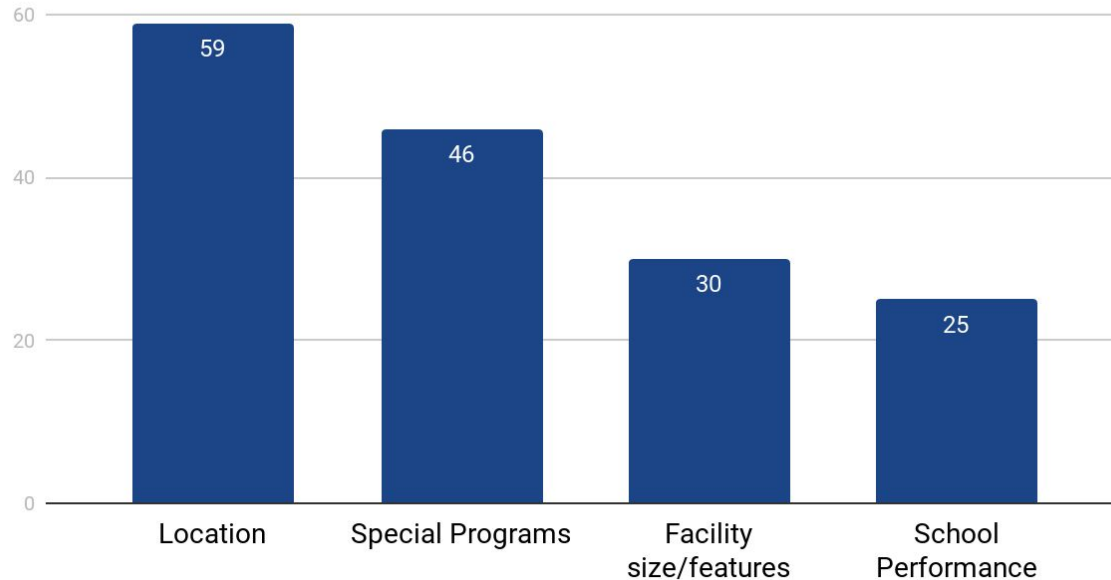

Number of votes per option at community meetings*

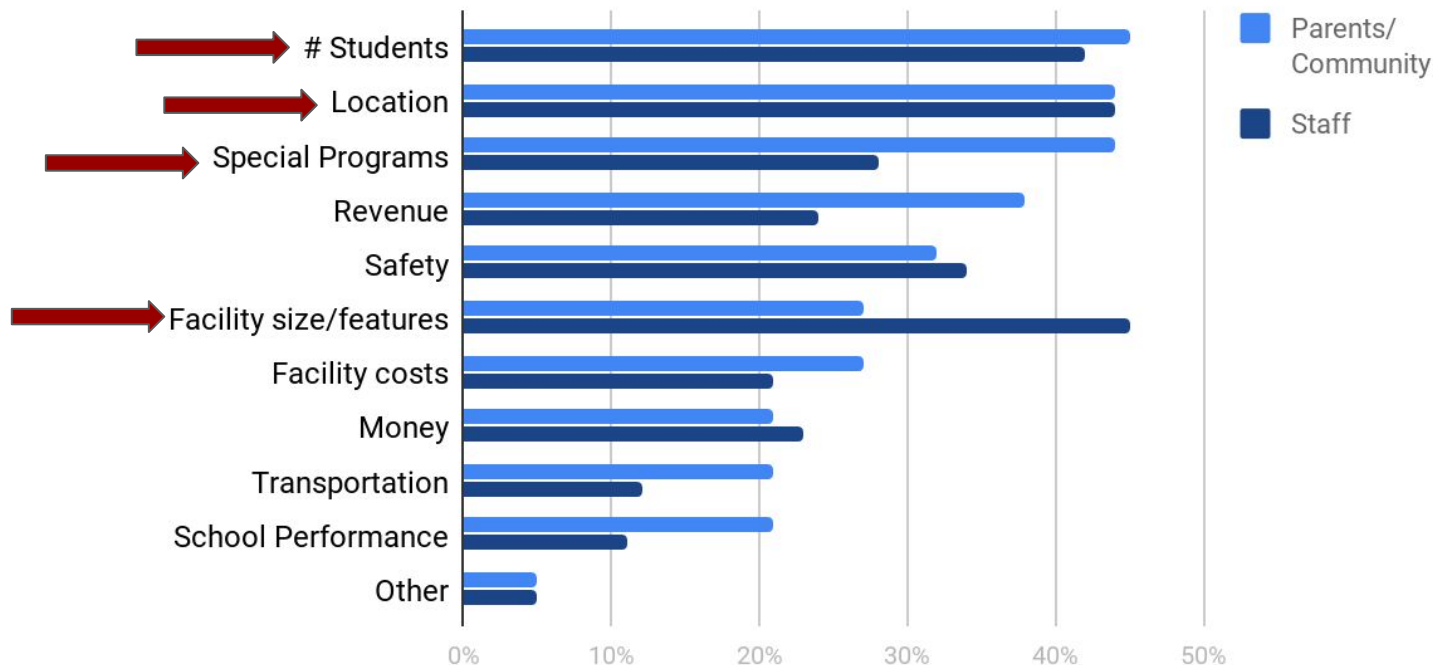

Survey: Major factors to prioritize

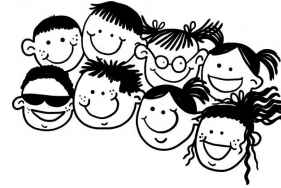
Percent of respondents who chose each factor

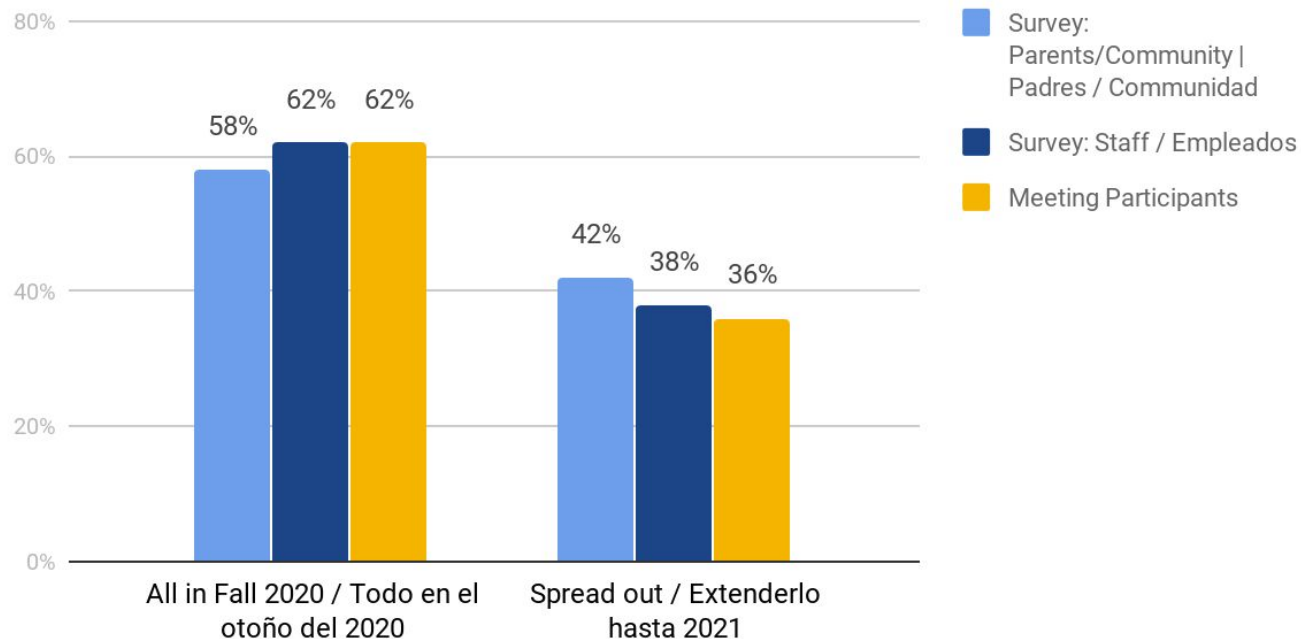

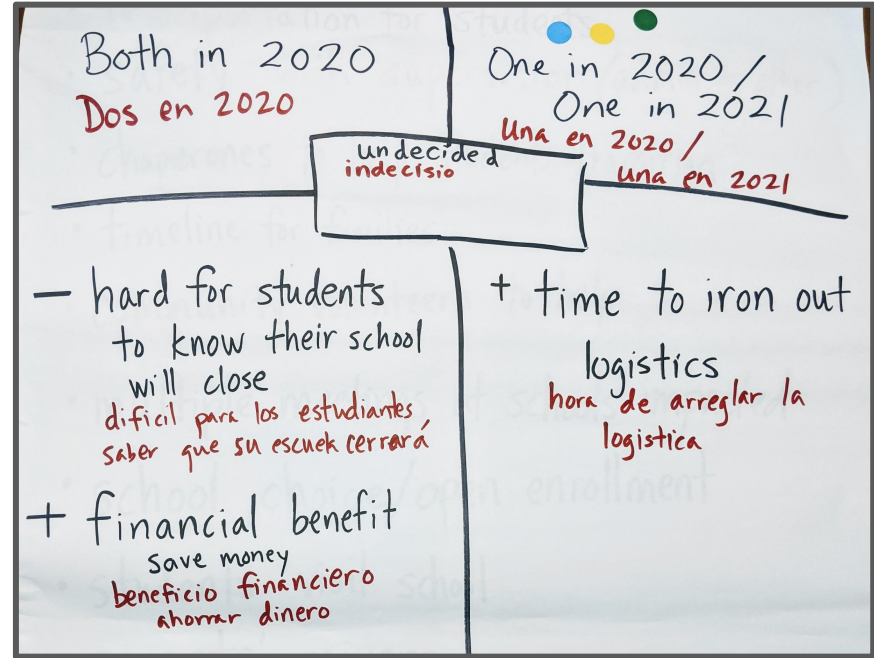
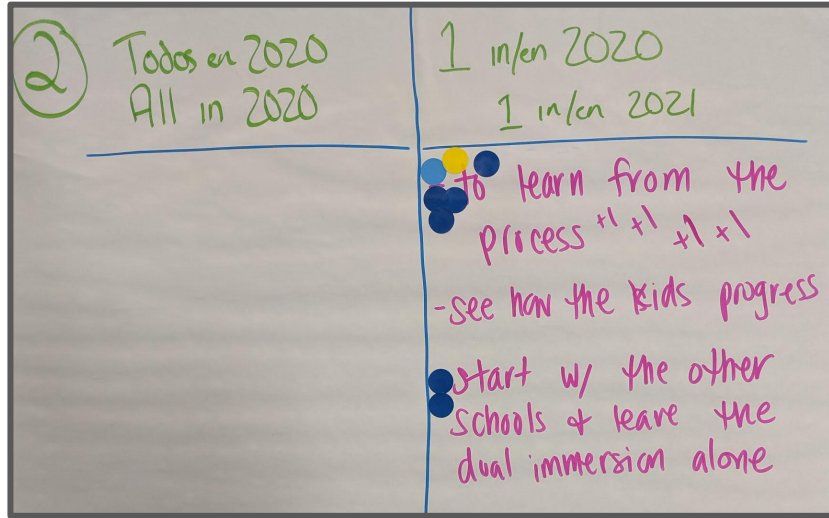


60% of participants and survey respondents believe we should merge all schools in Fall 2020

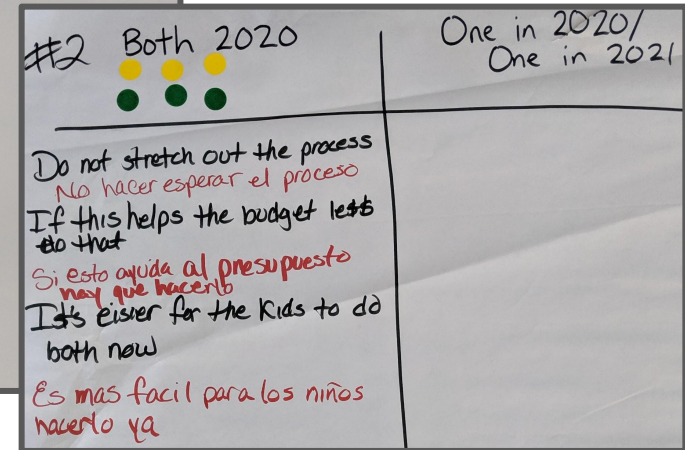
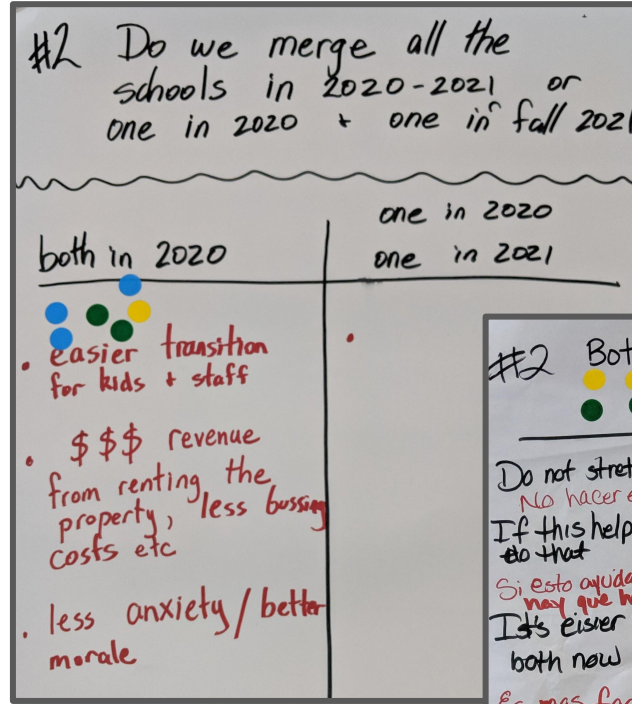
A subset of small groups wanted to spread out the mergers



But the majority of people and groups wanted to move faster with mergers

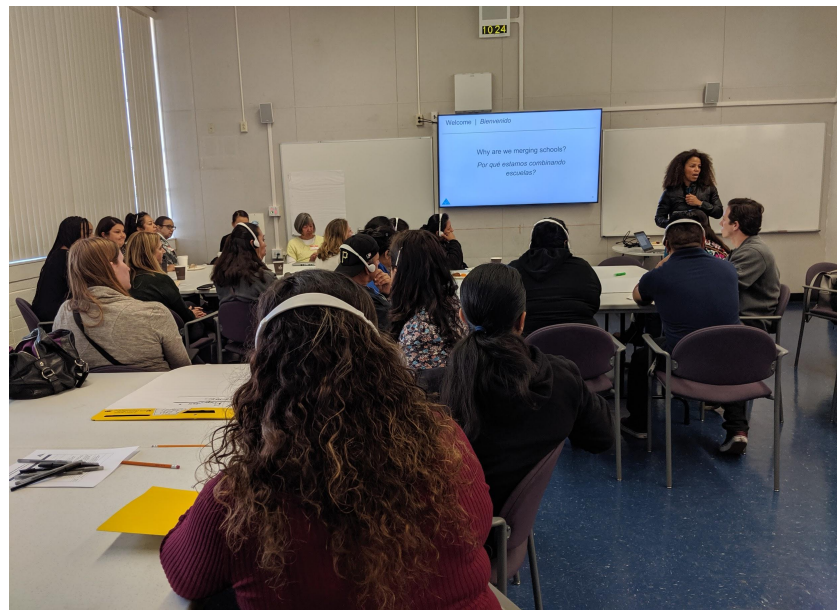
Survey Respondents:

- “Save money”



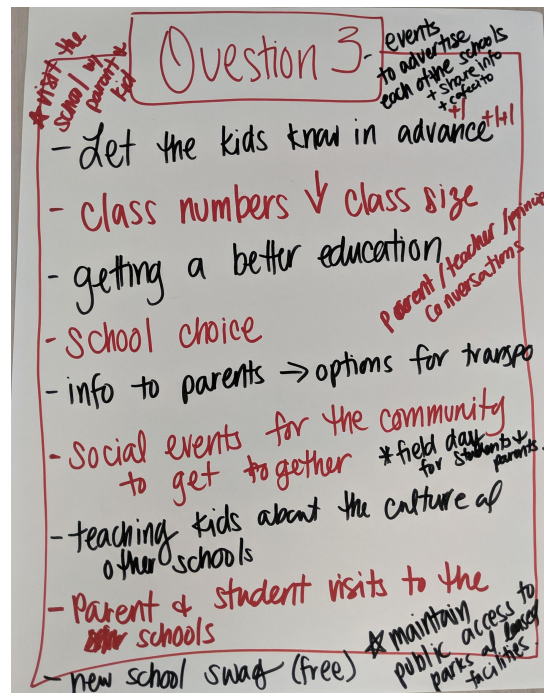
Question 3:

Communication was the number one request

- Communicate early and often!
- Engage parents, students and staff
- Have a clear plan to implement the moves
- Build relationships and excitement within the new school community
- Keep school communities together
- Offer choice for families

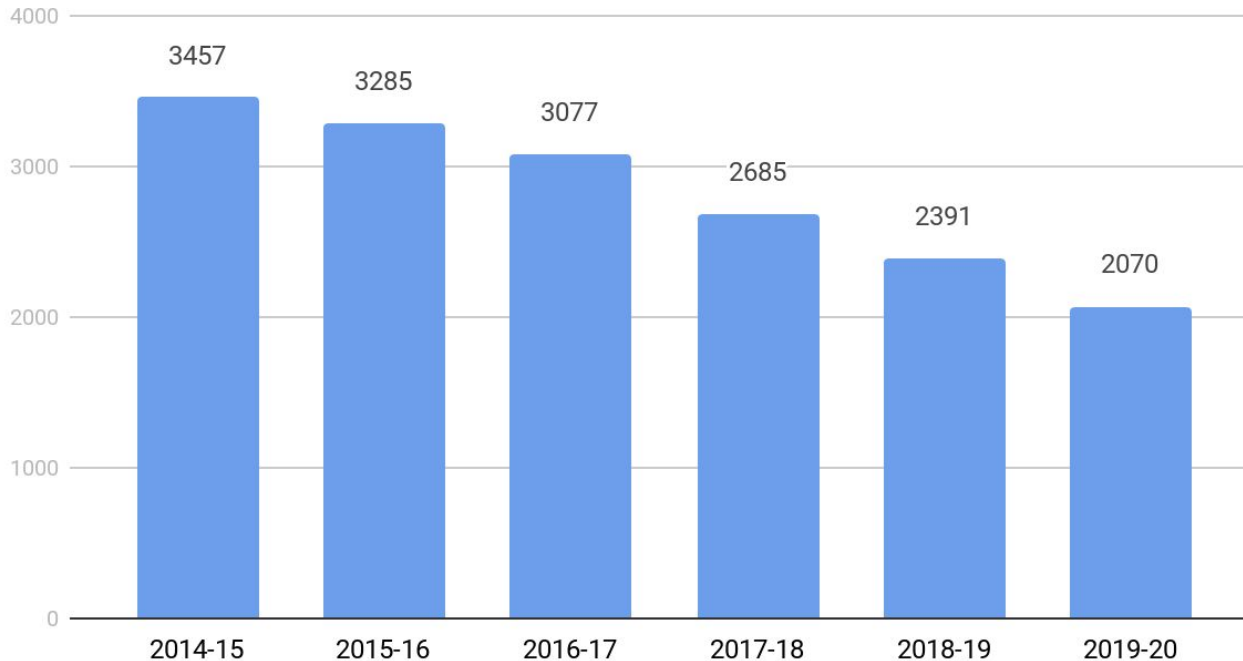
Why are we merging schools?

Our enrollment has dropped significantly

Fewer students means less state funding

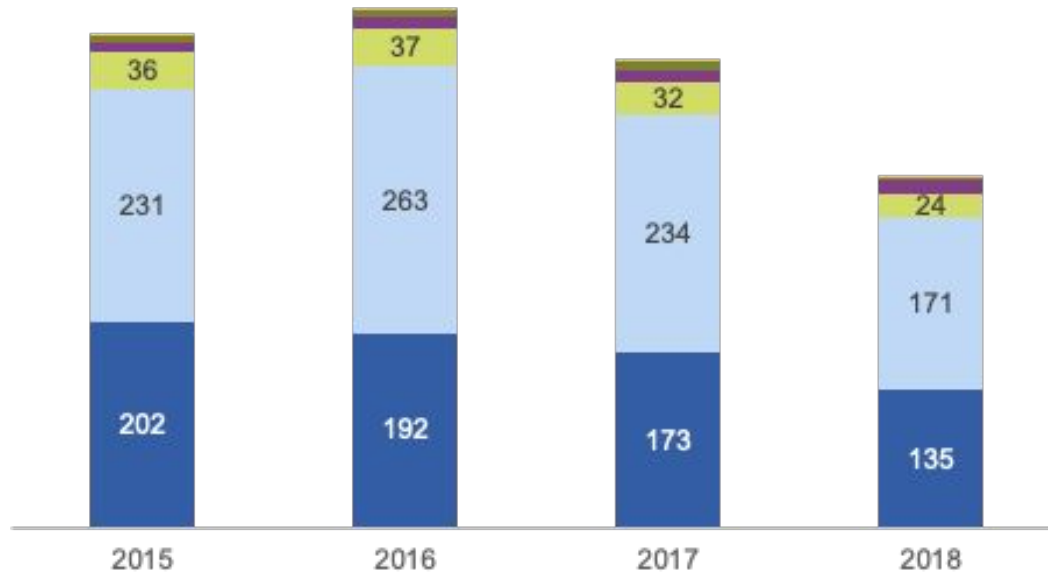
Menos estudiantes significa menos fondos estatales

- State funds are based on enrollment
- Donations from foundations and federal programs can only be spent on specific programs

We have cut costs as enrollment decreased

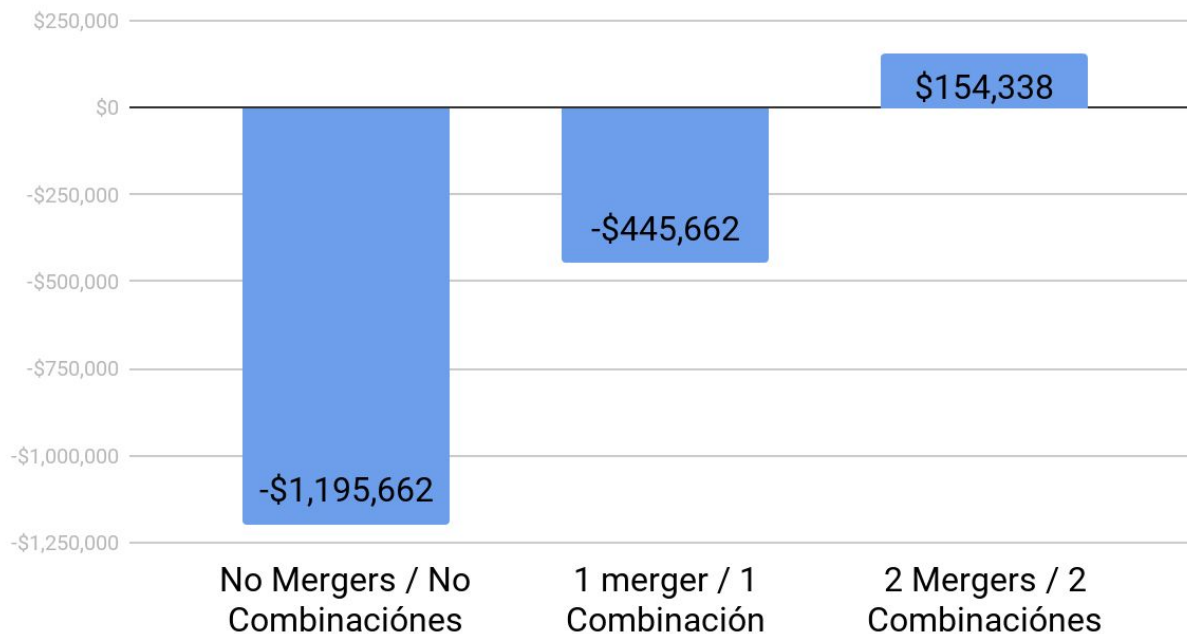
- District office and school administration cut this year

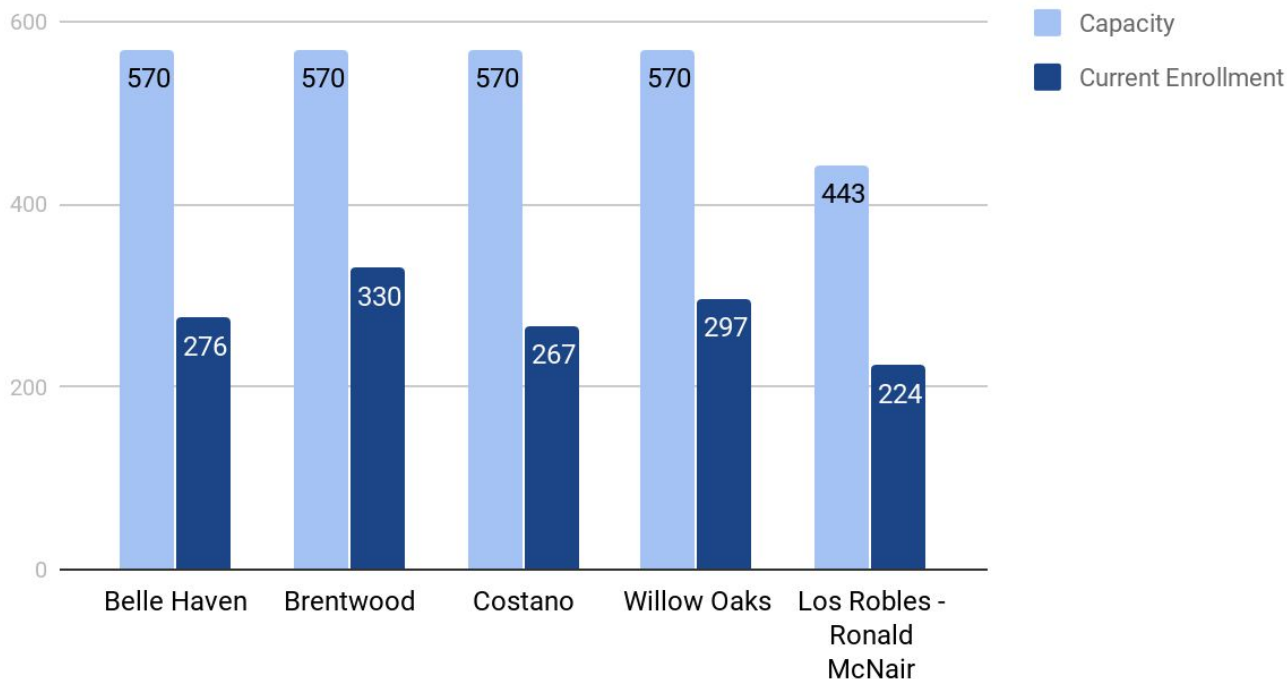
2020-21 Deficit or Surplus | Déficit o excedente

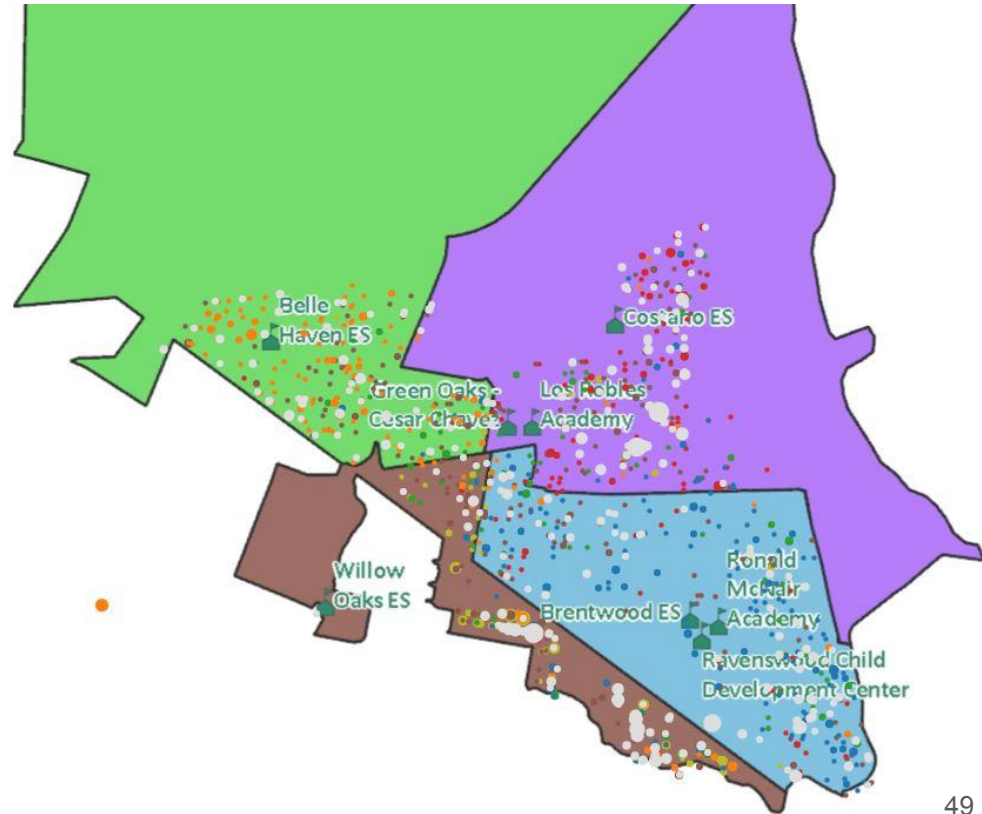

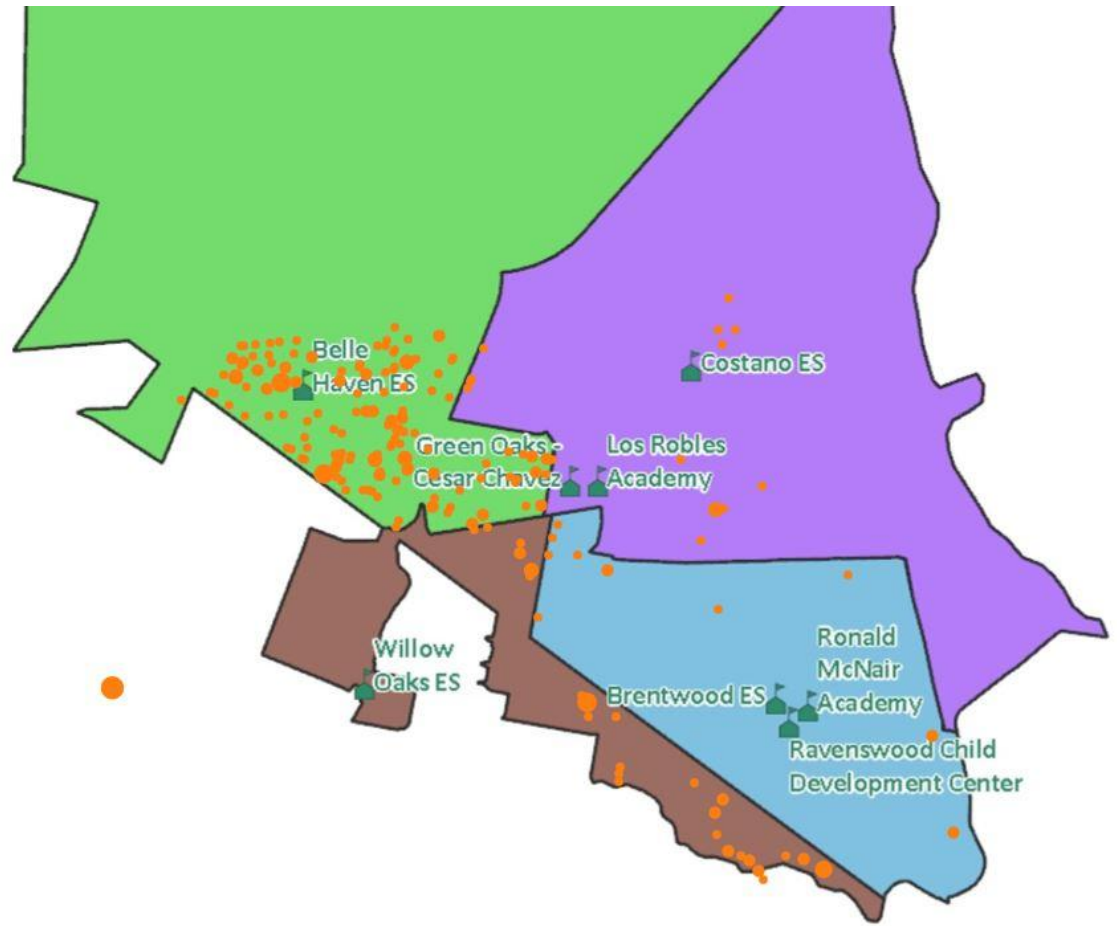
Where do Ravenswood students live (all schools)?

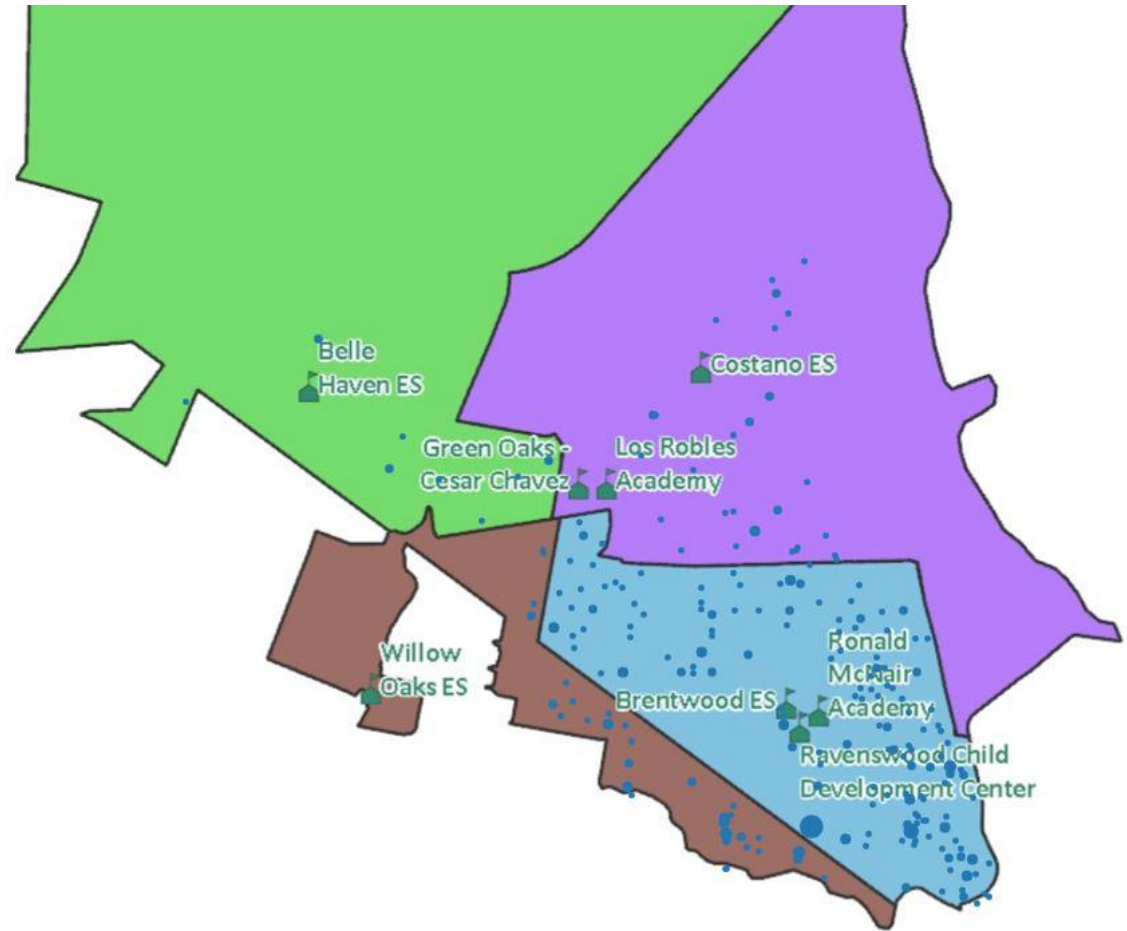

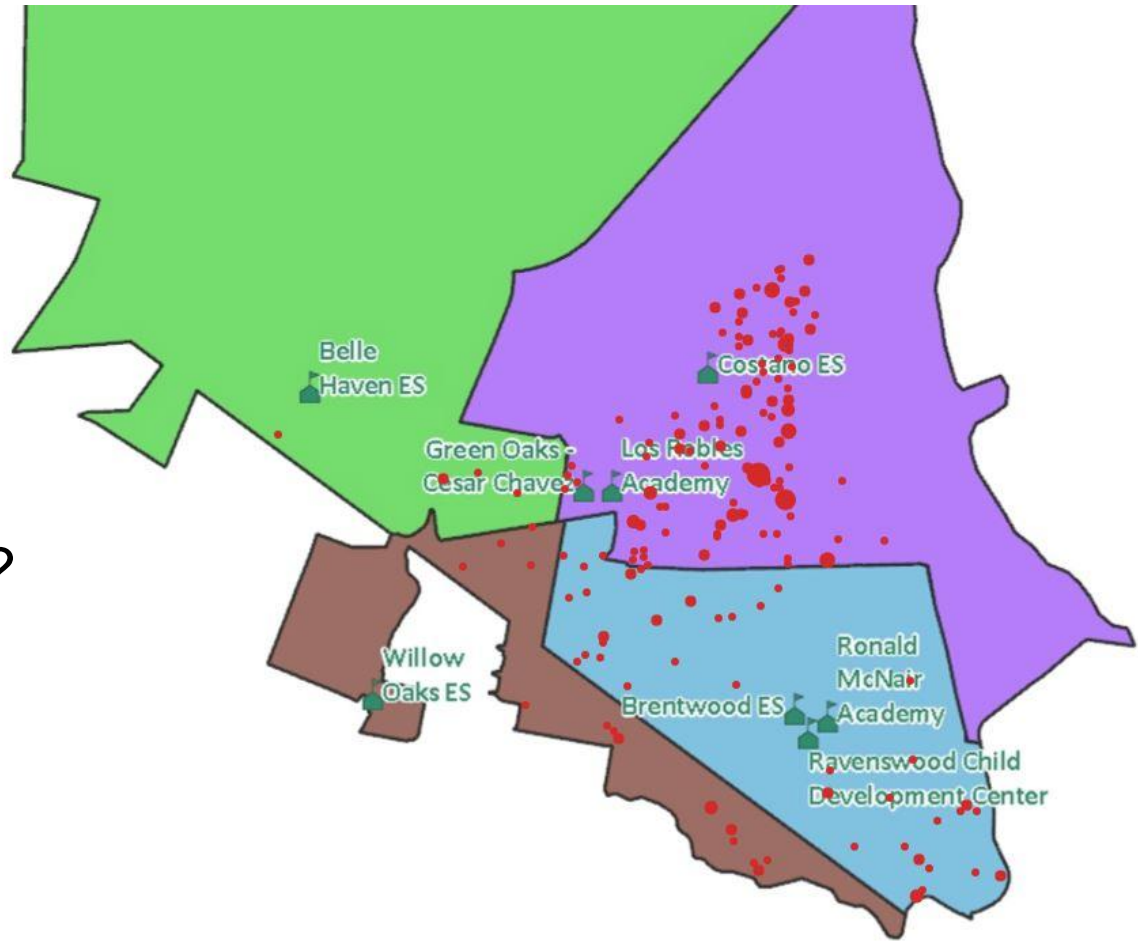

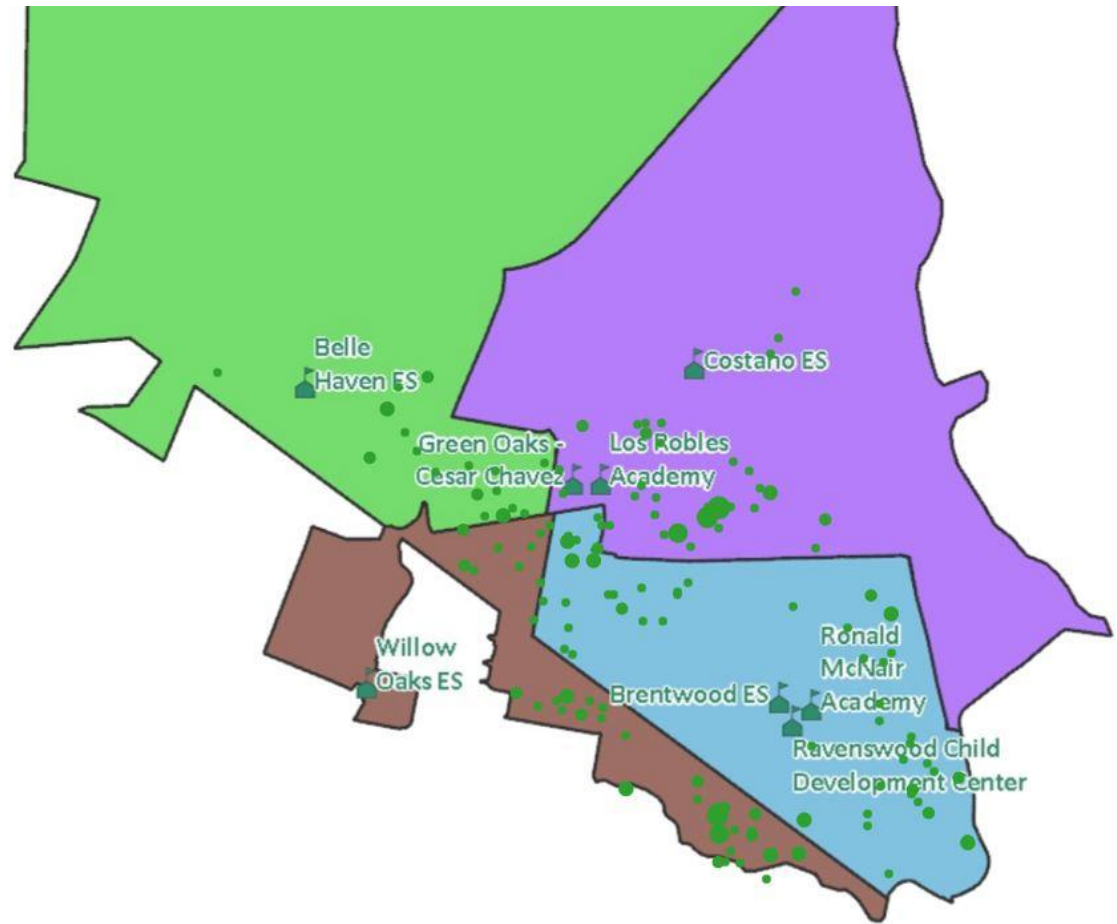

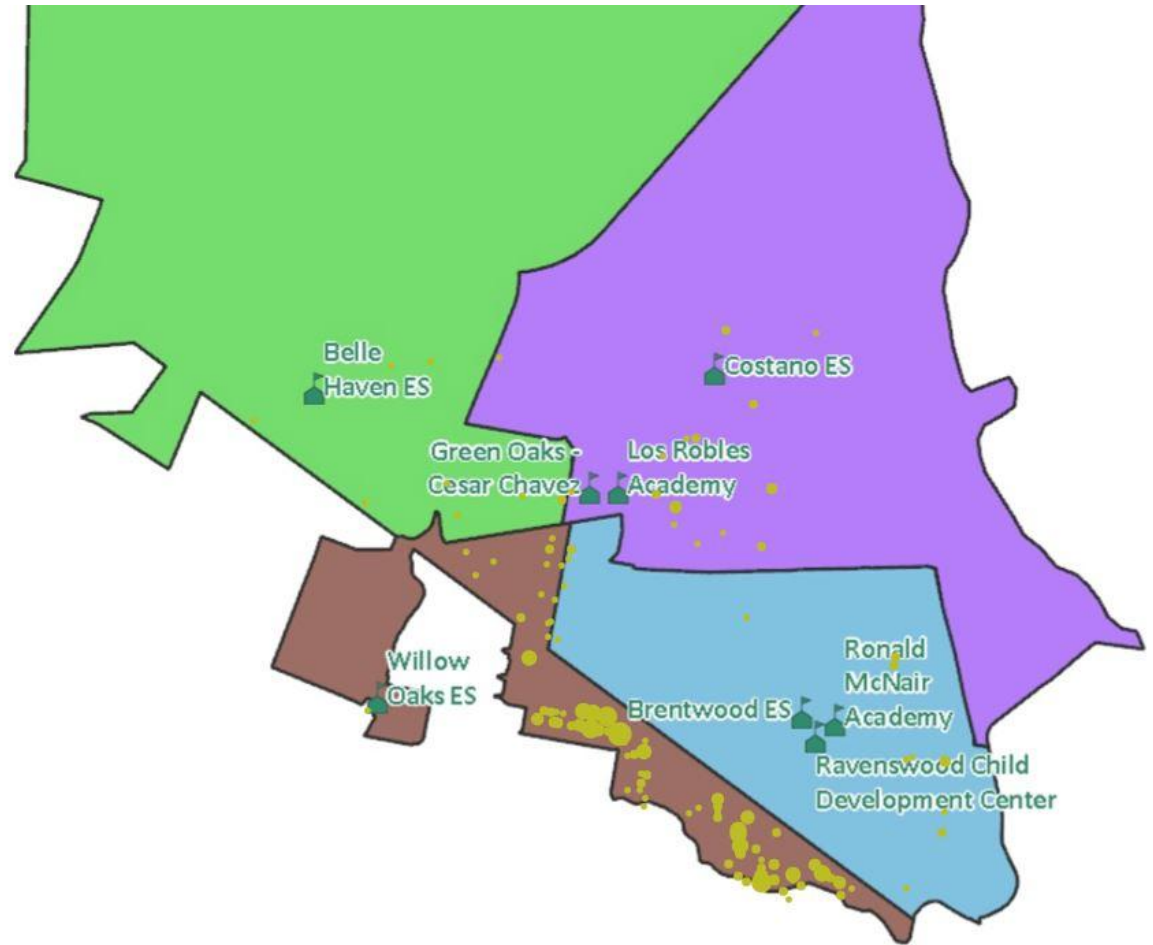

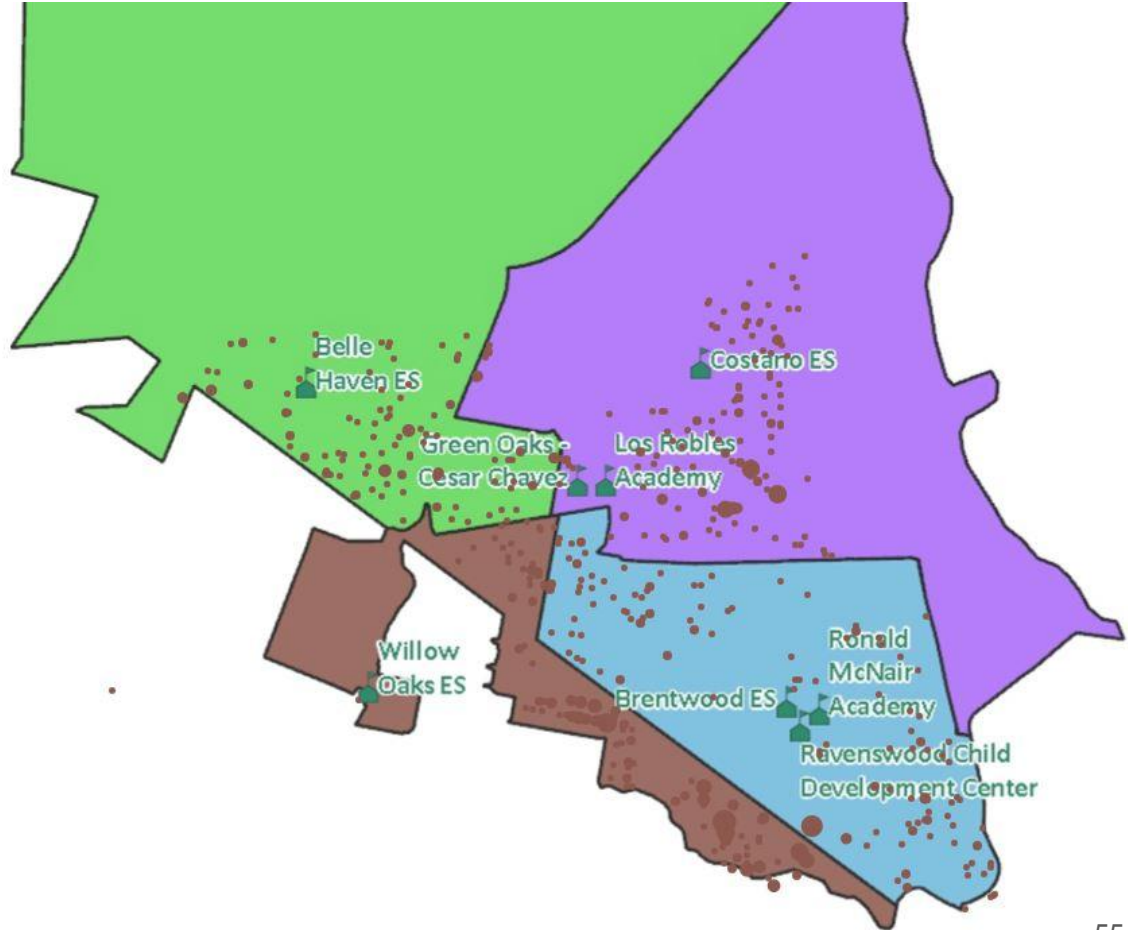

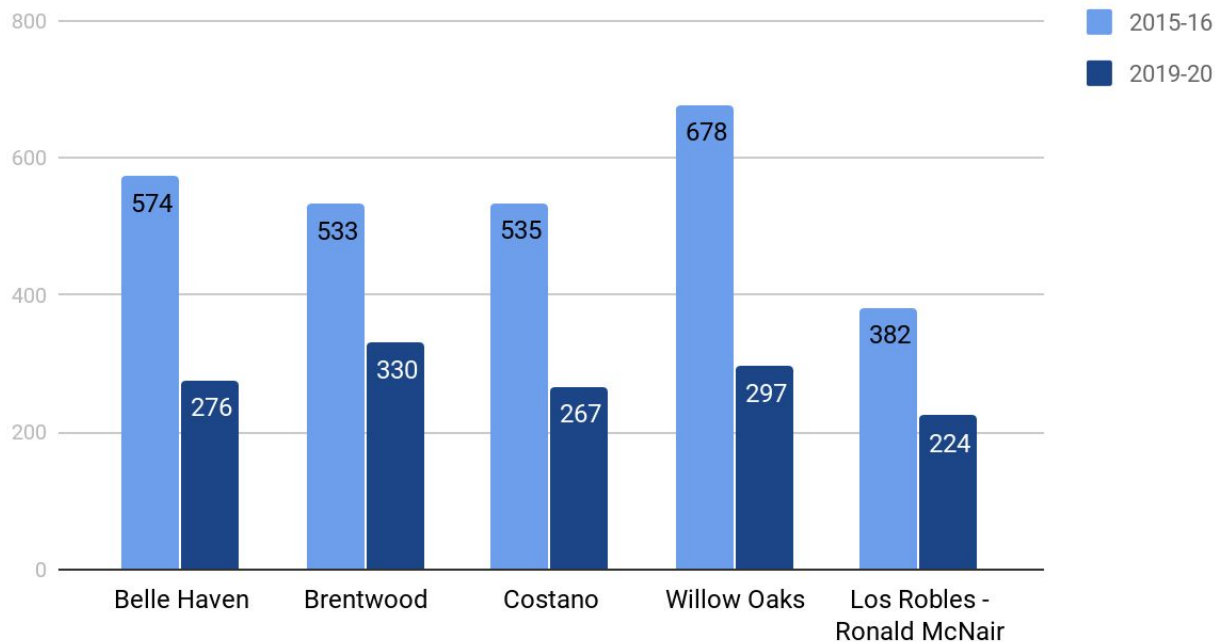

1)	Staggered start time for Middle school (30 minutes) will reduce the need for two buses	\$200,000
2)	Bus students to home school only (if needed to cross US 101, Willow, University Avenues)	\$100,000
3)	Fill classrooms to capacity	???
4)	Terminate PR contract from 2020-21	\$ 96,000
5)	Explore the use of REF funds for base operations and support the supplemental activities with Federal and State revenues	???
6)	Eliminate contracts no longer in use	\$100,000
7)	Explore the delivery system of in-district SPED services	???
8)	Accurately project and minimize Worker's Comp Costs	\$200,000
9)	Maximize use of surplus property for revenue generation	\$1.0M - 3.0M
