

California Healthy Youth Act (AB 329)

What is CHYA?

California Healthy Youth Act is law that requires all California school districts to provide students with comprehensive sexual health education and HIV prevention education.

- Effective January 2016
- Students must receive this instruction once in middle school and once in high school
- Board policies and administrative regulations must reflect the law's provisions as outlined in *Education Code* sections 51930-51939
- Districts must ensure that curriculum and instruction, including all outside and guest speakers are compliant with the law
- Districts must provide in-service training to teachers as necessary to ensure they understand the requirements of the law and are informed about new developments in the scientific understanding of HIV and sexual health
