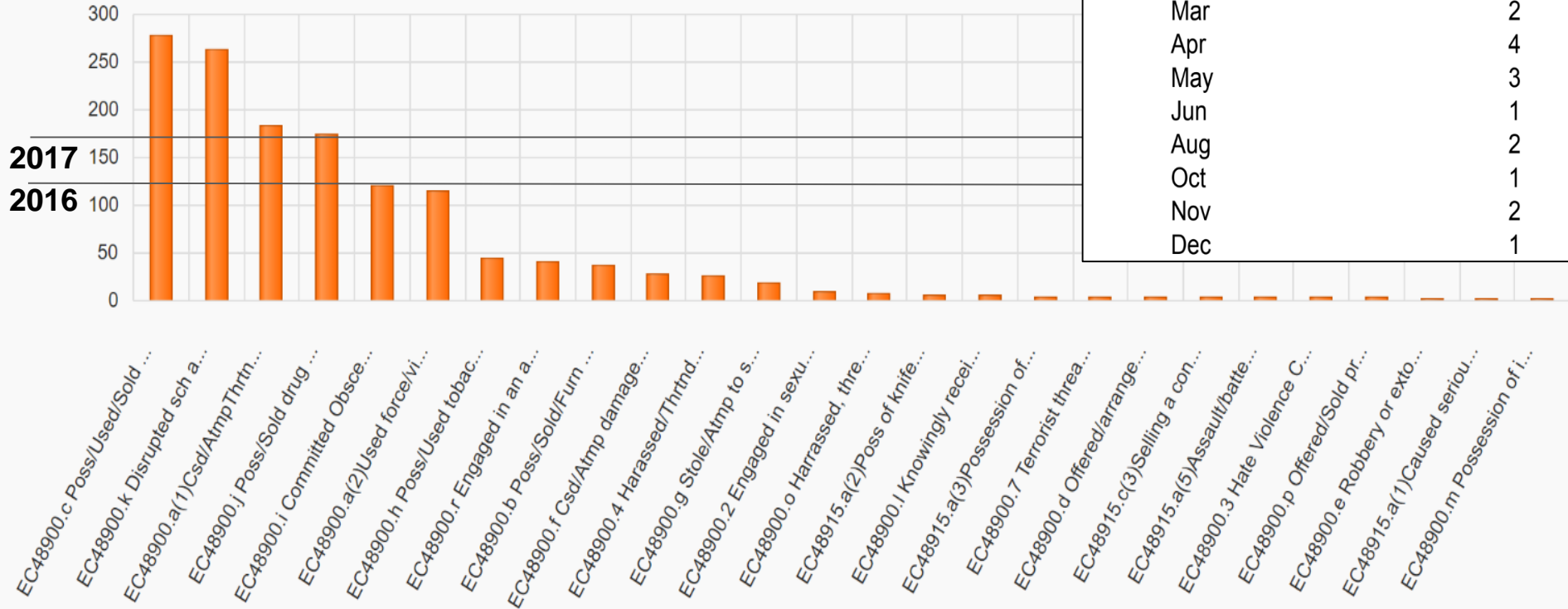
Students walk through our doors every day with their ‘best self’. Their experiences shape them, just as adults are shaped by theirs.

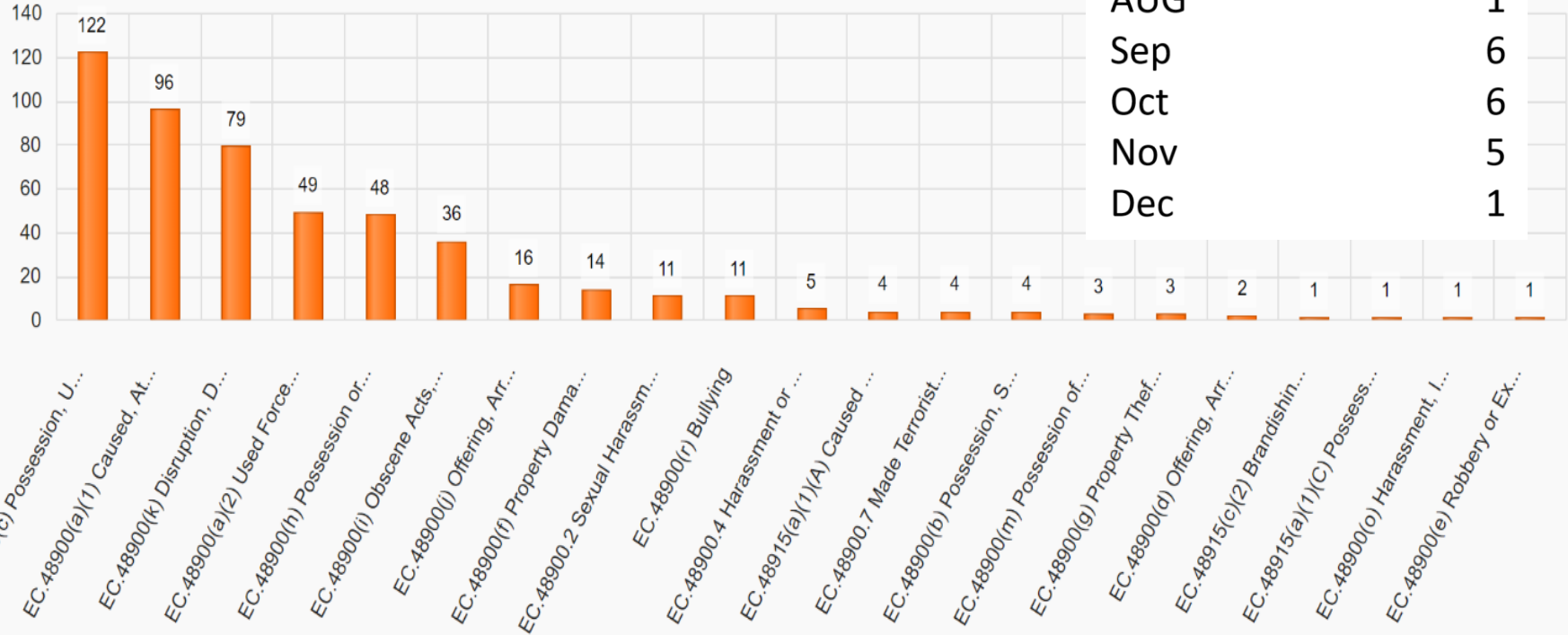
Total Number of Incidents For All Violation Codes

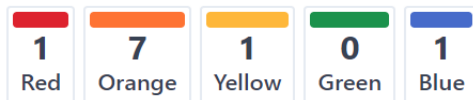

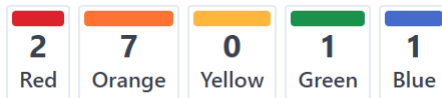

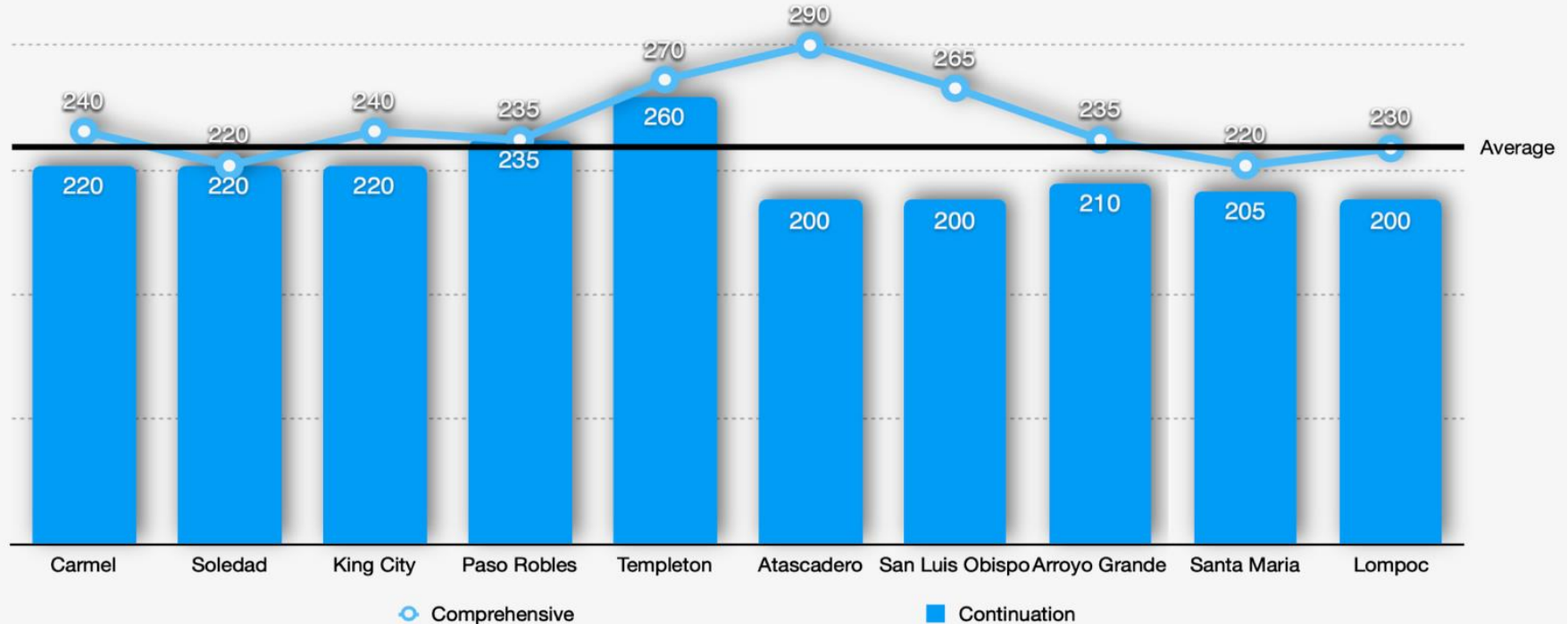

Possible Solutions to improve Alt Ed.

- Opportunity at the HS
- HS tighten Master Schedule for 2020 and Use PRHS FTE at LHS
- Look at Credit Recovery at the HS
- Examine Policies to ensure consistency (Grading, Cell Phones)
- Rethink IHS moving forward.

Recommendation and Next Steps

- ***Opportunity program*** VS additional para support for challenging students.

Next Steps:

- Continue to collect data in collaboration with PRPD about use of SROs.
- Plan educational assemblies as a proactive next step (San Miguel?).
- One SRO move to MS as home base.
- Differentiate data between secondary and elementary.
- Address the number of students failing at the middle school level. (Transitions)
- Board policy spelling out that students receive a diploma from the school in which they earn a majority of their credits.
- Rethinking of Independence High School and how a hybrid model might be of benefit to students and the school district.
