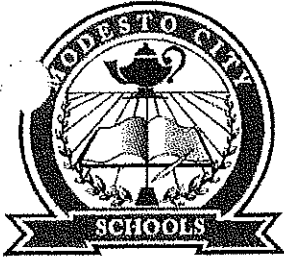

Welcome and Start of Meeting

- Nuemi Largo called the meeting to order at 12:39 p.m.
- Seven centers are represented. A quorum is present.

Approval of Agenda & Minutes

- The February Agenda has been approved. Laurie Kelley made the first motion. Deisy Tamayo second the motion. Motion Passed.
- The January Minutes have been approved. Deisy Tamayo made the first motion. Stephanie Fisher second the motion. Motion Passed.

New Business

Census Information

- Violeta Cuevas from the Stanislaus County Office of Education presented the information on Census. The next Census is scheduled on April 1, 2020.
- It is crucial to ensure a complete count of children ages 0-5 to secure adequate federal funding to support children and families in California.
- The Federal Government allocates more than \$200-300 billion to the states based on census data.
- Data is used to determine how many seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives. In addition, census data is used to define legislature districts, school district, neighborhood areas, and other important functional areas of government.
- Members were encourage to complete the Census questionnaire by mail, online or by phone.
- Violeta Cuevas shared the 2019-2020 Head Start Attendance Award Program.
- Modesto City Schools Early Childhood Education had many students with 90% or higher attendance in December 2019.

Funding Distribution and Service Area (ACTION ITEM)

Community Assessment Draft

- Donna Bush shared the Community Assessment Draft to the members.
- Modesto City Schools currently has Transitional Kindergarten classrooms at nine elementary schools.
- Based on the Data reviewed, a decrease for Parent Volunteers in the classroom was detected. Parent's Immunization records were not updated & referrals provided by the Family Service Specialist were not completed.
- Due to high numbers of children with disabilities and challenging behaviors, staff and parent trainings will focus continue to focus on implementing a comprehensive classroom management program and social-emotional.

Head Start Program Audit

- The Head Start Program Audit has been scheduled for the week of Feb. 24, 2020 in the Early Childhood Education Training Room.

Budget Status Report:

This report displays a graph showing where all our money is spent. The first two items are salaries and is where most of our budget goes. The remainder of the budget goes towards what we use to run our program. We have a total of 3 million dollars to spend.

Regional Head Start Budget Report:

- **For December, 26.34% of the budget was spent.**

Blended Head Start Budget Report:

- **For December, 25.66% of the budget was spent.**

T&TA Budget Report:

This report shows how much was spent on workshops and trainings for the program.

Regional Head Start T&TA Report:

- **For December, 8.49% of the budget was spent.**

Attendance Report:

This report reflects attendance per site. We are mandated to maintain 85% attendance.

Regional Head Start Monthly Attendance Report:

- **Attendance for December 85.36%. Burbank, Fairview, Muir, Pearson, Robertson Road & Wright Start fell below the 85%.**

In-Kind Report:

This report reflects the value of the parent volunteer hours earned to help reach our in-kind match.

Regional Head Start In-Kind Report:

- **In December, a total of \$29,986 was generated.**

Credit Card Expense Report:

This report shows how much was spent each month with a District provided credit card.

Regional Head Start Credit Card Expenses:

- In November & December, a total of \$5,298.52 were spent for both months.

Program Summary Report:

This report displays the current enrollment status.

Regional Head Start Program Summary Report:

- For December, there were 500 children enrolled with a cumulative enrollment of 567. There are 56 (9.9%) of children enrolled who are over income and 53 (9.3%) of children enrolled with disabilities.

USDA (United States Department of Agriculture):

This report displays the amount of USDA meals served to our children. The meals are funded through the Child Care Food Program.

- In December, a total of 7,492 meals were served.

Site Supervision:

- Donna Bush discussed the importance of having a full signature & the exact arrival & departure time on the sign-in sheets.
- Parents were notified that the signatures on the sign-in sheets need to match the Authorized Signature Form.
- Parents were reminded to close the gates during school hours for student's safety.

Office of Head Start Communication:

- The Office of Head Start released the new Head Start Federal Income Guidelines for the 2019-2020 School year.
- There is a small increase on the guidelines.

Census 2020

Why 0-5?

Children ages 0-5 are not included in the Census, including in California. In 2020, it is crucial to ensure a complete count of children ages 0-5 to secure adequate federal funding to support children and families in California.

Research tells us the reason Californians might not include young children in their Census responses due to:

- Lack of understanding
- Personal fears related to immigration status and overcrowded housing situations
- Unfamiliarity with how the Census can help your children and household

Why is the Census important?

- **Census affects funding**
The federal government allocates more than \$200-300 billion to the states based on census data.
- **Census helps make informed community decisions**
Data about changes in the community are crucial to government decision makers for infrastructure planning and construction such as roads, schools, satellite offices, hospitals.
- **Census affects economic development**
Census data help businesses identify the location of their businesses (expand or locate new stores) which often times can lead to new jobs.

An undercount in 2020 could cost California up to \$1.15 billion per year across federal programs including programs that support children: schools, child care, medical care, food assistance, housing, public transportation (basic services that we use).

Why is the Census important?

- **Census affects representation**
Data are used to determine how many seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives. In addition, census data are used to define legislative districts, school districts, neighborhood areas, and other important functional areas of government.
- **Census data to understand property value**
Potential homeowners research property values, median income, and other demographic information about a particular community.
- **The Census helps us see how our country is changing and more people counted means more funding.**

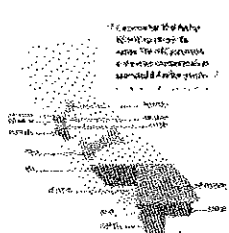

How Hard is it to Count California



- Of the 5 largest states in the nation, only California did worse on the MPR (mail-in participation rate) in 2010, than in 2000.
- CA had the highest estimated rate of 0-5 undercount of any state, and LA County had the highest estimated rate of 0-5 undercount of any county.

Why does it matter?

The estimated percentage of the hard-to-count (HTC) population, defined as having a low self-response rate (73%) in the 2010 decennial census, based on the latest census estimates, was approximately 20% of the County's current population (for 107,087 people).

Why does it matter?

In 2010 there were eight census tracts in the County communities in Alhambra, Central Modesto, Ceres, South Modesto, Turlock, and West Modesto, that had less than 70% mail return rates, which is considered a high HTC population non-return rate.

Alameda County

Why does it matter?

Based on the latest census estimates (for the 2012-2016 period), 525,000 people live in 170,828 households in Stanislaus County and 5,311 people live in group quarters with the total population being 530,361. In 2010, 76.8% of the County's households mailed back their 2010 census questionnaire, requiring costly and more difficult in-person follow-up to count the remaining 23.2%.

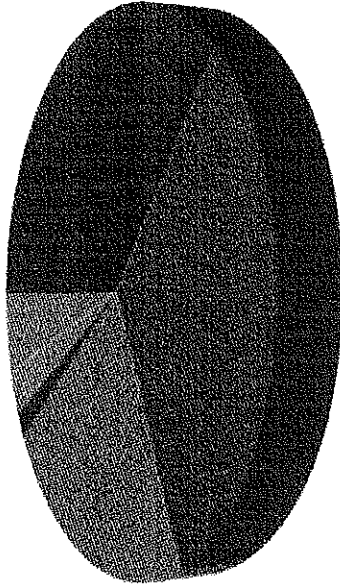

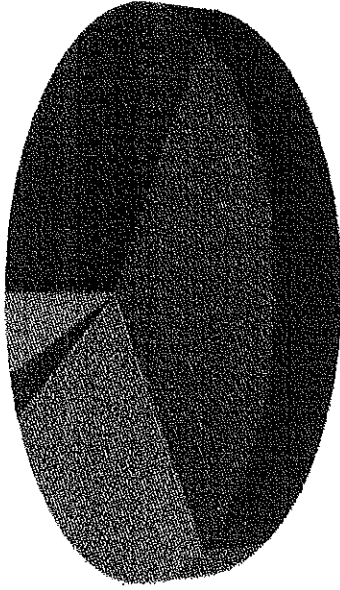

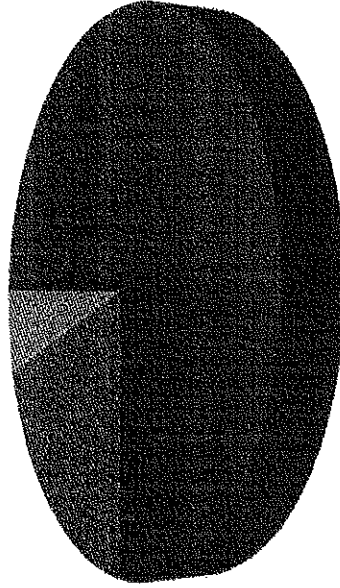
