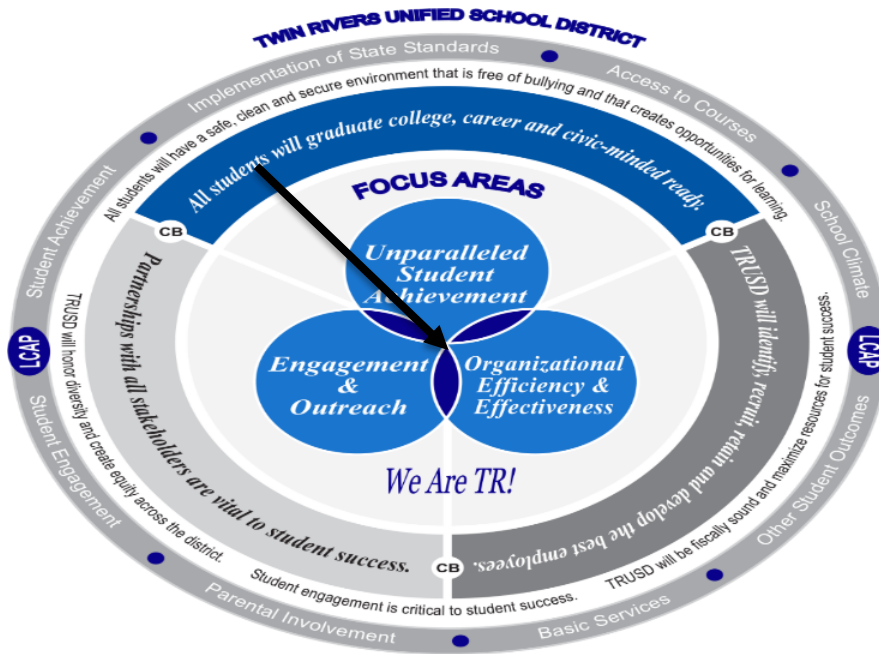

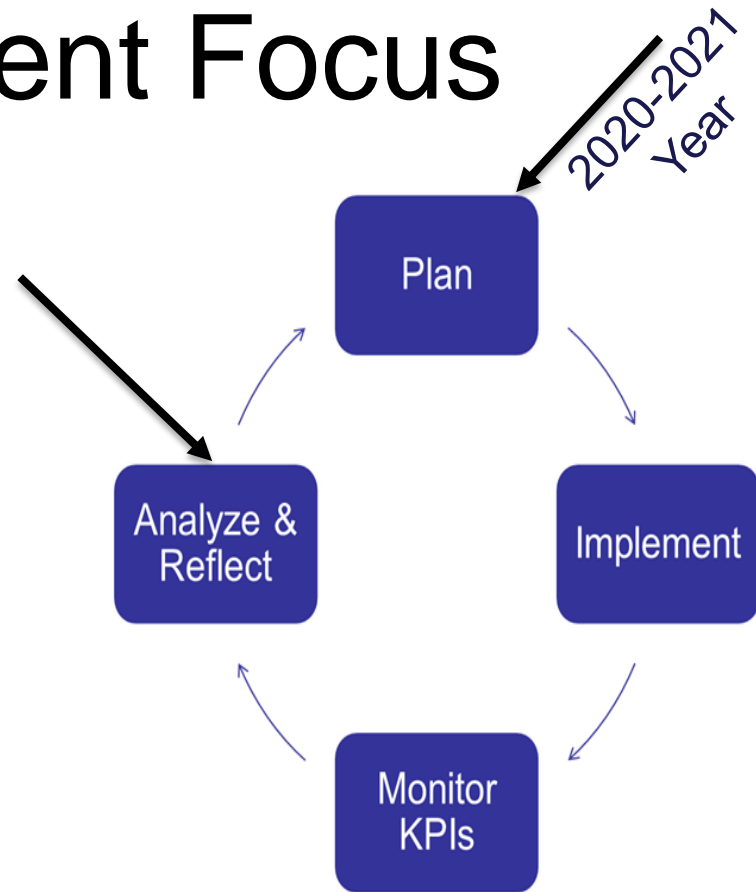

Focus of Meetings

MIDDLE SCHOOLS

- Taking roll during drills (Catapult would not allow)
- Speakers in blacktop area do not work well
- Teachers not bringing out phones/ red & green folders during evacs.
- Need more time to take roll before all clears given
- Teachers struggle to log into Catapult while supervising students
- Substitute training in Catapult and other drill procedures
- Taking roll during emergency is between useless/ harmful
- Scheduling future drills
- ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate)
- Results of lockdown drill

High School Site Compliance 2019-2020

1. Grant High School:

September 12th - Reviewed issues with locks on gates, trespassers, unsecured doors/gates, alarm codes.

September 19th - Debrief fire drill, review prior notes, review/revise evacuation maps, discipline issues

October 10th - Planned "duck/cover drill", Catapult exercise, fights on campus, cutting class, vandalism/graffiti, new PSO hired

2. Foothill High School:

August 13th - Catapult training (all staff)

September 26th - Safety roles, 16 emergency buckets w/ supplies, waiting for tourniquets. How does staff get ICS training. Site needs lock blocks.

October 16th - CANCELLED

3. Highlands High School:

September 4th - Drill feedback: Gates not open, bottleneck through gate at track, assigned to staff. Track/evac area concern, wet/muddy in winter, grass could catch fire. Green/red cards need to have procedures for use. Drill schedule is good. Feedback/ Monitoring of safety process, PE radios, share safety plan, batteries dead, radios ordered.

High School Site Compliance 2019-2020

3. Highlands High School (cont.):

October 2nd - Ensure safe physical environment for students/staff. Staff will improve commo. during emergencies, practice drills, monitoring entry locations. Catapult use increase. Wrong radios ordered will get correct ones.

January 8th - Recap on recent drills the school completed to include 2-Lockdown, Earthquake, Fire. Student Climate Survey. Feedback for monitoring of Safety Procedures.

4. Rio Linda High School:

August –Traffic Concerns, all yearly drills scheduled (fire/earthquake/active shooter)

October - Went over drills. Discussed how to train substitutes on Catapult.

January 9th - Traffic Signals and concerns with students following signals when crossing streets. School work order items; Response time during evacuations, discussed evacuations during catapult etc.

5. Vista Nueva/ Nova:

October 2nd - Meetings occur after each drill to discuss improvements.
School Site Safety: Unauthorized entry, students outside, response by staff, lock doors. Resolving the Drill/ Real Event.

October 23rd - Earthquake Drill, fire Drill

December 11th - Next years Safety Drills, Fire Drills, Earthquake Drills, Lockdown Drills

January 8th - Safety Drills, Fire Drills, Students leaving the classroom.

February 12th - School site safety plan

6. Pacific High School:

August 28th - Safety plan goals: Set goals to accomplish during semester, strategies etc. Teachers concerned about window exposure/coverage.

September 18th - Safety plan goals: emergency procedures, lock down drills, safety concerns. Site safety plan has been updated.

Catapult EMS

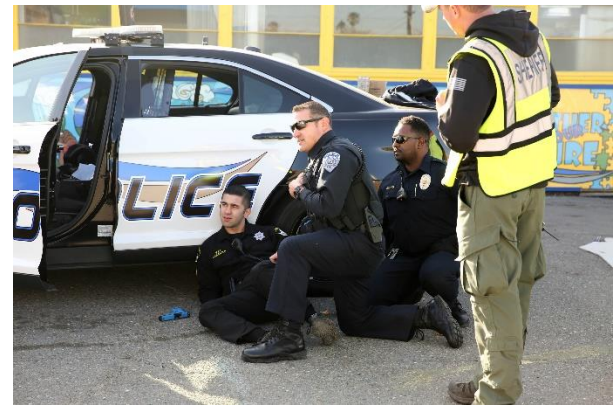
- Fully Deployed in the District

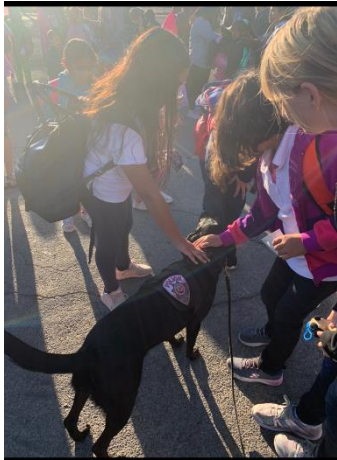


K-9 Unit
