

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District Goal Alignment

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Process

- Recommendations for supplemental literature
- Every submission reviewed by two readers
- Committee reviews recommendations
- Parents made aware of concerning content
- Opportunity to receive alternative assignment



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Timeline

- **October 31st:** Teachers submitted recommendations of new books through Department Chairs
- Each book was read by at least two teachers
- **January 27th :** Department Chairs recommended adding books to the Passport to Literature list
- **February 18th:** Board Communication on Passport To Literature Recommendations
