

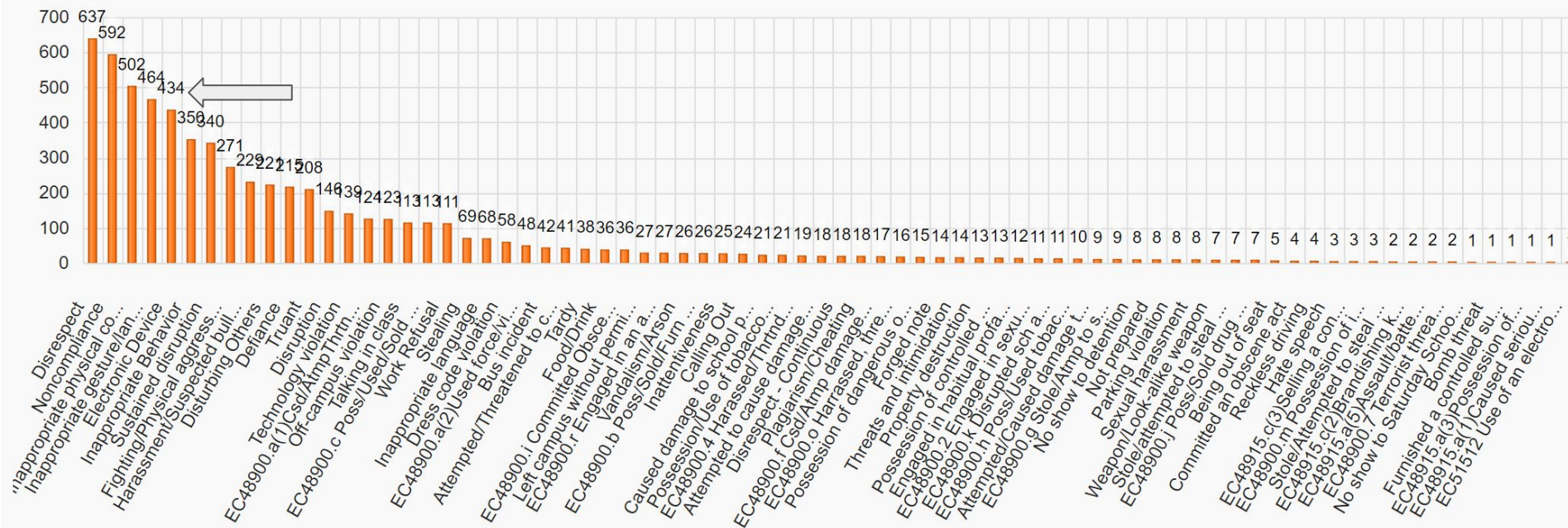

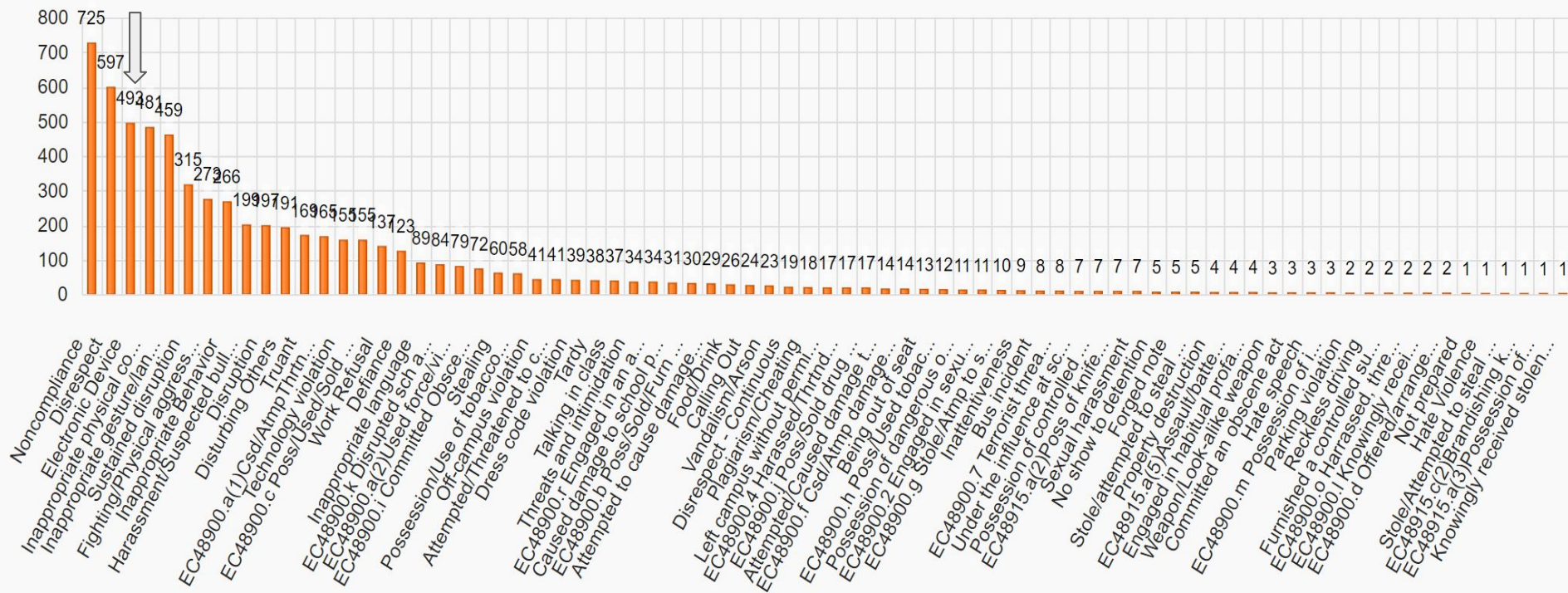
# 2016-2017 Assertive Discipline

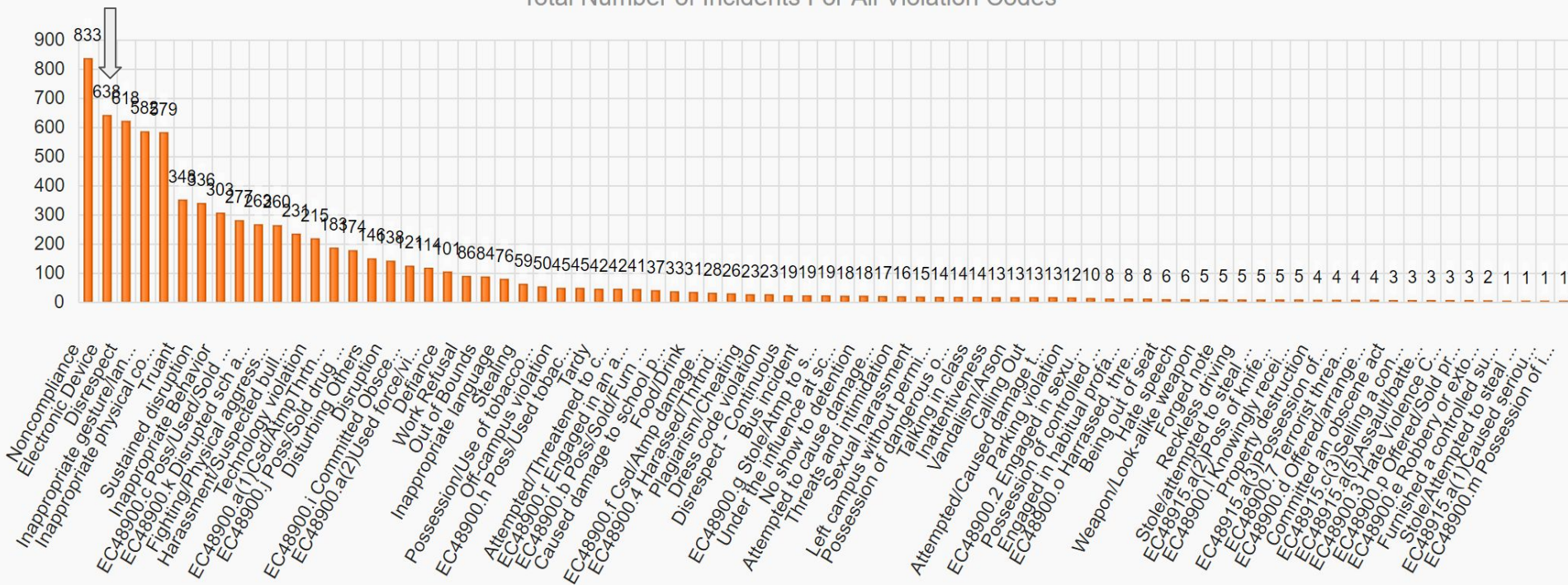
## Total Number of Incidents For All Violation Codes





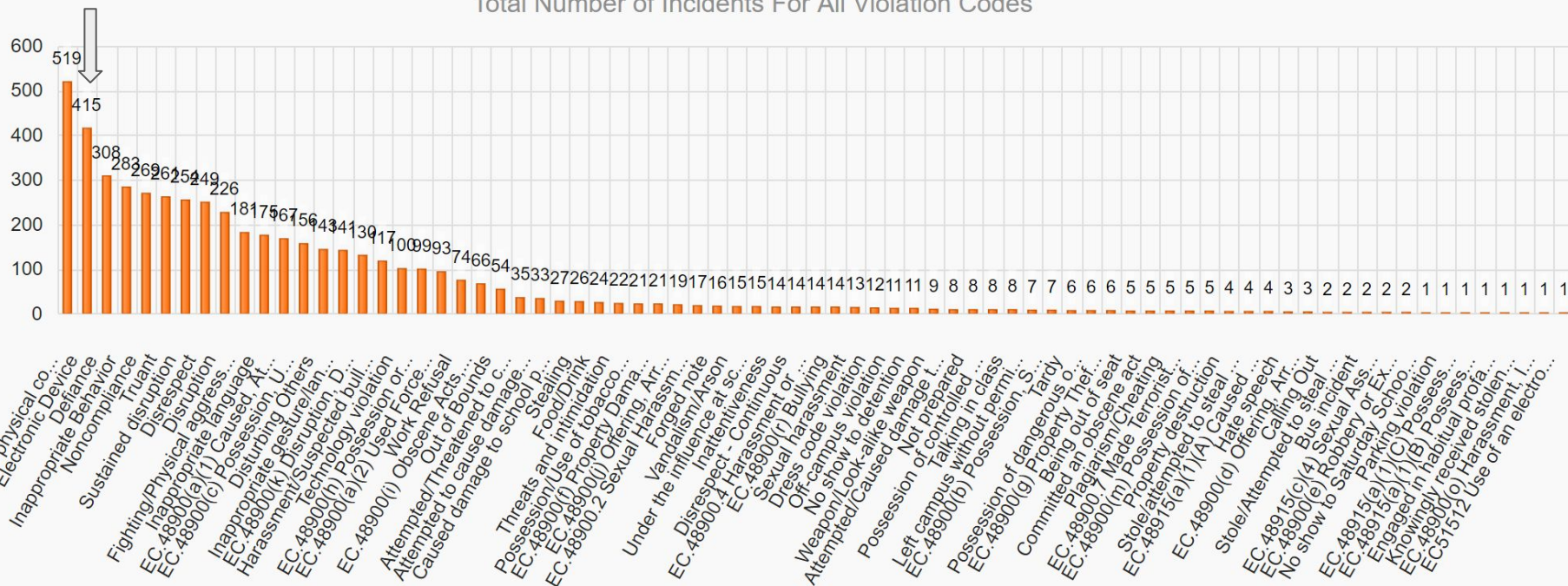

## **PRJUSD Cell Phone Survey**

**2143 Respondents (1263 Students, 691 Parents, 189 Teachers)**

**Would you be in favor of eliminating cell phone use during the school day (without teacher permission) in order to reduce or prevent videoing without permission, distractions, bullying and/or increase personal connectivity?**

Students- 90.7% no, 9.3% yes

Teachers- 91% yes, 9% no

Parents- 69.8% yes, 30.2% no

# Surrounding Schools/Districts

- Atascadero- MS students are not allowed to use cell phones during the school day. HS- non-instructional time use only.
- San Luis Coastal- HS- “May use device provided that it does not disrupt learning environment.”
- Lucia Mar- “The use of devices is restricted to non-class time.”
- Santa Maria Joint Union- CSBA recommendation.
- San Miguel- Has not adopted board policy but current contract does not allow cell phone use during school hours.

# Recommendation and Next Steps

- Students (9-12) may use cell phones, smart watches, pagers, or other mobile communication devices on campus during noninstructional time as long as the device is utilized in accordance with law and any rules that individual school sites may impose. The use of cellular devices for TK-8 students is restricted to before and after school time only.
- Update Exhibit 6163.4 to reflect new policy.
