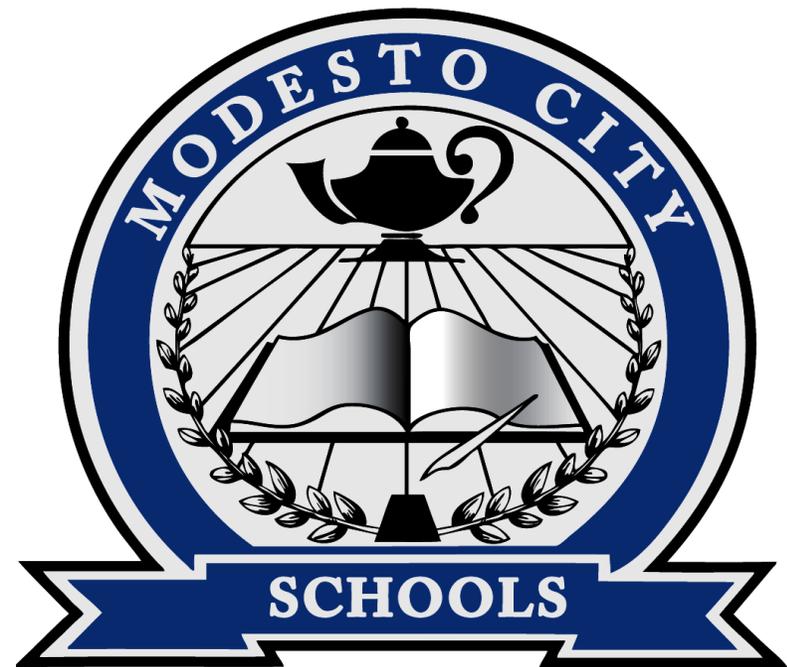

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District Goal Alignment

Goal One: Increase academic achievement and ensure equitable access to enable all students to attain college and career readiness

Goal Two: Ensure all employees have access to high quality professional development.

Goal Three: Provide a safe, welcoming, and respectful learning environment for every member of the school community while ensuring effective district-wide communication for students, staff, families, and community partners.

Goal Four: Ensure the District is fiscally and operationally sound.

Goal Five: Recruit, hire, train, and retain high quality staff.

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Fiscal Considerations

- COVID-19 economic impact will be far greater than the 2008 recession levels
- Governor Newsom estimates revenue loss of \$41.2 billion
 - 2008 early recession estimates were \$28 billion for comparison
- State's rainy day fund balance is \$18 billion
 - Only \$550 million available for education
- Budget picture won't be clear until August
- Predictions are revenue reductions in the -2% to -10% range

Summer Bond Projects

- **Five (5)** exterior paint/dry rot repair projects
 - Bret Harte, Fairview, Kirschen, Martone, Wilson
- **Four (4)** playground structure replacements
 - Robertson Road, Fremont, Burbank, Martone
- **Nine (9)** single access points of entry
 - Lakewood, Sonoma, Muir, Fremont, Burbank, Franklin, Mark Twain, Roosevelt, Shackelford
- **Nine (9)** School Site Master Plans for future additions/renovations

Summer District Projects

- Beyer JROTC Construction
- Transportation bus lift replacement
- Mark Twain corridor improvements – window replacement, ADA restroom upgrades, interior wall refinishing, storm drain improvements
- Exterior paint at Elliot, Beyer, District Office/Pearson
- Davis Cafeteria serving area modernization
- Asphalt seal or repair/replacement
 - Elliot, Downey, El Vista, Robertson Road



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Summer Feeding

Goal: provide the maximum amount of nutrition support to students as possible

- Will continue the current curbside program until “June 30th or until the expiration of the federally declared public health emergency, whichever is earlier”
- Awaiting federal & state guidance
- Transition to feeding in the parks
- Updates will be posted to the district website accordingly

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Summer School

MCS will offer a comprehensive summer school program

- All offerings done through Distance Learning
- 7-12 will focus on credit recovery
- K-6 will focus in English Language Arts and math
 - Computer based program
- SWUN Summer School at pilot sites
- Extended School Year (ESY) for students with disabilities



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Summer Technology Work

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Registration & Work Permits

- **Online enrollment system**
 - Designed to provide an easier option for our families who are comfortable with technology
 - Has worked out well during current state
 - New system will interface with PowerSchool
- **System identified so students can obtain work permits**
 - Digitized forms
 - Identified individual and email address to continue processing

Round-Ups & Orientations

- **Input Meeting on Friday, May 8 with Principal Leadership Team**
- **Focus is on Communication Plan**
 - **Beginning of summer letter to all returning and new enrollee students**
 - Send out by June 12
 - Will include:
 - 1st day of school (date / time)
 - Referring parents to school website for summer / July updates
 - 3rd wk of July summer letter re: Round-Up / Start of School info
 - Will NOT include office hours due to uncertainty
 - **July Communication**
 - District will notify site principals as to which plan “option” will be implemented
 - Information will include any updates on school structure / model (i.e., traditional, hybrid, or distance learning)

7-12 Round Up Options	
Option "A" / Status: <i>No Restrictions</i>	Normal round-up activities
Option "B" / Status: <i>Social distancing / shelter in place guidelines in effect</i>	8th, 10th-12th Returning: No round-up, will complete necessary activities the first day/week of school 7th, 9th, & New Students: 2-3 days of small group (following guidelines) to complete essential work (i.e., 1:1 device); will do "orientation" and related "welcome" activities the first day/week of school
TK-6 Round Up Options	
Option "A" / Status: <i>No Restrictions</i>	Normal round-up activities
Option "B" / Status: <i>Social distancing / shelter in place guidelines in effect</i>	No round-up; will complete necessary activities the first day/week of school
