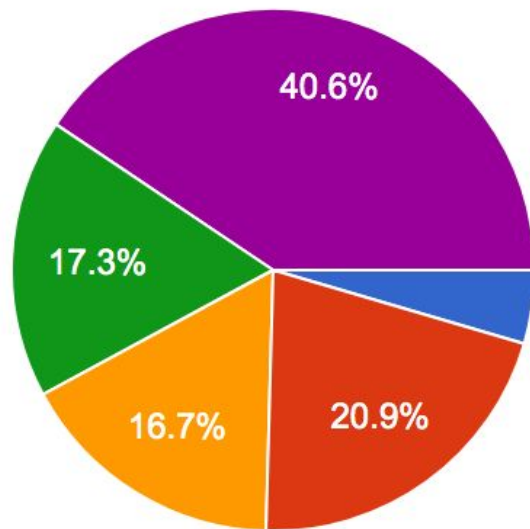

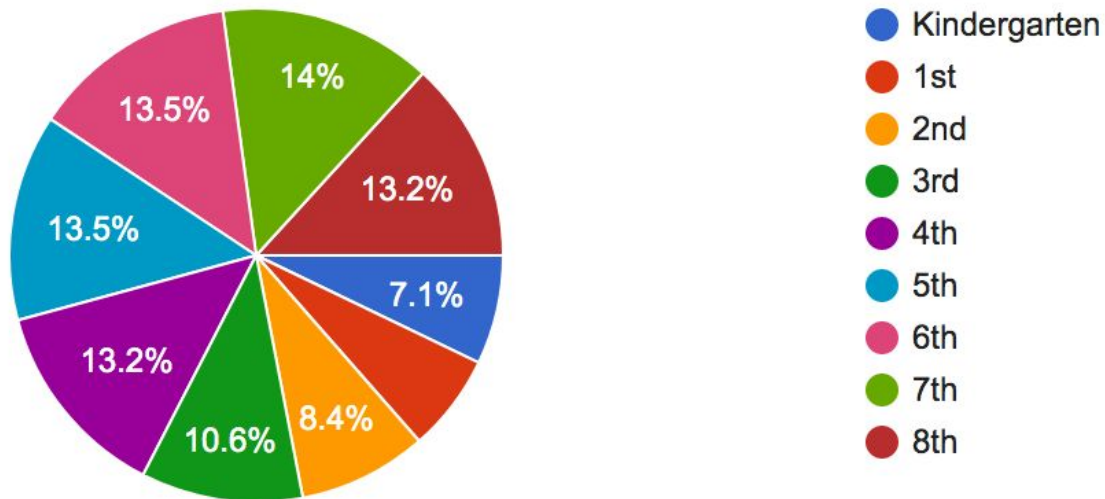

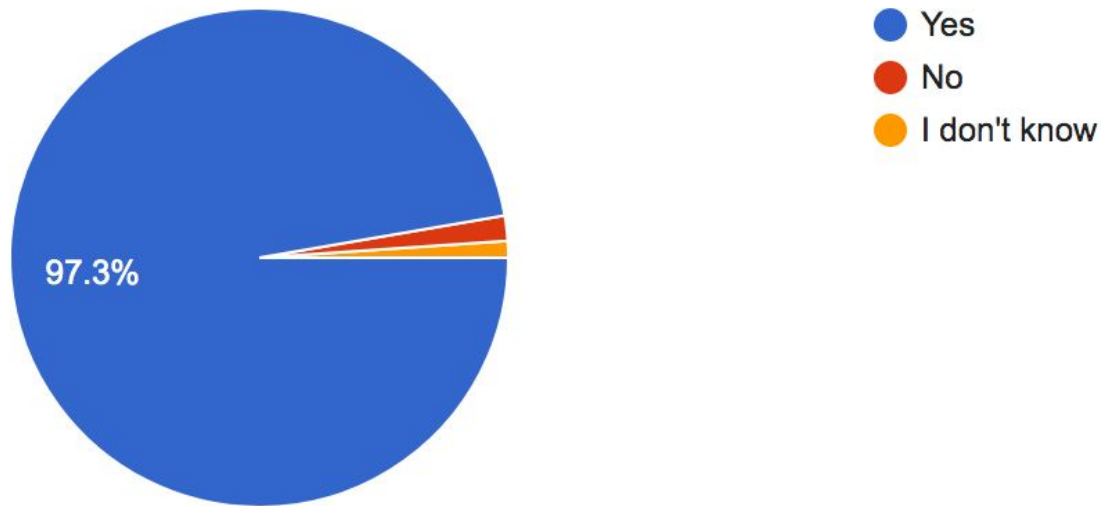

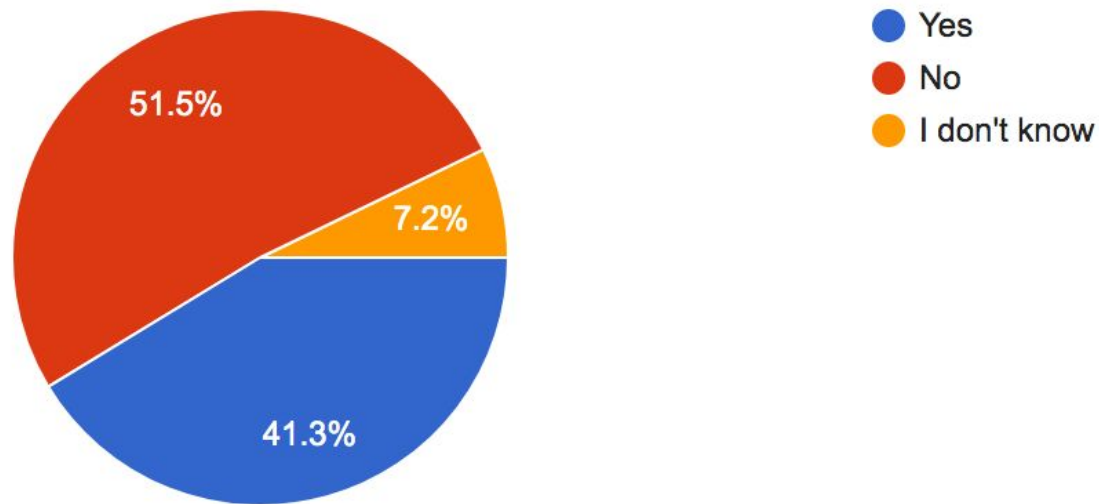
My student has been attending the classroom course connection regularly.

My student has been attending “office hours” with their teacher(s) regularly.

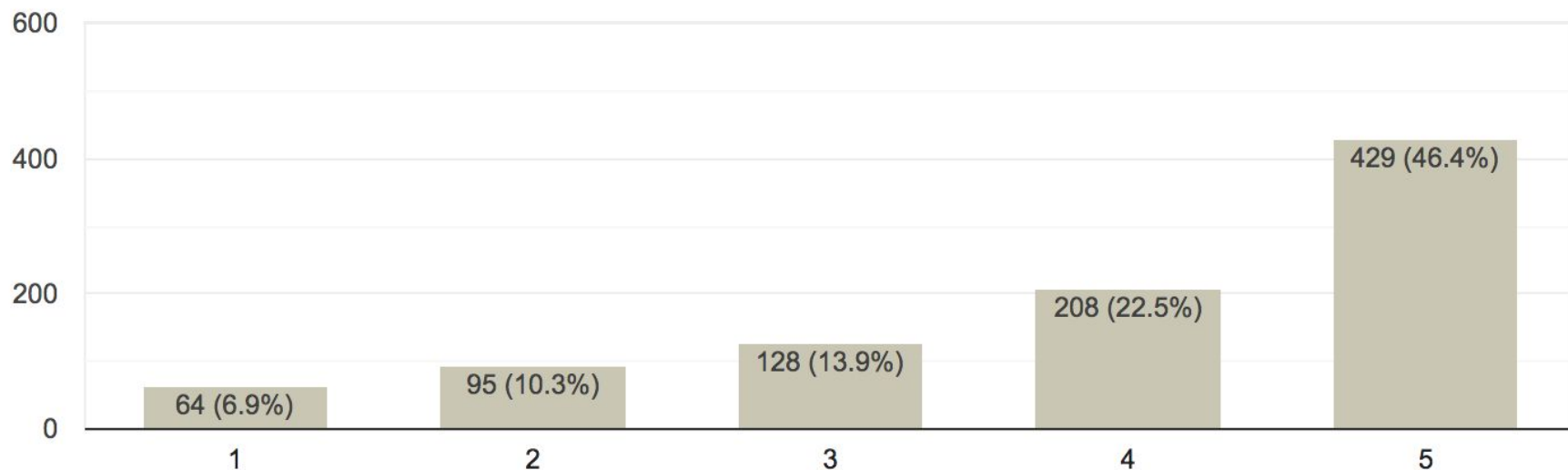

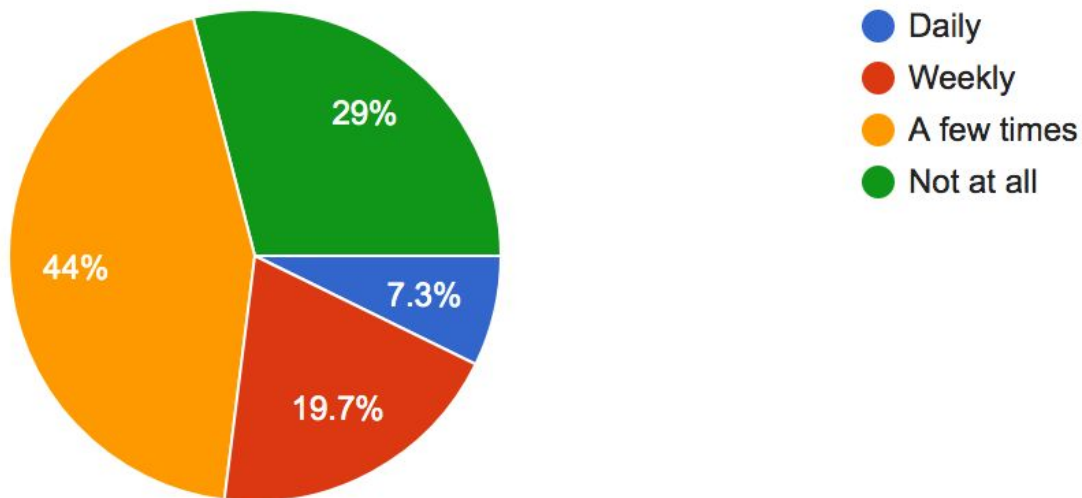

How often do you visit the District Remote Learning Website?

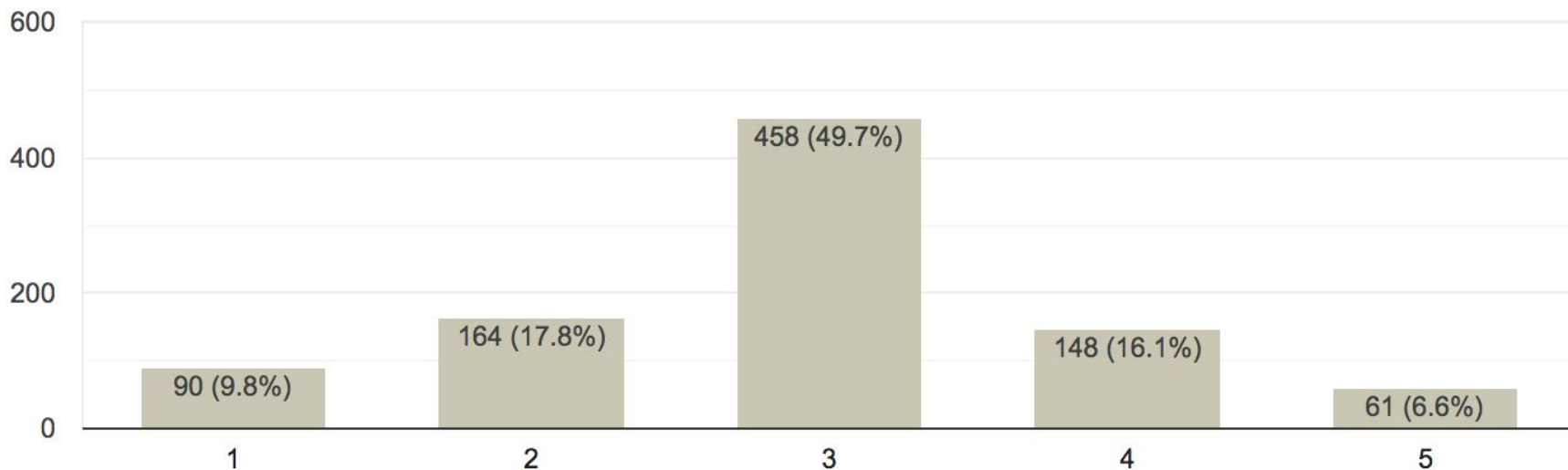
