<b>\$3.5B for Child Care Development Block Grant</b>	\$350M, allocated through state budget	Yes	Must be used to supplement payments to child care providers impacted by decreased enrollment or closures related to coronavirus, provide childcare to essential workers, . Must supplement, not supplant, state funds.	State proposes to use funds for the following: PPE and cleaning supplies for non-LEA providers that remained open during COVID-19 (\$50M), childcare for essential workers (\$50M), waived family fees

State's proposal restricts use of funds to "learning loss activities," including expansion of school day or school year, academic supports including devices and connectivity, school lunch, mental health, etc.
