Remote Learning Summary

- Phase 1- Remote learning website launched with regularly updated learning opportunities in every content area and grade level.
- Phase 2- SEL focused connections with students via Zoom/Google Meet and remote platforms introduced with academic content. Specialists and other support staff begin seeing individual and small groups of students.
- Phase 3- SEL focused connections continued with teacher-recorded asynchronous content and live daily office hours for targeted instruction and student feedback. Specialists and other support staff continue seeing individual and small groups of students.
