**RESOLUTION ORDERING CONSOLIDATED GOVERNING BOARD MEMBER BIENNIAL
ELECTION, SPECIFICATIONS OF THE
ELECTION ORDER, AND REQUEST FOR CONSOLIDATION**

WHEREAS, Section 5300 of the Education Code states that school district elections shall be governed by the Elections Code; and

WHEREAS, Section 1302 of the Elections Code and Section 5000 of the Education Code both allow for a governing board election to be held biennially on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year to fill the offices of governing board members whose terms expire on the first Friday of December next succeeding the election;

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED that, the County Superintendent of Schools of this county is hereby ordered to call an election for said purpose, and in accordance with the designations contained in the following specifications of the election order made under the authority of Education Code Sections 5304 and 5322;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Education Code Section 5340 and Elections Code Section 1302(b)(3), the officer conducting the election shall cause said election to be consolidated with governing board elections being held on the same day by the school or community college district having area in common with this district.

The election shall be held on Tuesday, **November 3, 2020**.

The purpose of the election is to elect **two** member(s) of the governing board for a full term ending **December 12, 2024**, for the following Trustee Area(s):

Area 2 and Area 5

Offices now held by the following members:

Lizeth Vega for Trustee Area 2 and Carolyn M. Wilson for Trustee Area 5



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IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, pursuant to Elections Code Section 13307, candidates requesting a Candidates Statement, limited to 200 words, printed and mailed to the voters, shall be required to pay the actual prorated cost thereof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT, pursuant to Education Code Section 5322, the clerk of the district is hereby directed to furnish copies of this Order to the County Superintendent of Schools and the officer conducting this election not less than 123 days prior to the date of the election.

The foregoing Resolution and Order was adopted and affirmed by the governing board of Alvord Unified School District of Riverside County, California, being the board authorized by law to make the designations contained therein, by a formal vote as follows:

**SUBJECT: Notice of Consolidation of Governing Board Elections and
Order of Election for November 3, 2020**

Dear Superintendent:

In accordance with California Education Code Section 5340, the County Superintendent of Schools is providing notice to the governing boards of school and community college districts that a consolidated election is required to be held on November 3, 2020.

Enclosed is a copy of the Order of Election, which also contains the Specifications of the Election Order and Request for Consolidation. Since you will need three copies of this order, an electronic copy will be forwarded to your office to simplify the process of customizing the document to meet the needs of your district.

Please route the three copies as indicated below:

1. Copy **with original signatures** to Registrar of Voters
2. Copy **with original signatures** to the Riverside County Office of Education - Attention: Sandra A. Guerrero, Board of Education
3. Copy for your district file

The copies submitted concurrently to the Riverside County Superintendent of Schools and the Registrar of Voters must be received at least 123 days prior to the election day of November 3, 2020. **Please submit a copy to RCOE not later than July 6, 2020.**

The Riverside County Registrar of Voters has prepared an election calendar for the governing board member election on November 3, 2020. Selected dates from this calendar are as follows:

June 26, 2020 (130 days prior to election)	CONSOLIDATION OF ELECTIONS Deadline for County Superintendent of Schools to notify governing boards, in writing, regarding the compulsory consolidation of school district elections.
July 3, 2020 (123 days prior to election)	SPECIFICATIONS OF ELECTION ORDER Last date for District governing boards to submit the <i>Order of Election Resolution with Specifications</i> concurrently to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• County Superintendent of Schools• Registrar of Voters


July 13, 2020 (113 days prior to election)	Earliest date for filing <i>Declaration of Candidacy</i> for governing board member.
August 7, 2020 (88 days prior to election)	Final date for filing <i>Declaration of Candidacy</i> for governing board member.
November 3, 2020 Election Day	
December 11, 2020 (2nd Friday in December following the election)	Beginning of term of office for newly elected board members. Oath of office must be executed prior to taking office.

Whenever a date prescribed by law falls on a weekend or holiday, such act may be performed on the next business day. (Elections Code 60; Government Code 6700, 6701)

NOTICE OF ELECTION GOVERNING BOARD ELECTIONS NOVEMBER 3, 2020

Pursuant to Education Code Sections 5000, 5324, 5325, and 5361, the Riverside County Superintendent of Schools hereby gives formal notice of the regular biennial governing board member elections to be held in the community college, elementary and unified school districts in Riverside County.

Said elections shall be held on the general election date of **November 3, 2020**.

Pursuant to the provision of Education Code Section 5340, the aforementioned elections are required to be consolidated when two or more school districts of any type are conducting governing board elections in the same territory, on the same date, with the elementary districts being the basic unit for said consolidation. All of the referenced school districts were notified, in writing, by the County Superintendent of Schools, at least 130 days prior to November 3, 2020, that a consolidated election is to be held.

EXECUTIVE ORDER N-64-20

WHEREAS on March 4, 2020, I proclaimed a State of Emergency to exist in California as a result of the threat of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS on November 3, 2020, California—like the other states of the United States—will hold a General Election, and Californians throughout the state will exercise their right to vote; and

WHEREAS it is unknown to what degree COVID-19 will pose a threat to public health in November, and California and its counties must begin taking action now—to procure supplies, secure polling places, enlist volunteers, and draw up plans, among other steps—to ensure that the November 3, 2020 General Election is held in a manner that is accessible, secure, and safe; and

WHEREAS to preserve public health in the face of the threat of COVID-19, and to ensure that the November election is accessible, secure, and safe, all Californians must be empowered to vote by mail, from the safety of their own homes; and

WHEREAS it is also essential to ensure that all Californians who may need access to in-person voting opportunities—including individuals with disabilities, individuals who speak languages other than English, individuals experiencing homelessness, and others who may find vote-by-mail less accessible than in-person voting—are able to access such opportunities and exercise their right to vote; and

WHEREAS the Secretary of State has been working with California elections officials, voting rights advocates, and other stakeholders to explore how best to implement procedures for the November election that will make in-person voting opportunities available, give county elections officials needed flexibility, and preserve public health; and

WHEREAS discussions concerning the November election have been informed, and should continue to be informed, by the ways in which existing California law—including, in particular, the California Voter's Choice Act—provide standards to ensure that, even in the context of an "all-mail ballot" election, voters are able to access in-person voting opportunities; and

WHEREAS work in partnership with the Legislature and the Secretary of State, guided by the standards in existing California law and the exigencies of the COVID-19 pandemic, will be essential to ensure that the November election is accessible, secure, and safe; and

WHEREAS confirming that every voter will be able to vote by mail in the November election will allow California and its counties to begin preparing for that election now—even as planning continues to determine how details of that election (including requirements concerning the availability of in-person voting opportunities) will be implemented; and

WHEREAS it is critical that counties have clarity regarding requirements for in-person voting opportunities and other details of the November election by no later than May 30, 2020, which may require a subsequent Executive Order; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of Government Code section 8571, I find that strict compliance with various statutes specified in this Order would prevent, hinder, or delay appropriate actions to prevent and mitigate the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor of the State of California, in accordance with the authority vested in me by the State Constitution and statutes of the State of California, and in particular, Government Code sections 8567, 8571, and 8627, do hereby issue the following Order to become effective immediately:


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1) Notwithstanding any limitation on the distribution of vote-by-mail ballots in Elections Code sections 1500 and 4000-4007, or any other provision of state law, each county elections officials shall transmit vote-by-mail ballots for the November 3, 2020 General Election to all voters who are, as of the last day on which vote-by-mail ballots may be transmitted to voters in connection with that election, registered to vote in that election. As set forth in this paragraph, every Californian who is eligible to vote in the November 3, 2020 General Election shall receive a vote-by-mail ballot.
- 2) Nothing in this Order shall be construed to limit the extent to which in-person voting opportunities are made available in connection with the November 3, 2020 General Election. It is the intent of this Order that my Administration continue to work with the Legislature and the Secretary of State to determine how requirements for in-person voting opportunities and other details of the November election will be implemented—guided by California's longstanding commitment to making its elections accessible, as enshrined in existing California law, while recognizing the exigencies of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 3) My Administration continues working in partnership with the Secretary of State and the Legislature on requirements for in-person voting opportunities and on how other details of the November election will be implemented. Nothing in this Order is intended, or shall be construed, to limit the enactment of legislation on that subject.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that as soon as hereafter possible, this Order be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State and that widespread publicity and notice be given of this Order.

This Order is not intended to, and does not, create any rights or benefits, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity, against the State of California, its agencies, departments, entities, officers, employees, or any other person.
