School Board Resolution

Resolution No. 20-064 in support of Black Lives Matter - June 10, 2020

WHEREAS, the names of our schools are **powerful symbols of our community values...**

RESOLVED, that the Berkeley Unified School Board **hereby commits to a renaming process** for Jefferson and Washington Elementary Schools, in accordance with our policy and in recognition of the fact that Jefferson, author of the Declaration of Independence and a Framers of the Constitution, was nonetheless an unrepentant slaveholder whose wealth was built on the labor of the enslaved, and who withheld his espoused values of liberty and equality from the hundreds of people of African descent he held and sold into bondage, whose descendants continue to suffer unbearable injustices in a country that has yet to live up to the promises of the Constitution and **Washington, to whose selfless service to a new nation this country is forever indebted, nonetheless profited from the enslaved labor of hundreds of human beings, and signed the 1793 Fugitive Slave Act and relentlessly pursued the many enslaved people who attempted to escape bondage;**

The Iowa Democratic Party's annual fall fundraiser has a new name.

The event will be held November 1, 2019. It will attract international attention, as it has in the past, due to all the Democratic presidential candidates who'll speak. It's been re-branded as the Liberty and Justice Celebration.

For decades, the annual event was named for Thomas Jefferson and Andrew Jackson, who are considered the founders of the Democratic Party. A few years ago Jefferson-Jackson Day Dinners in Iowa and other states were renamed after critics pointed out Jackson's policies towards Native Americans and that Jefferson owned slaves.

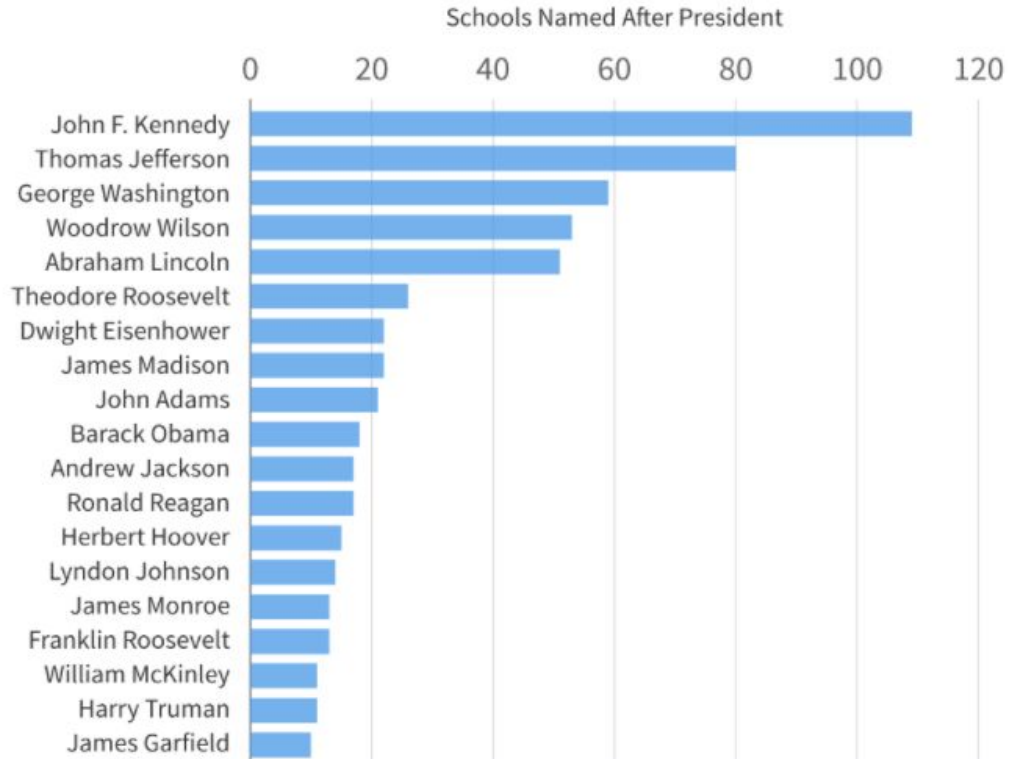

WEST BERKELEY, Jan 20.—There will be a petition presented at the meeting of the Board of Education tonight in Berkeley from residents of West Berkeley requesting that the name of the San Pablo school be changed from its present appellation to that of Washington School.

The reason to be given for the requested change is that the name of San Pablo is too commonplace and that there is a Columbus school here and in justice to history there should be a Washington School.

The question of changing the name of San Pablo School is not a new one by any means and it is likely that the change will be made tonight by the Board of Education as two of the members have already expressed themselves as in favor of the new name for the school.

By 1920, location-based school names gave way to names honoring Americans of note, as Berkeley established itself as a university town and as a possible state capital (1908), with names honoring historical figures, intellectuals, poets, inventors, naturalists, abolitionists. presidents.

By 2020, of the 20 school names, 6 are place names, 14 are honoring people; 3 are women and 4 people of color. The names of two assassinated presidents have been replaced by two assassinated civil rights leaders. The two remaining presidents are being reconsidered.

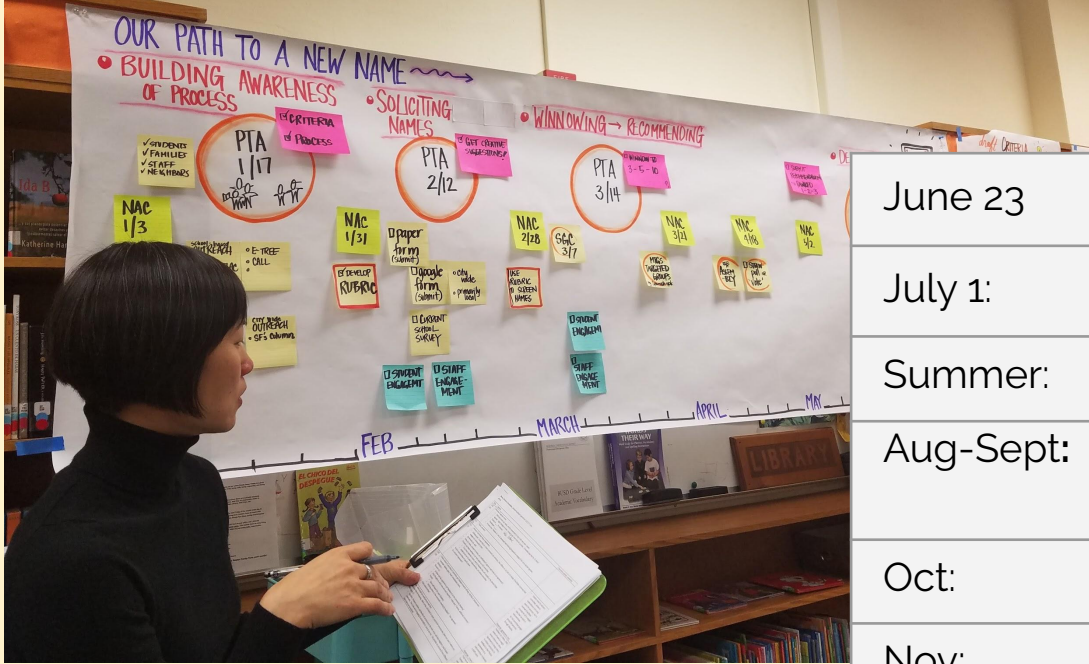

2017-18 Criteria for Name Selection

- **INSPIRING:** meaningful to school children
- **ENDURING:** likely to stand the test of time
- **OUR VALUES:** equity, inclusion, social justice, diversity, etc.
- **LOCAL CONNECTION:** ties to our community, history, or BUSD
- **TWI IDENTITY:** Spanish/English & multicultural mission of the school
- **EDUCATIONAL:** exemplifies excellence & right to public education.
- **UNDER REPRESENTED:** not a common type of BUSD school name
- **UNDER-RECOGNIZED:** not already widely known or used elsewhere
