Pillar #1: <u>Health and Hygiene</u>

Health and Safety Protocols:

- Stay at home if you are ill
- Daily temperature taking & wellness checks
- Wearing <u>Face coverings</u> is required at school
- Regular <u>hand washing</u> or sanitizing throughout the day
- Ongoing <u>health instruction</u> and trainings to students

Pillar #2: Face Coverings

- Face coverings are expected to be worn throughout the day. There may be a transition period as students become accustomed to this new routine.
- Instructions and expectations for using face coverings at school will be shared with families: <u>Face covering "How to"</u>
- Instruction for students about how to adjust, clean and reapply face coverings during the school day will be provided to reach full compliance.

Pillar #2: Face Coverings (continued)

- We will continue to follow the San Mateo County Health's guidance regarding types of face coverings <u>SM County Office of Ed Recovery Framework</u>
- Extra face coverings will be available for any students or staff needing them





Maintaining Staff and Student Health

- Identify the isolation location(s) for those identified with symptoms at each school site for secondary screening and waiting area
- Individuals with a temperature of 100.4 F (or higher) or those who are symptomatic will be sent home and must stay home until fever free for 72 hours without medication

Contact Tracing



- The Center for Disease Control (CDC) encourages the use of contact tracing to help keep communities safe and slow mitigation of disease
- ▶ Local health officials provide guidance and support to individuals within the community who test positive for COVID-19
- The SMFC Nursing Department will follow up on possible exposures with our District point-person who will follow recommended protocols provided by the CDC, SM County Health Department and SMCOE for contact tracing
