

GRADES/EVALUATION OF STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

The Board of Trustees believes that grades serve a valuable instructional purpose by helping students and parents/guardians understand performance expectations and identifying the student's areas of strength and those areas needing improvement. Parents/guardians and students have the right to receive course grades that represent an accurate evaluation of the student's achievement.

Teachers shall inform students and parents/guardians how student achievement will be evaluated in the classroom. A teacher shall base a student's grades on impartial, consistent observation of the quality of the student's work and their mastery of course content and district standards. Students shall have the opportunity to demonstrate this mastery through a variety of methods such as classroom participation, homework, tests, and portfolios.

The teacher of each course shall determine the student's grade. The grade assigned by the teacher shall not be changed by the Board or the Superintendent except as provided by law, Board policy, or administrative regulation. (Education Code 49066)

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Written report cards displaying students' grades in each subject or course shall be distributed to parents/guardians at the end of each grading period. Parents/guardians may request to meet with their child's teacher(s) to discuss the grades and strategies to improve their child's performance.

Whenever it becomes evident to a teacher that a student is in danger of failing a course, the teacher shall arrange a conference with the student's parent/guardian and/or indicate to the parent/guardian on a progress report or through other written communication that the student is in danger of failing. (Education Code 49067)

For each student in grades 9-12, the Superintendent or designee shall maintain a transcript recording the courses taken, the term that each course was taken, credits earned, final grades, and date of graduation.

Grades for Achievement

For grades 9-12, grades for achievement shall be reported for each grading period as follows:

A	Outstanding Achievement	4.0 grade points
B	Above Average Achievement	3.0 grade points
C	Average Achievement	2.0 grade points
D	Below Average Achievement	1.0 grade points
F	Little or No Achievement	0 grade points
I	Incomplete	0 grade points
P	Pass	0 grade points

An Incomplete shall be given only when a student's work is not finished because of illness or other excused absence. If not made up within six weeks, the Incomplete shall become an F.

Grades for IB/AP/honors courses

The district wishes to encourage students to take advanced placement, international baccalaureate and honors courses in academic subjects. Grades received in courses will be counted on the following scale:

A	Outstanding Achievement	5.0 grade points
B	Above Average Achievement	4.0 grade points
C	Average Achievement	3.0 grade points
D	Below Average Achievement	1.0 grade points
F	Little or No Achievement	0 grade points

Grades for College Courses

When the district has approved a student to receive district credit for coursework completed at a community college or four-year college, they shall receive the same letter grade as is granted by the college. For select community college courses, students will receive an additional grade point (in the same manner as described above for IB/AP/honors courses). Students who wish for their grades from the community college courses to qualify for this additional grade point must follow the guidelines in Alternative Credits Towards Graduation BP/AR 6146.11.

Pass/Fail Grading

The Superintendent or designee may identify courses or programs for which students may, with parent/guardian permission, elect to earn a Pass or Fail grade instead of a letter grade.

Teacher Aide and Office Aide will receive a Pass/Fail grade.

Students who receive a Pass grade shall acquire the appropriate semester units of credit for the course. The grade shall not be counted in determining class rank, honors list, or membership in the California Scholarship Federation. Students who receive a Fail grade shall not receive credit for taking the course. For athletic eligibility purposes, a Pass grade will equal a "C" grade or 2 grade points.

Repeating Classes

With the approval of the principal or designee, a student may repeat a course in order to raise the grade. Both grades received shall be entered on the student's transcript, but the student shall receive credit only once for taking the course.

The highest grade received shall be used in determining the student's overall grade point average (GPA).

Withdrawal from Classes

A student who drops a course during the first six weeks of the grading period may do so without any entry on their permanent record card. A student who drops a course after the first six weeks of the grading period shall receive an F grade on their permanent record, unless otherwise decided by the principal or designee because of extenuating circumstances.

The student and parent/guardian shall have a reasonable opportunity to explain the absences. (Education Code 49067)

If a student receives a failing grade because of excessive unexcused absences, the student's record shall specify that the grade was assigned because of excessive unexcused absences. (Education Code 49067)

Grades for a student in foster care shall not be lowered if the student is absent from school due to either of the following circumstances: (Education Code 49069.5)

1. A decision by a court or placement agency to change the student's placement, in which case the student's grades and credits shall be calculated as of the date the student left school
2. A verified court appearance or related court-ordered activity

Grade Point Average

The Superintendent or designee shall calculate each student's GPA using the grade points assigned to each letter grade in accordance with the scale described in the section "Grades for Achievement" above. The grade points for all applicable coursework shall be totaled and divided by the number of courses completed. When plus and minus designations are added to letter grades, they shall not be considered in determining GPA.
