We will develop and implement a district-wide assessment system aligned with the Common Core Standards to effectively analyze student performance data at more frequent intervals in order to improve instruction, close the Achievement Gap, and ensure that all students meet or exceed district standards.

CAASPP REPLACES STAR



- California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) replaces Student Testing and Reporting (STAR) System
- CAASPP system assesses different standards and skills, results from CASPP cannot be compared to STAR
- Baseline year for DJUSD and California

SYSTEM COMPONENTS



- **Smarter Balanced Assessment System**
 - **Online assessment in English Language Arts and Mathematics for students in 3rd – 8th grade and 11th grade**
 - **California Standards Tests in Science for students in 5th, 8th, and 10th grades**
 - **California Alternative Performance Assessment (CAPA)**

COMPUTER ADAPTIVE TESTS



- Testing system *selects questions* which are appropriately challenging for the student based on the student's answers to the previous questions
- Most students will answer about half of the questions correctly and half incorrectly
- The student is not scored on the basis of the number of correct answers, but rather is scored on the number of correct answers and the difficulty of the questions completed

PERFORMANCE TASKS



- Performance tasks are extended activities that measure a student's ability to integrate knowledge and skills across multiple standards
- Measure a student's depth of understanding, research skills and ability to do a complex analysis
- English Language Arts and Mathematics
- Classroom activity and then a subsequent assessment on computer

TECHNOLOGY PREPARATION



- Deployment of Wi-Fi
- Update of internet browser to ensure secure access to the testing environment
- Recurring testing of bandwidth
- Establishment of a system of technical support for teachers and administrators, including a clear chain of contact
- Cue cards for short cuts on Chromebooks

PREPARING STUDENTS, STAFF AND FAMILIES



- Common core lessons
- Professional growth to help teachers access tools and develop skills to deliver content that will prepare students for this new way of thinking and performing
- Teachers were given access to online practice tests
- Our parent community has received information about testing and SBAC practice tests through the Superintendent's Parent Advisory Committee, an assessment letter to parents in March, a *Faces and Focus* video episode, Facebook, parent broadcasts and on our [Spring Testing Website](#)

REPORTING RESULTS

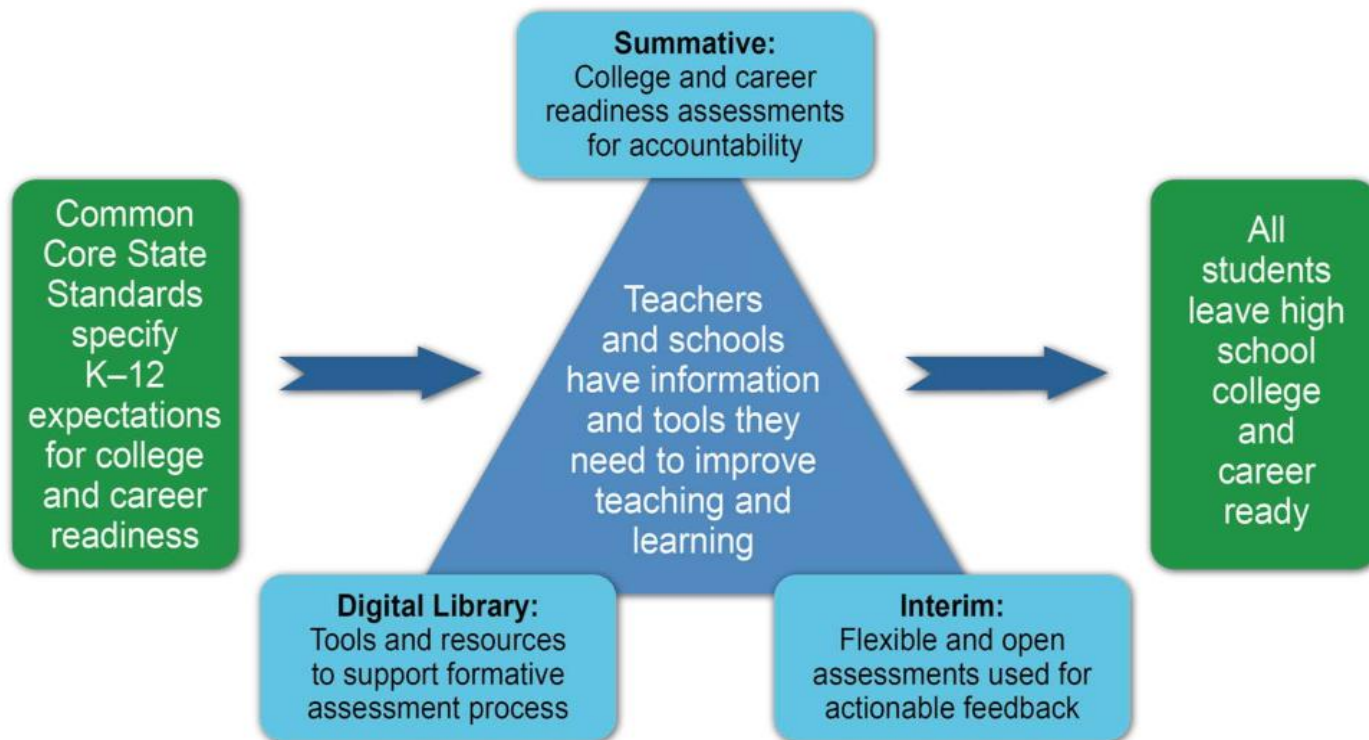


- Four to six weeks after testing
- Individual, School, and District Reports
- Range of 2000-3000
 - Exceeded the Standard
 - Met the Standard
 - Nearly Met the Standard
 - Has Not Met the Standard

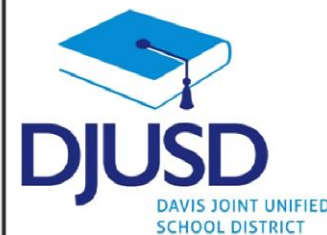
