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What is Senate Bill (SB) 328?

- The school-day for high schools, including high schools operated as charter schools, shall begin no earlier than 8:30 a.m.
- The school-day for middle schools, including middle schools operated as charter schools, shall begin no earlier than 8:00 a.m.



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SB 328 Definition

- For purposes of this section, “**school-day**” has the same meaning as defined by the school district for purposes of **calculating average daily attendance** in order to compute apportionments of state funding. This section **does not prohibit** a school district from offering classes or activities to a limited number of pupils **before** the start of the school-day that **do not generate** average daily attendance for purposes of computing any **apportionments** of state funding.
- This section shall be implemented by middle schools and high schools **no later than July 1, 2022**, or the date on which a school district’s respective collective bargaining agreement that is operative on January 1, 2020, expires, whichever is later.

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District Goal Alignment

- **Goal One:** Increase academic achievement and ensure **equitable access** to enable **all** students to attain college and career readiness
- **Goal Three:** Provide a safe, welcoming, and respectful learning environment for **every member** of the school community while **ensuring** effective district-wide **communication** for students, staff, families, and community partners

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Task Force Advisory Role

- **Assess and review** the implementation of SB 328
- **Advise** on needs, priorities, solicit feedback from staff, parents, students and the community to better provide **data** for decision makers in implementing systemic changes (**school start times**) required by **SB 328**
- Prepare a formalized documentation source which further **aligns** this implementation with the District's **goals and equity initiative**
