Types of Summer School Offerings

- Extended School Year (ESY) for students with disabilities (in-person)
- Extended learning and academic intervention (inperson)
- Academic enrichment (in-person)
- High school credit recovery (in-person)

Extended School Year for Students with Disabilities

Purpose:

The purpose of ESY is to provide specialized support to students in order to maintain their current skills levels and prevent regression due to a break in the school calendar.

Outcome:

The anticipated outcome would be that the time required to recoup any lost skills would be minimal.

Purpose:

The purpose of this program is to remediate the learning loss for students who were not engaged during distance learning or were struggling academically.

Outcome:

The anticipated outcome of the program will be to advance students' attainment of the grade level standards to facilitate success in the academic year 2021-2022.

Summer School Academic Intervention

Content and Structure:

- Program eligibility
- Mathematics and literacy
- Grades 1-8 and HS credit recovery
- 13-15 students per grade
- 6/28 7/23; M, T, Th, F from 8:30 12:00
- Two PD days 6/24-6/25
- Targeted intervention programs

Budget:

- Personnel: ≈ \$75,880
- Materials and supplies: ≈ \$25,000
- Total: \$ 100,880

Academic Enrichment

- Enrichment program based on Verizon Innovation Grant
- MS students
- Summer school is the extension of the existing afterschool enrichment program.



Intervention and Credit Recovery at ESS

- Flexible digital student options for summer school
- Self-paced
- Helps students earn recovery credits to meet their academic goals and to graduate
