\$9.6 million in One-Time Funding

## AB 86 - Background

Signed by Governor Newsom on March 5, 2021

Local Education Agencies (LEAs) will be notified of their total apportionment within 15 days

Provides:

- \$2 Billion for School Reopening

- \$4.6 Billion for expanded Learning Time and Academic Interventions

- Districts will receive funding in May 2021 and August 2021

## AB 86 - Requirement and Uses

### \$2 Billion for School Reopening

- Allocated in proportion to LCFF entitlement
- BUSD share \$3.1 million
- Must offer In-Person Instruction to students by April 1
- Reduced 1% for each day in-person instruction not provided by May 15
- Schools must provide continuous in-person instruction through the end of the scheduled school year
- No indication of when funds need to be spent

## AB 86 - Requirement and Uses

### \$4.6 Billion for Expanded Learning Time and Academic Interventions

- Allocated in proportion to LCFF entitlement and will also receive \$1,000 per homeless pupil enrolled as of the 2020-21
- BUSD share \$6.4 million
- At least 10% must be used to support paraprofessionals (retain or hire)
- Complete expenditure plan prior to June 4, 2021
- Funds must be expended by August 31, 2022
- At least 85% of funding must be spent to support in-person instruction
- Up to 15% may be used to support distant learning
- Uses include extending instructional learning time, accelerating progress to close learning gaps and additional academic services for pupils ( all used listed on the following slide)

## AB 86 - Requirement and Uses

### \$4.6 Billion for Expanded Learning Time and Academic Interventions

For the purpose of the Expanded Learning Grant, “prioritized pupils” include:

Foster and homeless youth , English learners, Low-income pupils, Special Education pupils, Pupils at risk of abuse, neglect, or exploitation, Disengaged pupils, Pupils who are below grade level (including those in danger of not graduating), Students lacking access to high-speed internet and computing devices
