

Staff Vaccinations and Reopening Timeline

Through a partnership with the City of Berkeley, vaccination appointments have been offered for all BUSD employees, beginning with those currently working in our on-campus cohorts and progressing through grade levels and departments.

- Arrival and Dismissal Times will be staggered to prevent the mixing of stable groups
- Parents, guardians, and other visitors will not be permitted on campus
- Face coverings are required for all students at all times, except in cases of documented medical exemptions
- Some teachers may work in Distance Learning, and these students could be assigned to substitute teacher

Students in Distance Learning will be regrouped and assigned to a Distance Learning teacher. This will be a different teacher.

Elementary Family Enrollment Form

We ask that all elementary families complete a binding enrollment form to choose in-person learning or distance learning.

The form is due back by Thursday at noon.

We acknowledge that this timing is very tight, and we appreciate your cooperation and understanding.

After four weeks, some limited number of adjustments to families' choices may be possible.

Elementary Campus Preparation Days

During the week prior to school reopening, we will shift to several days of a Wednesday Distance Learning schedule to permit teachers and school staff to complete their final on-campus preparations for in-person learning.

Final School Set-Up

Room Set-Up

- Six feet of social distancing between all individuals
- Some classes may be moved to larger instructional spaces
- If needed, adjustment to no less than four feet of spacing between student chairs (per CDPH)

Middle and High School Reopening

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Middle and High Schools are Different from Elementary Schools

Achieving a limited number of stable groups is still strongly encouraged by CDPH

But students move from class to class every period of the day

Maintaining 4-6 feet of social distancing is required

But Middle and High Schools class sizes are larger than Elementary schools

Classrooms at BHS are among the smallest in the district

Hallways are very crowded

Supporting In-Person Learning for 75% of students and Distance Learning for 25% of students is required

But middle and high school master schedules have dozens or even hundreds possible student schedules.

We continue to look at this hybrid model for our secondary schools.

- Distance Learning in the morning
- In-Person Instruction in the afternoon
- After-School Program and Activities

Children Get COVID-19 Less Frequently and Have Less Severe Disease

Children with COVID-19 Most Often Get It from a Household Contact

Transmission Among or from Students Is Uncommon

Low Risk of Transmission in Elementary Schools

Core strategies include: masks; physical distancing; small, stable groups; hand hygiene; ventilation; screening for symptoms or close contact; and asymptomatic testing.

Testing Students and Staff with Symptoms Can Prevent Outbreaks

Contact Tracing/Quarantines

We urge our families to recognize:

- All students will be expected to wear face coverings.
- Contact Tracing, Isolation and Quarantine procedures will be strictly enforced, and this could lead to disruption for individual students, classes, or even entire schools.
- All families are expected to confirm that their children are free of COVID symptoms every day.
- Students should remain at home if they are sick or have COVID symptoms.
- All visitors to school campuses and classrooms are prohibited, except for a few limited volunteer roles.
- Substitute staffing will continue be highly limited.

The pandemic is not over, and we'll need each other to stay safe!

Patience, kindness, and cooperation will be important for all of us.

The Fall of 2021

For the Fall, all families, K-12, should expect their children to be on campus five full days per week.

Special arrangements for families who request Distance Learning will be developed.
