Elementary Reopening

TK-5 have both started in the Hybrid Model

Speech and Resource Services continue to be provided through Distance Learning at this time

CDC and CDPH have changed their distancing guidelines and San Mateo County Public Health is expected to change their distancing guidelines next week

Based on the probable change to SMPH distancing guidelines, the District is beginning the necessary steps to increase in-person time for students in the Elementary Hybrid Model

District response to new distancing guidelines is a process and takes planning, collaboration, Board action, negotiation and County approval.

Middle School Reopening

Due to enrollment - Able to do 4 days on campus, rather than the A/B Paired Day

Phased approach can be faster than previously expected

Phase 3 Minimum 2 weeks	May 17-27	Yellow Tier	2 Groups of 15 Students 90 Total Contacts Per Week

Phase 3 <i>Minimum 2 weeks</i>	May 3 - May 14	Yellow Tier	1 Group of 15 Students Up to 90 Total Contacts Per Week
Phase 4	May 17 to last day of school	Yellow Tier	1 Group of 15 Students Up to 210 Total Contacts Per Week

Other Programming

Learning Hubs for Elementary and MS continue and have been increased:

- 35 learning hub classes serving more than 420 students
- Planning to open 5 additional hub classes after spring break

Academic Support Cohorts continue at Middle School

Enrichment Opportunities are beginning at Middle School

- Sports - Some enrichment sports activities will also be starting after spring break

Process for changes between Hybrid / Distance Learning

Guidance for Promotion Ceremonies

Outdoor Live Events with Assigned Seats and Controlled Mixing (e.g., sports and live performances)* Indoor guidance forthcoming

Current: • Open with modifications • Permanent venues with live audiences outdoors only • Capacity must be limited to 20% • Reservations required • Assigned seating only • In-seat concessions only (no concourse sales) • Regional attendees only (within 120 miles)

Effective April 1, 2021: • Max 33%, includes suites with 25% occupancy per suite • Weekly worker testing program • In-state visitors only, check for current CDPH Travel Advisory in effect

Fall Planning

The goal is to return as normal in the Fall of 2021-2022.

The usual Fall Plans Survey is going out after Spring Break.

There is no requirement to continue any Distance Learning, however, there have been some individual requests for DL so...there will be a question on the survey asking whether your child will need Full Time Distance Learning for the 2021-2022 school year.

"Will your student require a FTDL option for the 21-22 school year and will not return on campus for the year.'
