From there Dr. Young turned it over to Dr. Beatson to provide the update on In-Person Learning and how the first week went for our TK - 2 grade students. Dr. Beatson also invited all of the elementary principals to provide input on how it went. Thank you to Principals Harley, Slater, Moore and Buck for your leadership in the process. They in turn thanked everyone behind the scenes that made sure this went smoothly from their Office Managers, Office Techs, Maintenance, the District Office people, Safety, Technology, Food Services, and our parents for their patience, grace, and their understanding of our process. Thank you for being true "Partners in Education". An in-person spot was offered to everyone and the ultimate decision was by the parents and families to accept one or not. President Zada thanked and applauded everyone for making this pronominal job happen! Trustee Ferrucci shared that she drove around and it was great to see.
