RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE PASO ROBLES JOINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT INITIATING A PROPOSAL TO THE SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY COMMITTEE ON SCHOOL DISTRICT ORGANIZATION FOR THE ADOPTION OF BY-TRUSTEE-AREA ELECTIONS

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (“Board”) of the Paso Robles Joint Unified School District (“District”) is elected under an “at-large” election system where trustees are elected by voters of the entire District;

WHEREAS, on February 26, 2019, the Board adopted Resolution #19-15 (attached hereto as Exhibit A), signaling its intent to transition to by-trustee area elections beginning in 2022 utilizing data from the 2020 Census and to take such steps as are necessary to make that transition;

WHEREAS, on April 27, 2021, the Board adopted Resolution #21-22 (attached hereto as Exhibit B), reaffirming its intent to transition to “by-trustee-area” elections, where each trustee must reside within the designated trustee-area boundary and is elected only by the voters in that trustee area;

WHEREAS, Resolution #21-22 stated that due to COVID-19 related delays to the 2020 Census, the Board determined to move forward with creating trustee areas based upon data from the 2010 Census pursuant to the process provided by the Elections Code and Education Code;

WHEREAS, Cooperative Strategies (“Demographer”) was retained to prepare several by-trustee-area election system map options for the Board and public’s consideration;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code, section 10010, subdivision (a)(1), the Board held pre-map public hearings on April 27, 2021 and May 11, 2021, to consider community input and comment regarding potential trustee-area boundaries;

WHEREAS, in developing the Trustee Areas, the Board considered the following: each area shall contain nearly equal number of inhabitants; boundaries shall follow man-made and natural geographic features, as much as possible; areas shall be drawn to comply with the Federal Voting Rights Act; areas shall respect incumbency, if possible; areas shall be compact and contiguous, as much as possible; other local considerations, such as school boundaries, locations of school sites, etcetera; areas shall respect communities of interest, as much as possible.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code, section 10010, subdivision (a)(2), the Board published four (4) trustee-area maps on May 18, 2021, and held map review public hearings on May 25, 2021 and June 8, 2021, to gather public input on the proposed trustee-area maps and sequence of elections;

WHEREAS, Education Code sections 5019 and 5030 authorize the San Luis Obispo County Committee on School District Organization (“County Committee”), upon application from

a school district's governing board, to change the method of election in a school district under its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, Education Code section 5020 requires the County Committee's resolution of approval to be submitted to the electorate for its approval;

WHEREAS, Education Code sections 33050-33053 authorize the State Board of Education to waive this voter approval requirement, which could reduce the costs associated with the proposed change to trustee-area elections; and

WHEREAS, on April 27, 2021, the Board adopted Resolution #21-23 (attached hereto as Exhibit C), authorizing the Superintendent to seek a waiver of the Education Code section 5020's election requirement from the State Board of Education.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Trustees of the Paso Robles Joint Unified School District hereby resolves as follows:

1. The above recitals are correct and true.
2. The Board hereby approves and recommends the adoption of by-trustee area elections.
3. The Board hereby adopts the trustee-area map identified as Scenario # _____, attached as Exhibit D.
4. The Board hereby proposes that:
 - a. Trustee areas _____, _____, and _____ be scheduled for election in 2022; and
 - b. Trustee areas _____, _____, and _____ be scheduled for election in 2024.
5. The District Superintendent or designee is hereby authorized and directed to send a copy of this Resolution to the County Committee, and to work with the County Committee and the County Election's Office to conduct all legally required hearings and other acts necessary so that trustee-area elections can be implemented in the election cycles scheduled in 2020 and 2022.

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE PASO
ROBLES JOINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT APPROVING
AUTHORIZATION TO INITIATE A TRANSITION TO A BY-
TRUSTEE AREA ELECTION SYSTEM COMMENCING WITH THE
2022 GOVERNING BOARD ELECTION**

WHEREAS, California Education Code sections 5019 and 5030 authorize the San Luis Obispo County Committee on School District Organization ("County Committee"), upon application of a school district's governing board, to change the method of election of governing board members in a school district under its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA") disfavors the use of an "at-large" election system for governing board members of a school district if the "at-large" elections may impair the ability of a protected class to elect candidates of its choice or its ability to influence the outcome of an election;

WHEREAS, Board members of the Paso Robles Joint Unified School District ("District") are currently elected using on "at-large" election system (i.e., election system in which registered voters of the entire jurisdiction elect candidates to the governing board);

WHEREAS, it is considered the view of the Board that starting with the 2022 Board elections, and with the benefit of then-updated federal decennial Census data released in 2021, the public interest may be better served by election of its Board members using a "by-trustee area" election system (i.e., elections in which one candidate residing in each trustee area is elected by only the registered voters in that particular trustee area);

WHEREAS, the adoption of "by-trustee area" elections will not affect the terms of any Board members serving or elected during this transition, each of whom will serve out his or her full term; and

WHEREAS, the Board, cognizant of its need for fiscal responsibility, desires to implement this change in the manner of electing Board members in a cost effective and efficient manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board hereby resolves, orders and determines as follows:

1. The above recitals are true and correct;
2. Trustee area boundary lines shall be developed based on the most updated federal decennial census data following its release in 2021 to provide for "by-trustee areas" elections commencing in 2022;
3. By this resolution and pursuant to Education Code sections 5019, 5030 and other applicable provisions of law, the Board directs District staff to transmit this resolution to the County Committee to apply to have the County Committee adopt a change in the method of electing

members of the board from "at-large elections to "by-trustee area" elections commencing with the 2022 Board elections;

4. Before submitting a final proposal to the County Committee for trustee area maps using the federal census data, multiple public hearings in accordance with Elections Code section 10010 shall be scheduled to obtain public input on the draft proposals;
5. The Board shall apply to the County Committee for establishment of trustee areas pursuant to Education Code section 5019 in a timely manner to have the 2022 elections for the Board conducted within the new trustee areas;
6. The Superintendent, or designee, is hereby directed to prepare additional Board resolutions and documents, as needed, to meet all applicable legal requirements in a timely manner, and to seek a waiver from the State Board of Education of the election requirement imposed by Education Code section 5020;
7. The Superintendent, or designee, shall consult with legal counsel to take all steps necessary to implement and give effect to this resolution; and
8. The foregoing resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.





Resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Paso Robles Joint Unified School District Resolution Authorizing to Re-Initiate a Transition to a By-Trustee Area Election System Commencing with the 2022 Governing Board Election

WHEREAS, California Education Code sections 5019 and 5030 authorize the San Luis Obispo County Committee on School District Organization ("County Committee"), upon application of a school district's Governing Board, to change the method of election of governing board members in a school district under its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA") disfavors the use of an "at-large" election system for governing board members of a school district if the "at-large" election system may impair the ability of a protected class to elect candidates of its choice or its ability to influence the outcome of an election;

WHEREAS, board members of the Paso Robles Joint Unified School District ("District") are currently elected using an "at-large" election system (i.e., election system in which registered voters of the entire jurisdiction elect candidates to the Governing Board);

WHEREAS, the Board desires to promote meaningful voter involvement in the election of Board members and increase the ability of candidates to seek elected office;

WHEREAS, it is the considered view of the Board that the public interest will be better served by election of its board members using a "by-trustee area" election system (i.e., elections in which one candidate residing in each trustee area is elected by only the registered voters in that particular trustee area);

WHEREAS, the boundaries for trustee areas in a by-trustee area election system are established based on population counts and demographics from the most recent United States' census;

WHEREAS, on February 26, 2019, the Board adopted Resolution No. 19-15, a Resolution Approving Authorization to Initiate a Transition to a By-Trustee Area Election System Commencing with the 2022 Governing Board Election;

WHEREAS, the United States' census count occurs every ten (10) years with the last census count occurring in 2020 ("2020 Census");

WHEREAS, as provided in Resolution No. 19-15, the Board intended to wait until the release of the 2020 Census data, scheduled for March 2021, and then immediately begin the transition process;

WHEREAS, due to COVID-19 pandemic-related delays, the 2020 Census data is not expected to be made available to state and local agencies until September

30, 2021 or later, which is a substantial delay from the original due date of March 31, 2021;

WHEREAS, due to this significant delay, the potential for further delay, and the tight timelines to complete the process in time for the 2022 elections, the Board has concerns about continuing to delay the process until the 2020 Census data is released;

WHEREAS, the Board aspires to promote a robust public input process, and believes that it is now in the best interest of the District not to wait until the release of the 2020 Census data, but to move forward immediately to transition to by-trustee area elections using the 2010 Census data pursuant to the process provided in the Elections Code and Education Code;

WHEREAS, the Board will hold a minimum of two public hearings prior to developing proposed trustee-area boundary maps;

WHEREAS, the District will hold a minimum of two additional public hearings to seek public input on the proposed trustee area maps developed with assistance from a demographer;

WHEREAS, the District will hold an additional public hearing before adopting a trustee-area map and submitting it to the County Committee for consideration;

WHEREAS, Education Code sections 5019 and 5030 authorize the County Committee, upon application of the District Board, to change the method of election of the Board from at-large to by-trustee area;

WHEREAS, if the County Committee approves this request to change the method of electing trustees, Education Code section 5020 requires the County Committee's resolution of approval to be submitted to the electorate for its approval;

WHEREAS, in the alternative, the District may seek a waiver of this voter approval requirement from the State Board of Education;

WHEREAS, once the transition process is complete, and the 2020 Census data is released, the District will then review the new Census data as required by Education Code section 5019.5, and make any necessary adjustments to ensure appropriate population balance;

WHEREAS, the adoption of "by-trustee area" elections will not affect the terms of any board members serving or elected during this transition, each of whom will serve out his or her full term.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board hereby resolves, orders and determines as follows:

1. The above recitals are true and correct;

2. The District shall immediately commence the process of transitioning to by-trustee area elections, in full compliance with all appropriate procedures and policies provided in law, including but not limited to Education Code sections 5019, 5030, and 33050, et seq., and Elections Code sections 10010 and 14025, et seq..
3. Once the transition process is completed, and the 2020 Census data is made available to the District, the Board directs staff to review the new Census data pursuant to Education Code sections 5019, 5030 and other applicable provisions of law, to determine whether adjustments to the adopted trustee area map are required.
4. The Superintendent, or designee, is hereby directed to prepare additional Board resolutions and documents, as needed, to meet all applicable legal requirements in a timely manner, and to seek a waiver from the State Board of Education of the election requirement imposed by Education Code section 5020;
5. The Superintendent, or designee, shall consult with legal counsel to take all steps necessary to implement and give effect to this resolution; and
6. The foregoing resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Resolution of the Board of Trustees of the Paso Robles Joint Unified School District Resolution Authorizing the District to Seek a Waiver from the State Board of Education regarding Electorate Approval of the Proposed Change from At-Large to By-Trustee Board Elections

WHEREAS, the Board of Education ("Board") of the Paso Robles Joint Unified School District ("District") is elected "at-large," meaning that each Board member is elected by voters of the entire District;

WHEREAS, on April 27, 2021, the Board will consider adopting Resolution No. 21-22, declaring its intent to re-initiate transition from at-large to by-trustee area Board elections;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code, section 10010, subdivision (a)(1), the Board will hold two public hearings to gather public input regarding potential trustee-area boundaries;

WHEREAS, the District, with assistance from a demographer, will hold a minimum of two additional public hearings to seek public input on the proposed trustee area maps developed and on the proposed sequence of elections;

WHEREAS, California Education Code sections 5019 and 5030 authorize the San Luis Obispo County Committee on School District Organization ("County Committee"), upon application of a school district's Governing Board, to change the method of election of the Board from at-large to by-trustee area;

WHEREAS, if the County Committee approves this request to change the method of electing Board members, Education Code section 5020 requires the County Committee's resolution of approval to be submitted to the electorate for its approval;

WHEREAS, an election to approve the change in voting methods will result in a cost to the District, and Education Code sections 33050-33053 authorize the State Board of Education to waive this voter approval requirement, which could reduce the cost and expedite the timeline for implementation of the by-trustee area elections;

WHEREAS, in light of the above, the Board wishes to request that the State Board of Education waive the election requirement set forth in the Education Code;

WHEREAS, on April 27, 2021, the Board held a public hearing on the proposed waiver application to solicit input from the public and the District's stakeholders;

WHEREAS, the District properly posted a timely notice of the public hearing in The Tribune newspaper and at various sites within the District; and

WHEREAS, the District complied with the notice and consulting requirements set forth in Education Code sections 33050, *et seq.*

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board hereby resolves, orders and determines as follows:

1. The Board hereby authorizes the Superintendent/Designee to seek a full waiver of Education Code Section 5020, and partial waivers of Education Code Sections 5019, 5021, and 5030 as set forth in Exhibit A, or as otherwise required by the State Board of Education, to effectuate the District's goal of moving to a by-trustee area elections system without electorate approval.
2. The District Superintendent/designee are hereby authorized and directed to take any other actions necessary to effectuate the purposes of this resolution.

EXHIBIT A

California Education Code Sections Proposed to be Waived

Request to waive California Education Code Section 5020, and portions of sections 5019, 5021, and 5030, that require a districtwide election. Language proposed to be waived is bracketed and in italics below:

§ 5019. Trustee areas and size of school district governing boards; powers of county committee; proposal and hearing

(a) Except in a school district governed by a board of education provided for in the charter of a city or city and county, in any school district or community college district, the county committee on school district organization may establish trustee areas, rearrange the boundaries of trustee areas, abolish trustee areas, and increase to seven or decrease to five the number of members of the governing board, or adopt one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members specified in Section 5030.

(b) The county committee on school district organization may establish or abolish a common governing board for a high school district and an elementary school district within the boundaries of the high school district. The resolution of the county committee on school district organization approving the establishment or abolition of a common governing board shall be presented to the electors of the school districts as specified in Section 5020.

(c) (1) A proposal to make the changes described in subdivision (a) or (b) may be initiated by the county committee on school district organization or made to the county committee on school district organization either by a petition signed by 5 percent or 50, whichever is less, of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 2,500 or fewer qualified registered voters, by 3 percent or 100, whichever is less, of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 2,501 to 10,000 qualified registered voters, by 1 percent or 250, whichever is less, of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 10,001 to 50,000 qualified registered voters, by 500 or more of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 50,001 to 100,000 qualified registered voters, by 750 or more of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 100,001 to 250,000 qualified registered voters, or by 1,000 or more of the qualified registered voters residing in a district in which there are 250,001 or more qualified registered voters or by resolution of the governing board of the district. For this purpose, the necessary signatures for a petition shall be obtained within a period of 180 days before the submission of the petition to the county committee on school district organization and the number of qualified registered voters in the district shall be determined pursuant to the most recent

report submitted by the county elections official to the Secretary of State under Section 2187 of the Elections Code.

(2) When a proposal is made pursuant to paragraph (1), the county committee on school district organization shall call and conduct at least one hearing in the district on the matter. At the conclusion of the hearing, the county committee on school district organization shall approve or disapprove the proposal.

(d) If the county committee on school district organization approves pursuant to subdivision (a) [the rearrangement of] the boundaries of trustee areas for a particular district, then the [rearrangement of the] trustee areas shall be effectuated for the next district election occurring at least 120 days after [its] approval [, unless at least 5 percent of the registered voters of the district sign a petition requesting an election on the proposed rearrangement of trustee area boundaries. The petition for an election shall be submitted to the county elections official within 60 days of the proposal's adoption by the county committee on school district organization. If the qualified registered voters approve pursuant to subdivision (b) or (c) the rearrangement of the boundaries to the trustee areas for a particular district, the rearrangement of the trustee areas shall be effective for the next district election occurring at least 120 days after its approval by the voters].

[§ 5020. Presentation of proposal to electors

(a) The resolution of the county committee approving a proposal to establish or abolish trustee areas, to adopt one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members specified in Section 5030, or to increase or decrease the number of members of the governing board shall constitute an order of election, and the proposal shall be presented to the electors of the district not later than the next succeeding election for members of the governing board.

(b) If a petition requesting an election on a proposal to rearrange trustee area boundaries is filed, containing at least 5 percent of the signatures of the district's registered voters as determined by the elections official, the proposal shall be presented to the electors of the district, at the next succeeding election for the members of the governing board, at the next succeeding statewide primary or general election, or at the next succeeding regularly scheduled election at which the electors of the district are otherwise entitled to vote, provided that there is sufficient time to place the issue on the ballot

(c) If a petition requesting an election on a proposal to establish or abolish trustee areas, to increase or decrease the number of members of the board, or to adopt one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members specified in Section 5030 is filed, containing at least 10 percent of the signatures of the district's registered voters as determined by the elections official, the proposal shall be presented to the electors of the district, at the next succeeding election for the members of the governing board, at the next succeeding statewide primary or general election, or at the next succeeding regularly scheduled election at which the electors of the district are otherwise entitled to vote, provided that there is sufficient time to place the issue on the ballot. Before the proposal is

presented to the electors, the county committee on school district organization may call and conduct one or more public hearings on the proposal.

(d) The resolution of the county committee approving a proposal to establish or abolish a common governing board for a high school and an elementary school district within the boundaries of the high school district shall constitute an order of election. The proposal shall be presented to the electors of the district at the next succeeding statewide primary or general election, or at the next succeeding regularly scheduled election at which the electors of the district are otherwise entitled to vote, provided that there is sufficient time to place the issue on the ballot.

(e) For each proposal there shall be a separate proposition on the ballot. The ballot shall contain the following words:

"For the establishment (or abolition or rearrangement) of trustee areas in _ (insert name) School District --Yes" and "For the establishment (or abolition or rearrangement) of trustee areas in ____ (insert name) School District--No."

"For increasing the number of members of the governing board of _ (insert name) School District from five to seven--Yes" and "For increasing the number of members of the governing board of ____ (insert name) School District from five to seven--No."

"For decreasing the number of members of the governing board of (insert name) School District from seven to five--Yes" and "For decreasing the number of members of the governing board of ____ (insert name) School District from seven to five--No."

"For the election of each member of the governing board of the (insert name) School District by the registered voters of the entire (insert name) School District--Yes" and "For the election of each member of the governing board of the (insert name) School District by the registered voters of the entire ____ (insert name) School District--No."

"For the election of one member of the governing board of the (insert name) School District residing in each trustee area elected by the registered voters in that trustee area--Yes" and "For the election of one member of the governing board of the (insert name) School District residing in each trustee area elected by the registered voters in that trustee area--No."

"For the election of one member, or more than one member for one or more trustee areas, of the

governing board of the(insert name) School District residing in each trustee area elected by
the registered voters of the entire (insert name) School District--Yes" and "For the election
of one member, or more than one member for one or more trustee areas, of the governing
board
of the(insert name) School District residing in each trustee area elected by the registered
voters of the entire ____ (insert name) School District--No."

"For the establishment (or abolition) of a common governing board in the (insert name)
School District and the _ (insert name) School District--Yes" and "For the establishment (or
abolition) of a common governing board in the _ (insert name) School District and the ____
(insert name) School District--No."

If more than one proposal appears on the ballot, all must carry in order for any to become
effective, except that a proposal to adopt one of the methods of election of board
members specified in Section 5030 which is approved by the voters shall become effective
unless a proposal which is inconsistent with that proposal has been approved by a greater
number of voters. An inconsistent proposal approved by a lesser number of voters than the
number which have approved a proposal to adopt one of the methods of election of board
members specified in Section 5030 shall not be effective.]

§ 5021. Incumbents to serve out terms despite approval of change

(a) If a proposal for the establishment of trustee areas formulated under Section[s] 5019
[and 5020] is approved [by a majority of the voters voting at the election], any affected
incumbent board member shall serve out his or her term of office and succeeding board
members shall be nominated and elected in accordance with Section 5030. In the event
two or more trustee areas are established [at such election] which are not represented in
the membership of the governing board of the school district, or community college district
the county committee shall determine by lot the trustee area from which the nomination
and election for the next vacancy on the governing board shall be made.

(b) If a proposal for rearrangement of boundaries is approved by [a majority of the voters
voting on the measure, or by] the county committee on school district organization
[when no election is required], and if the boundary changes affect the board
membership, any affected incumbent board member shall serve out his or her term of
office and succeeding board members shall be nominated and elected in accordance
with Section 5030.

(c) If a proposal for abolishing trustee areas is approved [by a majority of the voters voting
at the election], the incumbent board members shall serve out their terms of office and
succeeding board members shall be nominated and elected at large from the district.

§ 5030. Alternate method of election

Except as provided in Sections 5027 and 5028, in any school district or community college district having trustee areas, the county committee on school district organization and the registered voters of a district, pursuant to Section[s] 5019 *[and 5020, respectively]*, may at any time recommend one of the following alternate methods of electing governing board members:

- (a) That each member of the governing board be elected by the registered voters of the entire district.
- (b) That one or more members residing in each trustee area be elected by the registered voters of that particular trustee area.
- (c) That each governing board member be elected by the registered voters of the entire school district or community college district, but reside in the trustee area which he or she represents.

The recommendation shall provide that any affected incumbent member shall serve out his or her term of office and that succeeding board members shall be nominated and elected in accordance with the method recommended by the county committee.

Whenever trustee areas are established in a district, provision shall be made for one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members.

[In counties with a population of less than 25,000,] the county committee on school district organization or the county board of education, if it has succeeded to the duties of the county committee, may at any time, by resolution, with respect to trustee areas established for any school district, other than a community college district, amend the provision required by this section without additional approval by the electors, to require one of the alternate methods for electing board members to be utilized.
