STUDENTS

Immunizations

→ ~~Students will be permitted to register, but may not attend any school in the Modesto City Schools District unless a documented, up-to-date immunization record of required immunizations is submitted to the school by the parent, guardian, or person immunized.~~

→ ~~In accordance with Title 17, California Administrative Code, Section 6065B, and Health and Safety Code Sections 120335, 120370, written record shall be shown by the parent, guardian, or person immunized to the governing authority at the time of the pupil's first admission, when student enrolls at next grade span and at subsequent times to determine the pupil's immunization status. Next grade spans are identified as birth to preschool, transitional K or K through 6th grade, and 7th through 12th grade.~~

→ ~~A student may be exempted for medical reasons verified by a physician's written statement indicating the specific nature and probably duration of the medical condition.~~

→ ~~The principal is authorized and directed to exclude a non-immunized student from classroom activities when the County Health Officer proclaims an epidemic of a listed communicable disease. The exclusion shall last until the County Health Officer approves readmission.~~

→ ~~A student who is in the active process of immunization, known as conditionally admitted, (verification required) shall be enrolled but is subject to exclusion if remaining immunization timelines are not adhered to.~~

BP 5141.31 (a)

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To protect the health of all students and staff and to curtail the spread of infectious diseases, the Governing Board shall cooperate with state and local public health agencies to encourage and facilitate immunization of all district students against preventable diseases.

Each student enrolling for the first time in a district school, preschool, or child care and development program or enrolling in or advancing to grade 7 shall present an immunization record from any authorized private or public health care provider certifying that the student has received all required immunizations in accordance with law. Students shall be excluded from school or exempted from immunization requirements only as allowed by law.

→ The Superintendent or designee may arrange for an authorized health care provider to administer immunizations at school ~~to any student whose parent/guardian has consented in writing~~. At the beginning of the school year, parents/guardians shall be notified of their right to provide consent for the administration of an immunization to their child at school.
