# **Uniform Complaint Procedures**

The Governing Board recognizes that the District has the primary responsibility to ensure compliance with applicable state and federal laws and regulations governing educational programs.

The Board encourages the early, informal resolution of complaints whenever possible and appropriate. To resolve complaints which cannot be resolved through such informal process, the Board shall adopt a uniform system of complaint processes specified in 5 CCR 4600-4670 and the accompanying Administrative Regulation.

# **Complaints Subject to UCP**

Any complaint alleging District violation of applicable state or federal lawor regulations governing any program subject to the UCP which is offered by the District, including adult education programs; After School Education and Safety programs; agricultural career technical education; state career technical and technical training programs; federal career technical education; child care and development programs; compensatory education; the federal Every Student Succeeds Act; migrant education; Regional Occupational Centers and Programs; school safety plans; California State Preschool Programs and any other Districtimplemented state categorical program that is not funded through the localcontrol funding formula pursuant to Education Code 6400.

Any complaint alleging District noncompliance with the requirements of Education Code 51228.1 and 51228.2 that prohibits the assignment of a studentin grades 9–12 to a course without educational content for more than one week inany semester or to a course the student has previously satisfactorily completed, without meeting specific conditions. The Board recognizes that alternative dispute resolution (ADR) can, depending on the nature of the allegations, offer a process to reach a resolution to the complaint in a manner that is agreeable to all parties. An ADR process such as mediation may be offered to resolve complaints that involve more than one student and no adult. However, mediation shall not be offered or used to resolve any complaint involving sexual assault or where there is a reasonable risk that a party to the mediation would feel compelled to participate. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the use of ADR is consistent with state and federal laws and regulations.

The Board prohibits any form of retaliation against any complainant in the complaint process. Participation in the complaint process shall not in any way affect the status, grades, or work assignments of the complainant.

The Board encourages the early, informal resolution of complaints at the site level whenever possible.

In filing and investigating complaints, the confidentiality of the parties involved and the integrity of the process shall be protected as required by law. As appropriate for any complaint alleging retaliation or, unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory, harassment, intimidation, and/or bullying), the Superintendent or designee shall keep confidential the identity of the complainant and/or the subject of the complaint, if he/she is different from the complainant, when appropriate and as long as the integrity of the complaint process is maintained.

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When an allegation that is not subject to the UCP is included in a UCP complaint, the District shall refer the non-UCP allegation to the appropriate staff or agency and shall investigate and, if appropriate, resolve the UCP-related allegation(s) through the District's UCP.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide training to District staff to ensure awareness and knowledge of current law and requirements related to UCP, including the steps and timelines specified in this policy and the accompanying AdministrativeRegulation.

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain records of each complaint and **subsequent related actions, including steps taken during** the **investigation and all information required for compliance** investigations of those complaints. All such records shall be destroyed in accordance with 5 CCR 4631 and 4633 applicable state law and District policy.

#### **Non-UCP Complaints**

The following complaints shall not be subject to the District's UCP but shall be referred to the specified agency **or investigated and resolved through an alternative process**: (5 CCR 4611)

a. Any complaint alleging child abuse or neglect shall be referred to the County Department of Social Services, the County Protective Services-Division, and the appropriate law enforcement agency alleging health andsafety violations by a child development program shall, for licensed facilities, be referred to Department of Social Services and shall, for licensing exempt facilities, be referred to the appropriate Child Development regional administrator.

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1. Any complaint alleging child abuse or neglect shall be referred to the County Department of Social Services Protective Services Division or the appropriate law enforcement agency. (5 CCR 4611)

- 2. Any complaint alleging health and safety violations by a child development program shall, for licensed facilities, be referred to Department of Social Services. (5 CCR 4611)
- b. Any complaint alleging employment discrimination, harassment, intimidation or bullying shall be sent to the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing and the Compliance Officer shall notify the complainant by first class mail of the transfer.
- 3. Any complaint alleging employment discrimination or harassment shall be investigated and resolved by the District in accordance with the procedures specified in AR 4030 – Nondiscrimination in Employment, including the right to file the complaint with the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing.
- c. Any complaint alleging fraud shall be referred to the California Department of Education.
- 4. Any complaint alleging a violation of a state or federal law or regulation related to special education, a settlement agreement related to the provision of a free appropriate public education, or a due process hearing order shall be submitted to the California Department of Education (CDE) in accordance with AR 6159.1 – Procedural Safeguards and Complaints for Special Education. (5 CCR 3200-3205)

5. Any complaint alleging noncompliance of the District's food service program with laws regarding meal counting and claiming, reimbursable meals, eligibility of children or adults, or use of cafeteria funds and allowable expenses shall be filed with or referred to CDE in accordance with BP 3555 - Nutrition Program Compliance. 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- 6. Any allegation of discrimination based on race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability in the District's foodservice program shall be filed with or referred to the U.S. Department of Agriculture in accordance with BP 3555 Nutrition Program Compliance. (5 CCR 15582)

Any complaint related to sufficiency of textbooks or instructional materials, emergency or urgent facilities conditions that pose a threat to the health or safety of students or staff, or teacher vacancies and misassignments shall be investigated and resolved in accordance with AR 1312.4 – Williams Uniform Complaint Procedures. (Education Code 35186)
