



DISABILITY IMPACT REQUIRES SPECIALLY DESIGNED INSTRUCTION

The final prong of any eligibility for special education is a determination that the student requires specially designed instruction. If their impairment can be met with the provision of accommodations, general education services, and/or assistive technology to support their access and progress in general education with their peers, they are not eligible for an IEP.

Our program generally grows by 40-50 students per year.






