**District Follow-up Information for Request dated September 28, 2021  
on Recommendations presented in the  
Response to Grand Jury Report dated February 10, 2021**

R3. The structure for board meetings should be revamped to provide a more reasonable and focused agenda. Targeting the focus of each meeting would allow effective action and increased accountability by trustees.

- The Grand Jury requested a copy of the PRJUSD Board of Trustees Board Book.

**Follow-up: The [2021-22 Board of Trustees Handbook](#) has been distributed to all Board Members.**

R4. In order to maintain institutional history and knowledge, the district should develop a succession plan to ensure timely replacements for essential positions and time for appropriate training.

- The Grand Jury requested a copy of the Succession Plan that the PRJUSD Board of Trustees referenced in their response to the Grand Jury.

**Follow-up: The [Succession Plan for PRJUSD](#) covers an interim process and permanent process. The [SLOCOE Superintendent Search Options](#) outlines the steps that the Office of Education assists districts with when needing to fill the Superintendent position.**

R11. Trustees must establish and document standard minimum qualifications for a superintendent, which reflect the needs of the district including financial management.

- The Grand Jury requested a copy of Board Policy 2120, as referenced in the Board's response to the Grand Jury

**Follow-up: PRJUSD [Board Policy 2120](#) for Superintendent Recruitment and Selection was approved by the Board of Trustees on September 14, 2021.**

R13. Under the conditions that exist today, the district trustees and administration should determine if the aquatic complex is viable.

- The Grand Jury requested a detailed accounting of expected sources of funding for this proposed project along with all written project planning and funding documentation to include any existing or proposed agreements with Swim Paso and any other organization involved with the proposed project. The Measure M funds do not include



this in the latest updated presented to the Board in August. If there are agreements with Swim Paso or other entities, please provide.

**Follow-up: The District continues to explore options for construction of the aquatics complex. Recently, the district investigated a partnership with Swim Paso. The intent of this partnership was to create a donation agreement which would allow Swim Paso to apply for a Regional Park Program (RPP) grant funded by Proposition 68. Unfortunately, due to limitations within the grant, the district did not find the RPP grant to be a feasible option.**

**Staff has examined a wide range of ideas which include returning the pool to the vendor (which is not possible) to potentially selling the pools currently housed at the high school. Selling the pools does not align to the goal of constructing the project, poses an impact to the overall project budget and there is a limited market to sell the pool.**

**Staff is currently analyzing the option of building the project in multiple phases and with a scaled down version of the long-course pool. We are in early stages of this review and will present an option to the Board of Trustees in a presentation in January 2022.**

**The district wishes to continue a partnership with Swim Paso, however, fundraising efforts are hampered by the lack of a clearly defined project and uncertainty around the aquatic's complex future. If the Board of Trustees approves a revised project scope, we anticipate additional fundraising can be accomplished. At this time, there are no agreements with Swim Paso or any other entity regarding the aquatics complex.**
