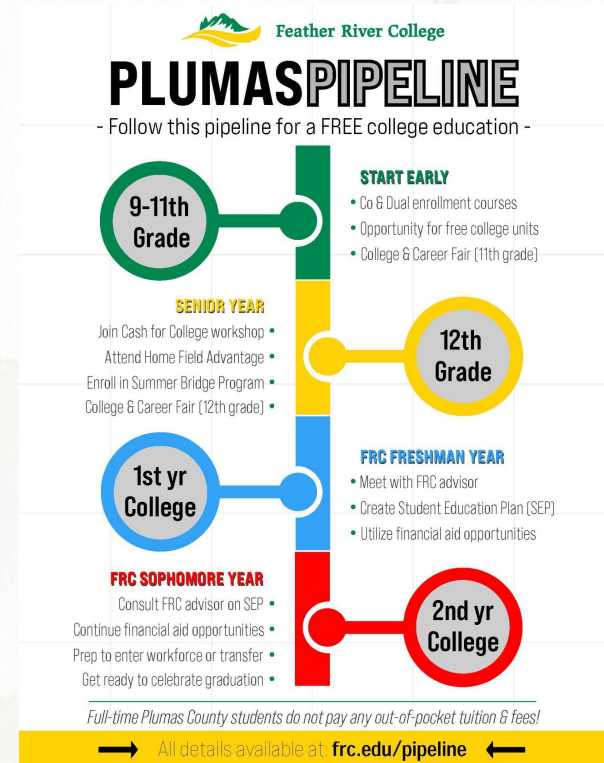

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Opportunities for Local Students

- Financial Resources Available
 - Plumas Pipeline - partnership with FRC Foundation - FREE for full-time students
 - Finish Line Scholarship - CCC Foundation - 11 Plumas Co. Recipients - \$22K
- Complete General Ed.
- Positive Experience
- Prepare to Transfer
 - ADT & TAG - CSU Breadth Certificate - Articulation - High Transfer Rate
- Student Success
 - 35-40 Plumas Students enroll at FRC right after high school
 - Co & Dual Enrollment
 - Success rates are consistently at or above other FRC students: e.g., English success 87%

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TRiO Programs

Upward Bound

Help **high school students** who are first-generation and low income complete secondary education, prepare and enroll in postsecondary education.



Education Talent Search

Enhance educational opportunities for students through 12th grade by providing academic, career and financial guidance while encouraging students to graduate from high school and continue their education at a school of their choice.



Student Support Services

Help **college students** who meet one or more qualifying factors: first-generation, low- income, and/or have a disability with a goal to graduate with an associate's degree and transfer to a 4-year college.



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Dual/Concurrent Enrollment

Dual enrollment:

- Students receive college and high school credit at the same time
- Taught by a PUSD teacher during the regularly scheduled school day
- PUSD teacher meets FRC teaching requirements (different for vocational and academic disciplines), teaches the course consistent with FRC's course requirements
 - Currently offering Success 101 (PUSD)/College 100 (FRC) through dual enrollment to PUSD high schools

Concurrent enrollment:

- PUSD students enroll in regularly scheduled FRC classes (in-person or online) independent from, but complimentary of, their high school curriculum
- Examples include evening classes, online classes, and Calculus I

Pathways = Seamless Transitions

Guided Pathways -

- FRC is working to improve the student experience by making the process of identifying an educational path/goal and embarking on that goal as seamless as possible
- Summits with local high schools focus on clarifying opportunities at FRC for local students and discussing positive and negative aspects of the transition
- Continued partnerships with staff and faculty at PUSD schools, follow-up meetings regarding student advising, curriculum alignment, dual enrollment, Research Symposium
- Transfer and career opportunities:
 - Transfer degrees to CSUs, transfer common to other public and private schools
 - CTE programs with strong employment outcomes
 - Bachelor's degree available at FRC in Agriculture
 - RN partnership with Butte College as extension of FRC's LVN program
