## 12. DISCUSSION ITEMS

### 12.1 Heard an update on Berkeley High School U9 Consent Education Curriculum and Coaching Boys Into Men (30 minutes)

BHS teacher Hasmig Minassian presented an overview on consent education in the Universal 9th grade classrooms.

Gabriel Lopez presented an overview of Berkeley Athletics Consent and Empowerment (BACE) and fka Coaching Boys into Men, a curriculum designed by features of our violence.

### 12.2 Update on BUSD Title IX Compliance (20 minutes)

Megan Farrell and Mary Keating provided an update on Title IX with an overview of formal complaints received, along with some training initiatives.

### 12.3 Update on the Development of TK-12 Ethnic Studies Program (20 minutes) Ethnic studies.

Coordinator of Professional Development Adelita Martinez provided an overview of Ethnic Studies curriculum. Adelita shared student video feedback on why Ethnic Studies matters to them.

BHS U9 Ethnic Studies and Social Living teachers Dana Moran and Hasmig Minassian provided a detailed Berkeley High School Ethnic Studies Timeline. Presented their analysis and gave an update on Ethnic Studies data from spring of 2021.

Ethnic Studies TSA Joemi Ito-Gates provided a 2021-2022 update on ethnic studies. Joemi has provided teaching guides to families and monthly newsletters with further resources.

## 13. ACTION ITEMS

### 13.1 Approval of Climate Literacy Resolution No 22-018

Director Babitt presented an overall update of the community support to pass the Approval of Climate Literacy Resolution. Director Babitt collected 75 signatures from several educators and staff members in support to pass the approval of Climate Literacy Resolution.

President Ty Alper, acknowledged the resolution was well done and thoughtful and that it should be pushed to the top of our priorities. However, has concerns in committing to funding outside the budget process. President Alper suggested not making budget allocations at this time.

Director Sinai, supports the resolution and thanked Director Babitt, Martha Kane and everyone advocating for the resolution. Director Sinai suggested funding through grant programs, Berkeley school fund and Berkeley High development group. Director Sinai believes in understanding the fiscal impact and strategizing on how to fund the resolution.

Director Vasudeo thanked Director Babbit and is in support of the resolution. Director Vasudeo suggested using a pre-existing curriculum and using it for implementing climate literacy.

Director Babbit gave a yearly overview of the resolution cost. Fundraising and grants are currently written out. The committee can have a projected cost by June 15, 2023 for implementation of the curriculum.

Dr. Stephens answered all of the Board members' questions and concerns.

The Board will commit to allocate 65K of the general fund to the curriculum working group with a 18 month timeline. The Board will expect the working group to provide a budget projection for implementing the Climate Literacy Resolution.
