BASIC FUNCTIONS:

Under the supervision of the Director of Curriculum and Instruction, this position serves as a curriculum resource and instructional coach for district teachers. Provides coaching, classroom observations, collaborative planning, and professional development for teachers in implementing Project Based Learning (PBL) through the integration of Common Core State Standards (CCSS), Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), Project Based Learning, and STEAM. Perform reasonable non-teaching duties as assigned. May plan and coordinate the work of aides, teacher assistants, and other paraprofessionals.

ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

Duties may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Provide coaching support to teachers implementing PBL. Coaching support will include demonstration lessons, co-planning and co-teaching, classroom visitations and professional development.
- 2. Support teachers to design and develop lesson plans and related instructional materials to differentiate instruction to address diverse student needs and interests.
- 3. Design/facilitate PBL professional development, sometimes after school
- 4. Support curriculum design developing standards-based Project Based Learning.
- 5. Attend monthly professional development on work-related responsibilities such as classroom coaching and observation, designing/delivering professional development, facilitating department and teacher meetings, supporting English Learners and Students with Special Needs, and adult learning theory
- 10. Collaborate with the STEAM TOSA for integration of PBL and STEAM.
- 11. Maintain professional competence through participation in in-service education activities provided by the district and/or self-selected professional growth activities.
- 12. Maintain harmonious relations with students, staff, parents, and the community.
- 13. Perform other related duties as assigned.
