AB 329 California Healthy Youth Act

- Effective January 1, 2016
- Renames the *California Comprehensive Sexual Health and HIV/AIDS Prevention Act*
- Requires Comprehensive Sexual Education and HIV prevention to students at least twice
- No changes to 5th grade Family Life

Purposes of the Bill

Provide students knowledge/skills for...

- ☐ Protecting their sexual and reproductive health
- ☐ Developing healthy attitudes
- ☐ Understanding of sexuality as a normal part of human development
- ☐ Ensuring information received is comprehensive, accurate, and unbiased
- ☐ Promoting healthy and positive attitudes, and safe behaviors

AB329 PROVIDES CLEARER GUIDANCE TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS BY:

- Updating statutory language to reflect today's understanding of HIV and AIDS
- Ensuring students receive comprehensive and accurate prevention information for
 - HIV and other sexually transmitted infections
 - unintended pregnancy
 - local health resources

AB329 PROVIDES CLEARER GUIDANCE TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS BY:

- Clarifying existing requirements that instruction and materials be appropriate for students of all sexual orientation and genders
- Clarifying the existing passive consent policy
- Including new language relating to adolescent abuse and sex trafficking
