Proposal

We propose that MUSD offer free math tutoring, run by high school student leaders, at least during summer; and encourage (not require) high school students to tutor K-12 students (whatever grades they prefer) for at least 1 hour in their entire four-year HS career, as part of the community service they would already complete for graduation.


Evidence


Survey: Would you support the high school *encouraging* high schoolers to tutor more?

Of those who responded to survey:



- About 15 states offer ~1 unit credit and/or recognition for community service
- No incentive first two years of MATHeasy, but hundreds of tutors and students and still had to turn away many
