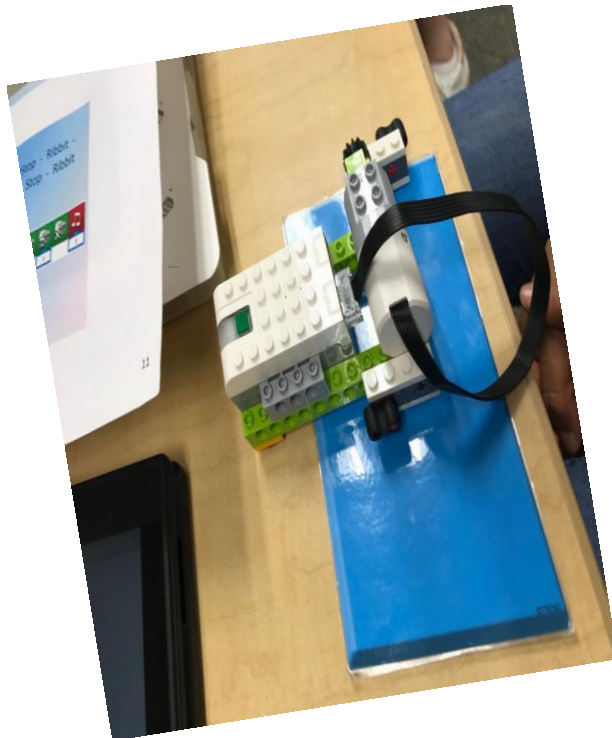
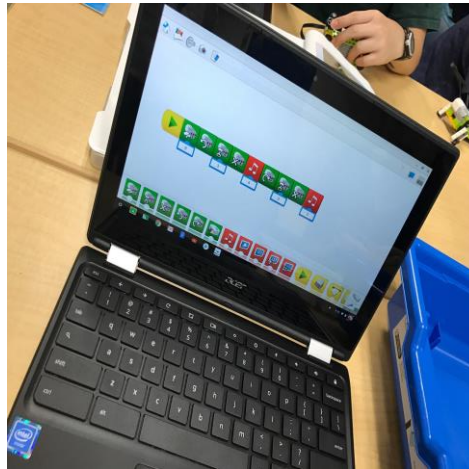
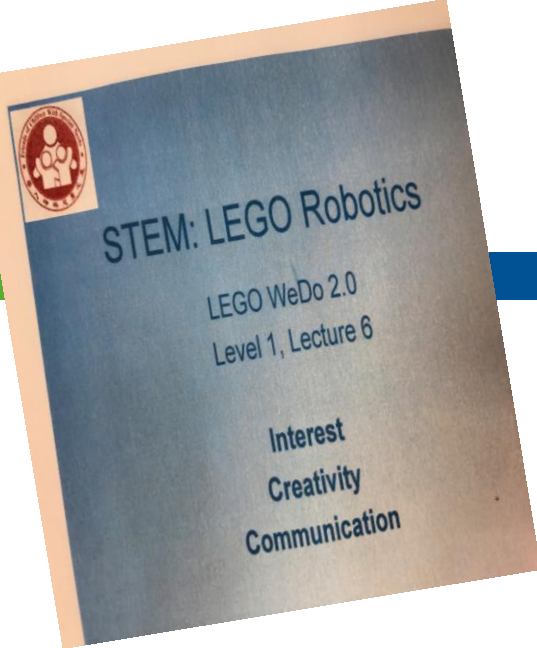
Extended School Year (ESY)

- Many students with IEPs attend traditional summer school, ESY is a unique service.
- The underlying purpose of ESY services is to maintain knowledge and skills until school starts again - prevent regression.
- ESY is not intended to enhance a student's education or add new knowledge or skills that were not obtained during the regular school year.
- The IEP team determines whether a student requires ESY based on student's goals, progress and history of regression
