Design Standards

The Superintendent or designee <u>mayshall</u> establish design standards for district and school web sites in order to maintain a consistent identity, professional appearance, and ease of use.

The district's design standards shall address the accessibility of district and school web sites to individuals with disabilities, including compatibility with commonly used assistive technologies.

Phone Telephone numbers, and home addresses, and email addresses of students <u>and/</u>or their parents/guardians shall not be published on a district or school web page<u>sites</u>.

Therefore, a student's photograph (s) of a student shall not be published, together with his/her name—or other personally identifiable information—, may be published on district or school web sites unless the student's parent/guardian has notified the district in writing to not release the student's photograph without the—prior written consent—of the student's parent/guardian. Photographs of, in accordance with BP/AR 5125.1 - Release of Directory Information.

<u>If students' names are not included, photographs of individual students or</u> groups of students, such as at a school event, may be published <u>provided that students' names are not includedon</u> school or district web sites.

Home Employees' home addresses—or, personal telephone numbers—of staff members, and personal email addresses shall not be posted on district or school web sites.

The home address or telephone number of any elected or appointed official including, but not limited to, a Board member or public safety official, shall not be posted on district or school web sites without the prior written permission of that individual. (Government Code 3307.5, 6254.21, 6254.24)—

No public safety official shall be required—as a condition of employment to consent to the posting on the Internet of his/her photograph or identity as a public safety officer for any purpose if that officer reasonably believes that the disclosure may result in a threat, harassment, intimidation, or harm to the officer or his/her family. (Government Code 3307.5)

District and school web sites shall not post the home address or telephone number of any elected or appointed official including, but not limited to, a Board member or public safety official, without the prior written permission of that individual. (Government Code 3307.5, 6254.21, 6254.24)
