Resolution No 16-030 Marking March 21st to April 23, 2016 as the Cesar E, Chavez and Dolores Huerta Commemorative Period in Berkeley Unified School District and the City of Berkeley

WHEREAS, in 1996, the City of Berkeley changed the name of Waterfront Park to César Chavez Park; and

WHEREAS, since 1998 and in 2000, the Berkeley School Board voted unanimously on a resolution to support the development of the Chavez Memorial Solar Calendar Project at Cesar Chavez Park; and

WHEREAS, since 1999, the Berkeley School Board passed a resolution supporting State Senator Richard Polanco's efforts to establish a Cesar Chavez state holiday; and

WHEREAS, since 2000, the State of California declared César Chavez' birthday an official state holiday for state workers (March 25); and

WHEREAS, the District and City now honor Martin Luther King, Malcolm X and International Women's Day as school holidays; and

WHEREAS, since 2002, the District's Resolution declared that César Chavez Day is not currently a District or City holiday in Berkeley; rather it is an experimental service learning alternative to a school and city holiday; and

WHEREAS, since 2002, the District Resolution included the intended commitment to follow an approved implementation plan that strongly prioritizes the following:

- Distribution of information on curricula and resources developed by the state for teachers,
- Encouraging teachers, through announcements and publications, to incorporate curricula and resources into their lesson plans around community service, climate change, social, environmental and food justice, and Latino Heritage,

- Encouraging each school to have school-wide activities on or around [March 31](#) to honor the legacy of Cesar Chavez and Dolores Huerta

WHEREAS, since 2003, the City along with the Cesar Chavez Commemoration Planning Committee began to celebrate a citywide commemorative period—beginning on the Spring Equinox, March 31, the beginning of the planting season in agriculture, continuing through Cesar Chavez’ birthday, [March 21st](#), and then on to [April 23rd](#), the anniversary of the labor leader & environmentalist’s death; and

WHEREAS, since 2009, the City Wide Chavez Commemoration Committee, which is made up of teams from the City, District, UCB and the Community, voted to rotate the leadership of the committee each year among the teams (District 2016, City 2017 and Community in 2018); and

WHEREAS, as a part of the above Resolutions, the District agreed to have one Board Director, the Public Information Officer, and the Supervisor of Family Engagement and Equity actively participate in the Chavez Commemoration Committee; and

WHEREAS, as part of the above Resolutions, the City agreed to have up to two Councilmembers or their aides and the Mayors Chief of Staff or Senior Aide actively participate in the Chavez Commemoration Committee; and

WHEREAS, in 2014, the Chavez Commemoration Committee voted to also honor Dolores Huerta for her vital partnership with Cesar Chavez, her dedicated commitment to farmworkers and the formation of the UFW, and now to her work with the Dolores Huerta Foundation—creating networks of healthy, organized communities pursuing social justice; and

WHEREAS, César Chavez and Dolores Huerta formed an amazing organizing team who believed that service to others was a calling, a mission and a way of life, not merely an occupation or an occasional act of charity. They both believed that people have an obligation to contribute to their communities and to help those in need, Both were and are committed to the idea that service not only strengthened a

community, but that service benefited those individuals who joined together to improve a community.

WHEREAS, in 2014 the Committee voted to incorporate Latino Heritage Month into its planning and coordination process, which will continue under a team supervised by BAHIA (Bay Area Hispanic Institute for Advancement), and to hold and publicize events during the period of Sept 15 to October 15 each year; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chavez Commemoration Committee will become the Chávez/Huerta Commemoration Committee, and the city-wide Chavez web pages hosted by the Ecology Center will become www.chavez/huerta.org, and [will develop](#) a logo and other graphic material to reflect that change; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that Latino Heritage Month will come under the umbrella of the Latino Heritage Month Team of the Chavez/Huerta Commemoration Committee and be held during the period of Sept 15 to October 15; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that the District and City) will make March 25th Cesar Estrada Chavez Day and make [April 8th](#) Dolores Huerta Day in the District and City) and put this on all official publications of the District and the City); and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that the District will redouble its commitment and strongly urge principals to (1) hold school based celebrations, (2) engage students in service to their community, as an alternative to a school holiday, during the commemorative period (March 8 to April 8), and (3) publicize widely what each school is doing to honor the legacies of César Chavez and Dolores Huerta;

AND FINALLY BE IT RESOLVED, that together the school board directors and city councilmembers are encouraged to participate in the Chavez/Huerta Commemorative Events at their respective “adoptive schools” and districts.
