

## Adults: Top Thoughts Overall

### *Q1: What are some important things you appreciate about our school district, and what can we focus on in order to improve?*

- ▶ Happy there is Art, Music, Recess 101, Garden, Library etc Having a well rounded education as a child is so important. (4.5)
  - ▶ Appreciate the emphasis on collaboration, technology education (e.g. hour of code) and reading (Think Tank!) (4.5)
  - ▶ I appreciate quality teachers. Every child learns differently. Teachers should have and use all tools/techniques at their disposal. (4.4)
  - ▶ Programs in Art, PE, Library, Enrichment Programs with funds raised by PTA So children can be exposed to a variety of learning and cultural experiences. (4.4)
  - ▶ Extra curricular and other opportunities that let students get in front of the entire school. E.g., Drama, speech, spelling bee. Helps children build confidence and self esteem, when they do this in a safe environment. (4.4)
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## Student Voice! Top Thoughts Overall

### Q1: *What do you enjoy most about learning at your school? (Overall)*

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- ▶ I like how supportive all the teachers are of you. They all want you to succeed and will help you until you do. School should be a fun and non criticized place where you can mess up and not feel bad about yourself and nobody would laugh at you. (4.5)
- ▶ I enjoy playworks because I get to do a lot of fun things. Playworks is important because it gives you a lot of exercise in a fun way. (4.5)
- ▶ I enjoy speaking 2 languages at my school. it is important because, it will help me later on in life. (4.4)
- ▶ I like engineering in S.T.E.A.M. lab. (4.4)
- ▶ Field trips we go to places where we normally would not go. (4.4)

# Initial Interpretations: Question 1

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## Adults Q1

- ▶ They like application and integration of content (math, science, etc.) and interdisciplinary opportunities in the school day.
- ▶ They like that students can take what they're learning and apply it (authentic practice).

## Students Q1

- ▶ They value opportunities for “hands-on” learning (authentic practice as with adults)
  - ▶ People -- positive relationships with adults are important for students' success.
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## Adults: Top Thoughts Overall

### *Q2: What are some things that would help you feel more connected to your child's learning at school?*

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- ▶ Being able to have resources, funding, and more support staff. With the ever increasing challenges of large class sizes and more behavior problems, we would meet the needs of more students with more support staff. (4.3)
  - ▶ Having more time to plan for teaching. I believe if we were given more time, like a teacher work day, it would reduce stress and benefit students too. (4.3)
  - ▶ Seesaw I would love to see Seesaw be a common practice, where my child is uploading the work he's been doing in class to his portfolio there. (4.3)
  - ▶ Being allowed release time to visit other classrooms and observe teaching strategies. (4.2)
  - ▶ Continue having teachers share photos. It's great! (4.2)
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## Student Voice! Top Thoughts Overall

### Q2: *What would improve your experience at school? (Overall)*

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- ▶ Hot Lunch. The food needs to be a lot better. (4.6)
  - ▶ I think we should get more recess and lunch time. I want more because kids need time to move around. (4.6)
  - ▶ More recess time so people get more exercise. (4.5)
  - ▶ Expand the locker rooms. It is really crowded in the locker rooms. Some of the girls spray perfume like its air mist. Because a lot of people are in there pushing INSECURITIES. (4.5)
  - ▶ Is new technology-- it is important so we can do new stuff and it is just fun to have new technology. (4.5)
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# Initial Interpretations: Question 2

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## Adults Q2

- ▶ Mix of staff and parents evident
- ▶ Staff wants support for developing their practice (time, resources, etc.)
- ▶ Parents value student-specific/classroom level communication. “What about My kid”

## Students Q2

- ▶ When kids say we want better food, or more recess, they may be saying “Social interactions/experiences are important to them.”
- ▶ Kids are in the moment. (Which class were they in when they participated?)




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# Example: Ability to Drill Down on Thoughts


GOAL #1: QUALITY INSTRUCTION



# Example: Student Stakeholder Themes


