Funding History

- ❖ Governor Brown signed Assembly Bill 1808 into law on June 27, 2018.
- ❖ \$300-Million for Low-Performing Students Block Grant (LPSBG)
- ❖ Intended to provide additional supports to students not otherwise identified for supplemental grant funding under LCFF or Special Education services
- ❖ Funds cannot serve English learners, Special Education, low socioeconomic status (SES) or students benefiting from Title I support

Funding Allocation and Requirements

- ❖ CUSD's funding allocation is \$460,412
- ❖ 233 students identified using 2016-2017 State's SBAC assessment data
- ❖ Students who scored a 1 on SBAC in English Language Arts and/or Math
- ❖ Funds must be expended or encumbered by the 2020-21 fiscal year
- ❖ Funds must support Local Control & Accountability Plan (LCAP) goals

CUSD Math Implementation Plan

Alignment to LCAP Goal 1 and 2: Provide high quality first instruction and close the achievement gap:

- Fund middle school Teacher on Special Assignment (TOSA) positions: Academic Coaches
- Provide 5 days of middle school math professional development and on-site coaching from a math consultant
- Purchase iReady math instructional licenses for all identified students
- Hire a part time elementary math coach
- Fund additional Professional Learning Community (PLC) collaboration time for teachers

CUSD Reading Implementation Plan

Alignment to LCAP Goal 1 and 2: Provide high quality first instruction and close the achievement gap.

Alignment to district's Every Child a Reader initiative:

- Provide reading intervention for identified elementary students
- Purchase iReady reading instructional licenses for all identified students
- Strategic placement of students with teachers trained in reading instruction

Additional Support for Students

- Investigating middle school extra period for identified students
- All identified elementary students will be invited to summer school
- All identified students will be invited to attend the after school program and the reading boot camp where applicable
- Cohorts of these students will be developed and data results shared with teachers
- Data will be monitored at the site and district level
- Identified students will be invited to after school tutoring groups with teachers from their school site

Progress Monitoring

Grant funding requires that student data be monitored to ensure the intervention is working.

Student Data:

- iReady reading and math benchmark data (proficiency and growth reports)
- SBAC data
- Student grades
- Common formative assessments
- Dibels reading data

Teacher Data:

- Pre/Post teacher survey (before and after professional development)
