Inquiry Cycle

›Instructional Leadership

Phase 4 Analyze Impact

Teachers and leaders analyze the results of the instructional inquiry and reflect on the process and new learning

Phase 3 Implement & Support

Teachers and leaders engage in study and learning and then take actions centered on an area of focus



Phase 1 Analyze Evidence

Gather and analyze evidence to identify student learning problems and problems of teaching or leading practice

Phase 2 Determine a Focus

Teachers and leaders analyze evidence to identify an instructional focus area

At Santa Rosa High School:

- ★ Data are used to help track progress and identify areas to target for intervention.
- ★ Consistent discipline referral processes & procedures are utilized
- ★ Introduction of explicit school-wide expectations to remind students about appropriate behavior.
- ★ Encourage appropriate behavior and consequences and supports to discourage inappropriate behavior.

- DA referrals = 30

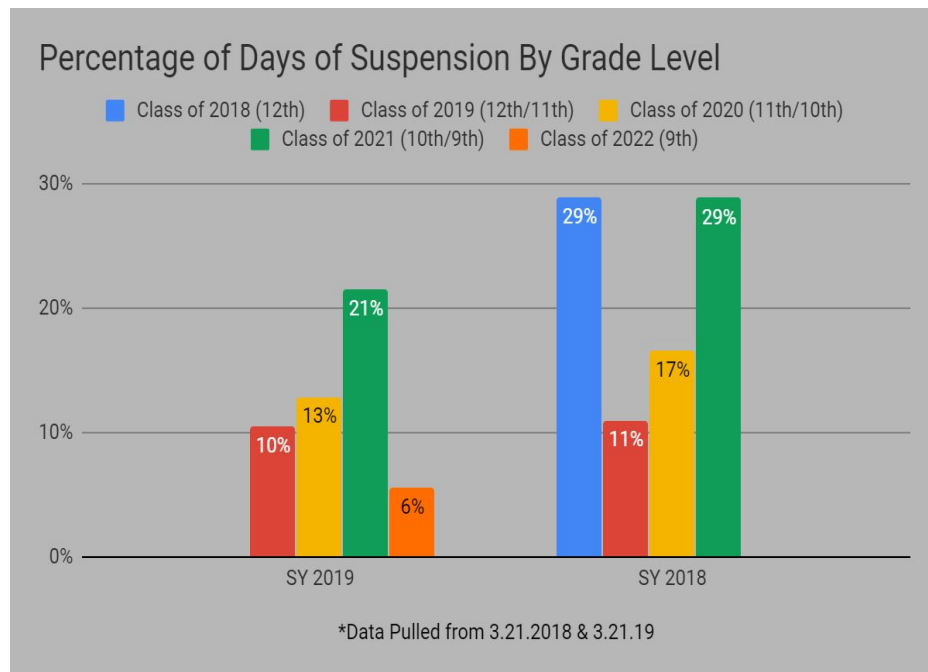


Student Intervention Data - Major Incidents

- Navigating previous, current, and future turnover in administration and staff in order increase continuity of instruction and support for all students.





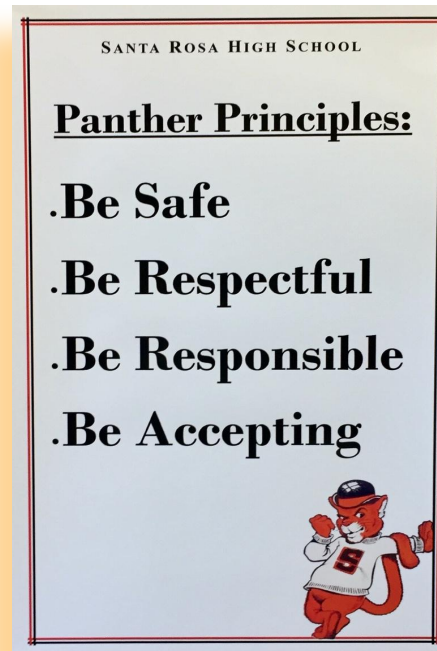

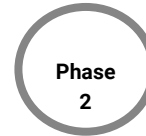
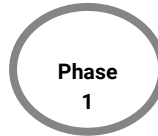
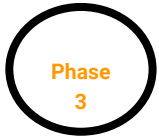


Santa Rosa High Indicators & Metrics for Growth
